**SUMMARY**—Creates the Nevada Youth Legislative Issues Forum.  
(BDR 34-52)

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AN ACT relating to education; creating the Nevada Youth Legislative Issues Forum; prescribing the membership, powers and duties of the Forum; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1       Sections 3-5 of this bill create the Nevada Youth Legislative Issues Forum,  
2 consisting of 21 members who are enrolled in grades 9-12 in public schools or  
3 otherwise eligible for enrollment in public schools but enrolled in a homeschool or  
4 private school. Each Senator appoints a member to the Forum. Sections 6-10 of this  
5 bill set forth the powers and duties of the Forum. The Forum must hold at least two  
6 public hearings each school year, review issues of importance to the youth in this  
7 State and submit an annual report of the activities of the Forum. In addition, the  
8 Forum may, within the limits of available money, hold meetings during a regular  
9 session of the Legislature to advise the Legislature on proposed legislation  
10 concerning the youth in this State. The Forum may also conduct seminars for the  
11 benefit of its members relating to leadership, government and the legislative  
12 process. Finally, the Forum may submit a request for the drafting of one legislative  
13 measure which relates to matters within the scope of the Forum.

1        WHEREAS, The United States is facing a population of youth  
2 that is disengaged and lacks the necessary knowledge, skills and  
3 dispositions to participate in and carry out civic duties; and

4        WHEREAS, In the 2004 presidential election, 53.1 percent of  
5 Nevadans over 25 years of age voted, compared with 38.4 percent  
6 among Nevadans 18 to 24 years of age; and

7        WHEREAS, The lack of voter turnout for citizens who are 18 to  
8 24 years of age is often attributed to cynicism toward the political  
9 process, disillusionment with politics, voter apathy and a lack of  
10 acknowledgment by the media and politicians of issues involving  
11 youth; and

12      WHEREAS, Most governmental services are designed with input  
13 and participation from the people being served; however, young  
14 people under the age of 18 are not allowed to vote and are often left  
15 out of the democratic process; and

16      WHEREAS, Several issues are important to the youth in the  
17 nation as well as the youth in this State, including, without  
18 limitation, education, employment opportunities, participation in  
19 state and local government, a safe environment, the prevention of  
20 substance abuse, emotional and physical well-being, foster care and  
21 access to state and local services; and

22      WHEREAS, Research shows that the programs designed for  
23 youth which are most effective at promoting positive outcomes are  
24 framed in terms of the constructive assets the programs seek to build  
25 rather than the negative behaviors the programs seek to avoid; and

26      WHEREAS, There is a growing need to reverse the trend of  
27 apathy by engaging our youth directly with policymakers in a  
28 manner that will provide genuine opportunities for our youth to  
29 acquire civic knowledge and develop the skills necessary to  
30 participate fully in a democratic society; and

31      WHEREAS, Within the past 5 years, Maine, New Mexico,  
32 Washington and New Hampshire have enacted bills that create a  
33 Youth Issues Forum, which institutionalizes the participation of  
34 youth in the policy-making process in those states; and

35      WHEREAS, The creation of a Youth Issues Forum offers  
36 policymakers an opportunity to learn from youth as well as provides  
37 a meaningful opportunity for youth to learn about the policy-making  
38 process; and

39      WHEREAS, By providing an avenue for participation, this State  
40 will provide our youth with an opportunity to understand the ideals  
41 of citizenship and to acquire the knowledge and skills necessary to  
42 participate in effective government and appreciate the value of  
43 American democracy; now, therefore,



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1       THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
2           SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:  
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4       **Section 1.** Chapter 385 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
5           thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this  
6           act.

7       **Sec. 2.** *As used in sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this act,  
8           “Forum” means the Nevada Youth Legislative Issues Forum  
9           created by section 3 of this act.*

10      **Sec. 3.** *1. The Nevada Youth Legislative Issues Forum is  
11           hereby created, consisting of 21 members.*

12      *2. Each member of the Senate shall appoint a person who  
13           submits an application and meets the qualifications for  
14           appointment set forth in section 4 of this act.*

15      *3. After the initial terms:*

16      *(a) Appointments to the Forum must be made by each member  
17           of the Senate before June 30 of each year.*

18      *(b) The term of each member of the Forum begins July 1 of  
19           the year of appointment.*

20      *4. Each member of the Forum serves a term of 1 year and  
21           may be reappointed if the member continues to meet the  
22           qualifications for appointment set forth in section 4 of this act.*

23      **Sec. 4.** *1. To be eligible for appointment to the Forum, a  
24           person must be a resident of the senatorial district of the Senator  
25           who appoints him and must be:*

26      *(a) Enrolled in a public school in this State in grade 9, 10, 11  
27           or 12 for the school year in which he serves; or*

28      *(b) Exempt from compulsory attendance pursuant to NRS  
29           392.070, but otherwise eligible to enroll in a public school in this  
30           State in grade 9, 10, 11 or 12 for the school year in which he  
31           serves.*

32      *2. A person who is eligible for appointment to the Forum may  
33           submit an application on the form prescribed pursuant to  
34           subsection 3 to the Senator of the senatorial district in which the  
35           person resides for appointment or reappointment to the Forum.*

36      *3. The Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau shall  
37           prescribe a form for applications submitted pursuant to this  
38           section, which must require the signature of the principal of the  
39           school in which the applicant is enrolled or, if the applicant is  
40           exempt from compulsory attendance pursuant to NRS 392.070, the  
41           signature of a member of the community in which the applicant  
42           resides other than a relative of the applicant.*

43      **Sec. 5.** *1. A position on the Forum becomes vacant upon:*

44      *(a) The death or resignation of a member.*



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1       (b) The absence of a member for any reason from two  
2 consecutive meetings of the Forum, unless excused by the  
3 Chairman of the Forum.

