
SENATE BILL NO. 315—COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION
AND HOMELAND SECURITY

(ON BEHALF OF THE COMMISSION ON SPECIAL LICENSE PLATES)

MARCH 19, 2007

Referred to Committee on Transportation and Homeland Security

SUMMARY—Imposes certain conditions before a special license plate may be designed, prepared and issued. (BDR 43-859)

AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; imposing certain conditions on certain organizations before a special license plate may be designed, prepared and issued; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law authorizes a person to request the Department of Motor Vehicles
2 to design, prepare and issue a special license plate by submitting an application to
3 the Department. (NRS 482.367002) This bill provides that a person may only
4 submit an application for a special license plate that is intended to generate support
5 for a nonprofit charitable organization or a governmental entity if the organization
6 or entity only uses the financial support generated by the special license plate for
7 charitable purposes relating to public health, education or general welfare and
8 certain criteria are met.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 482.367002 is hereby amended to read as
2 follows:

3 482.367002 1. A person may request that the Department
4 design, prepare and issue a special license plate by submitting an
5 application to the Department. **A person may submit an application**



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1 *for a special license plate that is intended to generate financial*
2 *support for an organization only if:*

3 *(a) For an organization which is not a governmental entity,*
4 *the organization is established as a nonprofit charitable*
5 *organization which provides services to the community relating to*
6 *public health, education or general welfare;*

7 *(b) For an organization which is a governmental entity, the*
8 *organization only uses the financial support generated by the*
9 *special license plate for charitable purposes relating to public*
10 *health, education or general welfare;*

11 *(c) The organization is registered with the Secretary of State, if*
12 *registration is required by law, and has filed any documents*
13 *required to remain registered with the Secretary of State;*

14 *(d) The name and purpose of the organization do not promote,*
15 *advertise or endorse any specific product, brand name or service*
16 *that is offered for profit;*

17 *(e) The organization is nondiscriminatory; and*

18 *(f) The license plate will not promote a specific religion, faith*
19 *or antireligious belief.*

20 2. An application submitted to the Department pursuant to
21 subsection 1:

22 (a) Must be on a form prescribed and furnished by the
23 Department;

24 (b) Must be accompanied by a petition containing the signatures
25 of at least 1,000 persons who wish to obtain the special license
26 plate;

27 (c) Must specify whether the special license plate being
28 requested is intended to generate financial support for a particular
29 cause or charitable organization and, if so, the name of the cause or
30 charitable organization; **[and]**

31 (d) **Must include proof that the organization satisfies the**
32 **requirements set forth in subsection 1; and**

33 (e) May be accompanied by suggestions for the design of and
34 colors to be used in the special license plate.

35 3. The Department may design and prepare a special license
36 plate requested pursuant to subsection 1 if:

37 (a) The Department determines that the application for that plate
38 complies with subsection 2; and

39 (b) The Commission on Special License Plates approves the
40 application for that plate pursuant to subsection 5 of
41 NRS 482.367004.

42 4. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 482.367008, the
43 Department may issue a special license plate that:

44 (a) The Department has designed and prepared pursuant to this
45 section;



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1 (b) The Commission on Special License Plates has approved for
2 issuance pursuant to subsection 5 of NRS 482.367004; and

3 (c) Complies with the requirements of subsection 8 of
4 NRS 482.270,

5 → for any passenger car or light commercial vehicle upon
6 application by a person who is entitled to license plates pursuant to
7 NRS 482.265 and who otherwise complies with the requirements for
8 registration and licensing pursuant to this chapter. A person may
9 request that personalized prestige license plates issued pursuant to
10 NRS 482.3667 be combined with a special license plate issued
11 pursuant to this section if that person pays the fees for personalized
12 prestige license plates in addition to the fees for the special license
13 plate.

14 5. If, during a registration year, the holder of license plates
15 issued pursuant to the provisions of this section disposes of the
16 vehicle to which the plates are affixed, the holder shall:

17 (a) Retain the plates and affix them to another vehicle that meets
18 the requirements of this section if the holder pays the fee for the
19 transfer of the registration and any registration fee or governmental
20 services tax due pursuant to NRS 482.399; or

21 (b) Within 30 days after removing the plates from the vehicle,
22 return them to the Department.

23 **Sec. 2.** The provisions of this act do not apply to any special
24 license plate which was approved by the Commission on Special
25 License Plates or authorized by the Legislature before the effective
26 date of this act.

27 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.

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
