

## SENATE BILL NO. 458—COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

(ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION)

**SUMMARY**—Makes appropriations to the Department of Health and Human Services for computer replacement.  
(BDR S-1216)

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AN ACT making appropriations to the Department of Health and Human Services for replacement computers; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State  
2 General Fund to the Health Division of the Department of Health  
3 and Human Services for the Office of Health Administration the  
4 sum of \$83,777 for the replacement of desktop computers, software,  
5 printers, servers, switches and firewalls.

6       2. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to  
7 the Health Division of the Department of Health and Human  
8 Services for Early Intervention Services the sum of \$280,028 for the  
9 replacement of desktop computers, software, printers, servers,  
10 switches, firewalls and tablet computers.

11      **Sec. 2.** Any remaining balance of the appropriations made by  
12 section 1 of this act must not be committed for expenditure after  
13 June 30, 2009, by the entity to which the appropriations are made or  
14 any entity to which money from the appropriations is granted or  
15 otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the  
16 appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose

1 after September 18, 2009, by either the entity to which the money  
2 was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently  
3 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General  
4 Fund on or before September 18, 2009.

5     **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
