AN ACT relating to health; requiring the Director of the Department of Health and Human Services to publish on an Internet website operated or administered by or on behalf of the Department a list of the prices and rates negotiated by the Department for goods and services it purchases from or for which it provides reimbursement to providers who participate in the State Plan for Medicaid; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 422 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

1. The Director shall publish on an Internet website that is operated or administered by or on behalf of the Department a list of the prices and rates negotiated by the Department for goods and services that the Department purchases from or for which the Department provides reimbursement to providers. The list must be revised annually.

2. As used in this section, "provider" means a person who participates in the State Plan for Medicaid as a provider of goods or services.

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
