

SENATE BILL NO. 287—SENATOR MATHEWS (BY REQUEST)

MARCH 15, 2007

Referred to Committee on Finance

SUMMARY—Revises the requirements concerning eligibility to participate in the Public Employees' Retirement System as a police officer under certain early retirement provisions. (BDR 23-976)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact.
Effect on the State: Contains Appropriation not included in Executive Budget.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to public employees' retirement; revising the requirements concerning eligibility to participate in the Public Employees' Retirement System as a police officer under certain early retirement provisions; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Under existing law, certain members of the Public Employees' Retirement System are eligible to retire earlier than other members of the System if they hold a full-time position with a public employer that participates in the System, the principal duties of which require emotional stability and physical capacity in protecting the public and, as applicable, enforcing state and local laws or controlling and extinguishing fires, or they were promoted or transferred from such a position by the same or a different public employer to a position related to those same principal duties. (NRS 286.042, 286.061, 286.510) Using these criteria, the Public Employees' Retirement Board, which is the governing authority of the System, is required, with the advice of the Interim Retirement and Benefits Committee of the Legislature, to determine which positions are eligible under the early retirement provisions for police officers and firefighters. (NRS 286.211)

Section 1 of this bill revises the definition of "police officer" for purposes of the early retirement provisions as, with certain exceptions, any member of the System in a full-time position with a public employer pursuant to which the person has some or all of the powers of a peace officer. Because persons who have the powers of peace officers are prescribed by or pursuant to state law, section 1 effectively removes the authority of the Public Employees' Retirement Board to determine which law enforcement positions are eligible under the early retirement



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20 provisions. **Section 1** does not affect this authority of the Board with respect to
21 firefighters.

22 **Section 5** of this bill makes an appropriation to the Police and Firefighters'
23 Retirement Fund for the additional costs associated with enrolling previously
24 ineligible rangers of the Division of State Parks of the State Department of
25 Conservation and Natural Resources in that Fund for the next biennium.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 286.061 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 286.061 "Police officer" means a member who is ~~is~~:

27 **Sec. 2.** NRS 286.211 is hereby amended to read as follows:

28 286.211 1. The Board shall, with the advice of the Interim
29 Retirement and Benefits Committee of the Legislature created
30 pursuant to NRS 218.5373:

31 ~~(a) Adopt regulations for the evaluation of requests from~~
32 ~~firefighters for enrollment under the Police and Firefighters'~~
33 ~~Retirement Fund; and~~



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1 (b) Determine those positions eligible under the early retirement
2 provisions for ~~police officers and~~ firefighters.

3 2. Service in any position which has not been determined by
4 the Board to be eligible does not entitle a member to early
5 retirement as a firefighter. ~~for police officer.]~~

6 **Sec. 3.** NRS 286.410 is hereby amended to read as follows:

7 286.410 1. The employee contribution rate must be:

8 (a) The matching contribution rate for employees and employers
9 that is actuarially determined for police officers and firefighters and
10 for regular members, depending upon the retirement fund in which
11 the member is participating.

12 (b) Adjusted on the first monthly retirement reporting period
13 commencing on or after July 1 of each odd-numbered year based on
14 the actuarially determined contribution rate indicated in the biennial
15 actuarial valuation and report of the immediately preceding year.
16 The adjusted rate must be rounded to the nearest one-quarter of 1
17 percent.

18 2. The employee's portion of the matching contribution rate for
19 employees and employers must not be adjusted in accordance with
20 the provisions of paragraph (b) of subsection 1 if the existing rate is
21 within one-quarter of 1 percent of the actuarially determined rate.

22 3. From each payroll during the period of his membership, the
23 employer shall deduct the amount of the member's contributions
24 and transmit the deduction to the Board at intervals designated and
25 upon forms prescribed by the Board. The contributions must be paid
26 on compensation earned by a member from his first day of service.

27 4. Any employee whose position ~~is determined~~ after July 1,
28 1971, ~~to be~~ becomes eligible under the early retirement provisions
29 for police officers and firefighters shall contribute the additional
30 contributions required of police officers and firefighters from July 1,
31 1971, to the date of his enrollment under the Police and Firefighters'
32 Retirement Fund, if employment in this position occurred before
33 July 1, 1971, or from date of employment in this position to the date
34 of his enrollment under the Police and Firefighters' Retirement
35 Fund, if employment occurs later.

36 5. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 286.430, the System
37 shall guarantee to each member the return of at least the total
38 employee contributions which the member has made and which
39 were credited to his individual account. These contributions may be
40 returned to the member, his estate or beneficiary or a combination
41 thereof in monthly benefits, a lump-sum refund or both.

42 6. Disabled members who are injured on the job and receive
43 industrial insurance benefits for temporary total disability remain
44 contributing members of the System for the duration of the benefits
45 if and while the public employer continues to pay the difference



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1 between these benefits and his regular compensation. The public
2 employer shall pay the employer contributions on these benefits.

3 **Sec. 4.** The Public Employees' Retirement Board shall allow
4 any person who is serving in a position for which he is enrolled
5 under the Police and Firefighters' Retirement Fund on June 30,
6 2007, but whose position becomes ineligible for enrollment in the
7 Fund on July 1, 2007, under the definition of "police officer" in
8 NRS 286.061, as amended by section 1 of this act, to continue to be
9 eligible under the early retirement provisions for police officers as
10 long as the person remains in that position.

11 **Sec. 5.** There is hereby appropriated from the State General
12 Fund to the Police and Firefighters' Retirement Fund established by
13 NRS 286.225 the sum of \$92,000 for the additional costs associated
14 with the enrollment of rangers of the Division of State Parks of the
15 State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources in that
16 Retirement Fund for the 2007-2009 biennium.

17 **Sec. 6.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.

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
