

SENATE BILL NO. 287—SENATOR MATHEWS (BY REQUEST)

MARCH 15, 2007

Referred to Committee on Finance

SUMMARY—Makes an appropriation to the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to enroll rangers in the Police and Firefighters' Retirement Fund. (BDR S-976)

AN ACT making an appropriation to the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources for enrollment of rangers in the Police and Firefighters' Retirement Fund; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources for the additional costs associated with the enrollment of rangers of the Division in the Police and Firefighters' Retirement Fund established by NRS 286.225:

For Fiscal Year 2007-2008.....\$103,000

For Fiscal Year 2008-2009.....\$108,000

2. Any balance of the sums appropriated by subsection 1 remaining at the end of the respective fiscal years must not be committed for expenditure after June 30 of the respective fiscal years by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after



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- 1 September 19, 2008, and September 18, 2009, respectively, by
- 2 either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity
- 3 to which the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and
- 4 must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before
- 5 September 19, 2008, and September 18, 2009, respectively.
- 6 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
