

**SENATE BILL NO. 417—SENATOR LEE**

**MARCH 19, 2007**

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Referred to Committee on Transportation and Homeland Security

**SUMMARY**—Enacts provisions to facilitate the construction and maintenance of benches, shelters and transit stops for passengers of public mass transportation in certain counties. (BDR 32-955)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

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**AN ACT** relating to public mass transportation; enacting provisions to facilitate the construction and maintenance of benches, shelters and transit stops for passengers of public mass transportation in certain counties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Under existing law, the regional transportation commission in a county whose population is 400,000 or more (currently Clark County) has the authority to provide for the construction and maintenance of benches and shelters for passengers of public mass transportation. (NRS 373.1183) This bill authorizes such a regional transportation commission to provide for the construction and maintenance of transit stops in addition to benches and shelters. This bill also authorizes the regional transportation commission to locate such benches, shelters and transit stops within any public easement or right-of-way, including a public easement or right-of-way dedicated or restricted for use by any utility, if: (1) the public easement or right-of-way is adjacent or appurtenant to or within a reasonable proximity of any public highway; and (2) the benches, shelters and transit stops may be located safely within the public easement or right-of-way without damaging the facilities of other persons who are authorized to place their facilities within the public easement or right-of-way.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 373.1183 is hereby amended to read as  
2 follows:

3       373.1183 In a county whose population is 400,000 or more:

4       1. The commission shall provide for the construction and  
5 maintenance of benches , ~~and~~ shelters **and transit stops** for  
6 passengers of public mass transportation.

7       2. In carrying out its duties pursuant to subsection 1, the  
8 commission may displace or limit competition in the construction  
9 and maintenance of such benches ~~and shelters.]~~ , **shelters and**  
10 **transit stops.** The commission may:

11      (a) Provide those services on an exclusive basis or adopt a  
12 regulatory scheme for controlling the provision of those services; or

13      (b) Grant an exclusive franchise to any person to provide those  
14 services.

15      3. **The commission or any person who is authorized by the**  
16 **commission to provide for the construction and maintenance of**  
17 **benches, shelters and transit stops for passengers of public mass**  
18 **transportation may locate such benches, shelters and transit stops**  
19 **within any public easement or right-of-way, including, without**  
20 **limitation, a public easement or right-of-way dedicated or**  
21 **restricted for use by any utility, if:**

22      (a) **The public easement or right-of-way is adjacent or**  
23 **appurtenant to or within a reasonable proximity of any public**  
24 **highway; and**

25      (b) **The benches, shelters and transit stops may be located**  
26 **safely within the public easement or right-of-way without**  
27 **damaging the facilities of other persons who are authorized to**  
28 **place their facilities within the public easement or right-of-way.**

29      **As used in this subsection, "public highway" means any street,**  
30 **road, alley, thoroughfare, way or place of any kind used by the**  
31 **public or open to the use of the public as a matter of right for the**  
32 **purpose of vehicular traffic.**

33      4. The commission shall post on each bench, ~~and~~ within each  
34 shelter ~~] and near each transit stop~~ a notice that provides a  
35 telephone number that a person may use to report damage to the  
36 bench ~~for shelter~~.

38      5. No board of county commissioners, governing body of an  
39 incorporated city or town board may ~~[provide]~~:

40      (a) **Provide** for the construction or maintenance of benches ,

3 (b) Adopt any ordinance, regulation or plan, enter into or  
4 approve any franchise, contract or agreement or take any other

7 shelters and transit stops for passengers of public mass  
8 transportation.

9 Sec. 2. NRS 373.1185 is hereby amended to read as follows:

10 373.1185 1. In a county whose population is 400,000 or  
11 more, the commission shall establish an advisory committee to  
12 provide information and advice to the commission concerning the  
13 construction and maintenance of benches, ~~and~~ shelters **and transit**  
14 **stops** for passengers of public mass transportation in the county. The  
15 membership of the advisory committee must consist of:

16 (a) Two members of the general public from each city within the  
17 county who are appointed by the governing body of that city; and

18 (b) Six members of the general public appointed by the  
19 commission.

20 2. Each member of the advisory committee serves a term of 1  
21 year. A member may be reappointed for additional terms of 1 year  
22 in the same manner as the original appointment.

23 3. A vacancy occurring in the membership of the advisory  
24 committee must be filled in the same manner as the original  
25 appointment.

26 4. The advisory committee shall meet at least six times  
27 annually.

28 5. At its first meeting and annually thereafter, the advisory  
29 committee shall elect a chairman and vice chairman from among its  
30 members.

31 6. Each member of the advisory committee serves without  
32 compensation and is not entitled to receive a per diem allowance or  
33 travel expenses.

34 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.

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