4       (c) A change of residency of a member which renders that  
5 member ineligible under his original appointment.

6       2. A vacancy on the Forum must be filled for the remainder  
7 of the unexpired term in the same manner as the original  
8 appointment.

9       Sec. 6. 1. The Forum shall elect from among its members,  
10 to serve a term of 1 year beginning on July 1 of each year:

11       (a) A Chairman, who shall conduct the meetings and oversee  
12 the formation of committees as necessary to accomplish the  
13 business of the Forum. The Chairman must be:

14       (1) Enrolled in a public school in this State in grade 9, 10  
15 or 11 for the school year in which he serves; or

16       (2) Exempt from compulsory attendance pursuant to NRS  
17 392.070, but otherwise eligible to enroll in a public school in this  
18 State in grade 9, 10 or 11 for the school year in which he serves.

19       (b) A Vice Chairman, who shall assist the Chairman and  
20 conduct the meetings of the Forum if the Chairman is absent or  
21 otherwise unable to perform his duties.

22       2. The Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau:

23       (a) Shall provide administrative support to the Forum.

24       (b) Shall, in the event of a vacancy on the Forum, notify the  
25 appropriate appointing authority of such vacancy.

26       (c) May accept gifts, grants and donations from any source for  
27 the support of the Forum in carrying out the provisions of sections  
28 2 to 9, inclusive, of this act.

29       Sec. 7. 1. The Forum shall:

30       (a) Hold at least two public hearings in this State each school  
31 year.

32       (b) Simultaneously teleconference or videoconference each  
33 public hearing to three or more prominent locations throughout  
34 this State.

35       (c) Evaluate, review and comment upon issues of importance  
36 to the youth in this State, including, without limitation:

37           (1) Education;

38           (2) Employment opportunities;

39           (3) Participation of youth in state and local government;

40           (4) A safe learning environment;

41           (5) The prevention of substance abuse;

42           (6) Emotional and physical well-being;

43           (7) Foster care; and

44           (8) Access to state and local services.



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1       (d) Conduct a public awareness campaign to raise awareness  
2 about the Forum and to enhance outreach to the youth in this  
3 State.

4       2. The Forum may, within the limits of available money:

5           (a) During the period in which the Legislature is in a regular  
6 session, meet as often as necessary to conduct the business of the  
7 Forum and to advise the Legislature on proposed legislation  
8 relating to the youth in this State.

9           (b) Form committees, which may meet as often as necessary to  
10 assist with the business of the Forum.

11           (c) Conduct periodic seminars for its members regarding  
12 leadership, government and the legislative process.

13       3. The Forum and its committees shall comply with the  
14 provisions of chapter 241 of NRS.

15       4. On or before June 30 of each year, the Forum shall submit  
16 a written report to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau  
17 and to the Governor describing the activities of the Forum during  
18 the immediately preceding school year and any recommendations  
19 for legislation. The Director shall transmit the written report to the  
20 Legislative Committee on Education and to the next regular  
21 session of the Legislature.

22       Sec. 8. The Forum may:

23           1. Request the drafting of not more than one legislative  
24 measure which relates to matters within the scope of the Forum. A  
25 request must be submitted to the Legislative Counsel on or before  
26 July 1 preceding the commencement of a regular session of the  
27 Legislature unless the Legislative Commission authorizes  
28 submitting a request after that date.

29           2. Adopt procedures to conduct meetings of the Forum and  
30 any committees thereof. Those procedures may be changed upon  
31 approval of a majority vote of all members of the Forum who are  
32 present and voting.

33           3. Advise the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau  
34 regarding the administration of any appropriations, gifts, grants  
35 or donations received for the support of the Forum.

36       Sec. 9. The members of the Forum serve without  
37 compensation. To the extent that money is available, including,  
38 without limitation, money from gifts, grants and donations, the  
39 members of the Forum may receive the per diem allowance and  
40 travel expenses provided for state officers and employees generally  
41 for attending a meeting of the Forum or a seminar conducted by  
42 the Forum.

43       Sec. 10. 1. Each Senator shall appoint a member to the  
44 Nevada Youth Legislative Issues Forum created by section 3 of this  
45 act to an initial term commencing on August 1, 2007, and expiring



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1 on June 30, 2008. For the purpose of making an appointment to an  
2 initial term pursuant to this subsection, a Senator may appoint a  
3 person who did not submit an application pursuant to section 4 of  
4 this act.

5       2. The Forum shall hold its first meeting not later than  
6 October 1, 2007. At the first meeting of the Forum, the members of  
7 the Forum shall elect a Chairman and a Vice Chairman who hold  
8 those positions until June 30, 2008.

9       3. After the initial terms of office, sections 3 and 6 of this act  
10 govern the terms of office of the members of the Forum.

11     **Sec. 11.** 1. This section and section 10 of this act become  
12 effective upon passage and approval.

13     2. Sections 3 and 4 of this act become effective upon passage  
14 and approval for the purpose of appointing members to the Nevada  
15 Youth Legislative Issues Forum and on July 1, 2007, for all other  
16 purposes.

17     3. Sections 1, 2 and 5 to 9, inclusive, of this act become  
18 effective on July 1, 2007.
