

SENATE BILL NO. 480—COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION  
AND HOMELAND SECURITY

(ON BEHALF OF THE COMMISSION OF SPECIAL LICENSE PLATES)

MARCH 26, 2007

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Referred to Committee on Transportation and Homeland Security

**SUMMARY**—Requires the Legislative Auditor to conduct an audit with respect to special license plates. (BDR S-862)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to motor vehicles; requiring the Legislative Auditor to conduct an audit to determine whether the money that is received from the additional fees that are charged for the issuance and renewal of special license plates is being used for the specific purposes intended by law; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Under existing law, “special license plates” are certain license plates having a design which differs from the design of standard-issue license plates. In the State of Nevada, special license plates have been created in two different ways. In the past, special license plates were authorized only by direct legislative enactment. More recently, special license plates have been authorized through a process of application and petition involving the Department of Motor Vehicles and the Commission on Special License Plates. Many of the special license plates authorized under both of these methods provide for the imposition of additional fees (typically \$25 upon the issuance of the plates and \$20 annually at the time of renewal) to benefit a particular cause or charitable organization. (NRS 482.367002-482.367008, 482.3747, 482.37903-482.37945)

This bill requires the Legislative Auditor to conduct an audit to examine the methods and procedures used by organizations and governmental entities to ensure that any money those organizations and entities receive from the imposition of additional fees in connection with the issuance and renewal of special license plates is used for the benefit of the intended recipient or recipients.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** 1. The Legislative Auditor shall conduct an audit  
2 of organizations and governmental entities that receive money from  
3 additional fees. The audit:

4           (a) Must include, without limitation, an examination of the  
5 methods and procedures used to ensure that all money received in  
6 the form of additional fees is expended solely for the benefit of the  
7 intended recipient.

8           (b) May include, without limitation:

9              (1) An analysis of the revenue generated by the issuance and  
10 renewal of each special license plate; and

11              (2) An analysis of the distribution of that revenue by each  
12 applicable organization or governmental entity.

13       2. The Legislative Auditor shall prepare a final written report  
14 of the audit and present the report to the Audit Subcommittee of the  
15 Legislative Commission not later than February 2, 2009.

16       3. To the extent that the provisions of NRS 218.737 to  
17 218.893, inclusive, are consistent with the requirements of this  
18 section, those provisions apply to the audit conducted pursuant to  
19 this section. For the purposes of this subsection, organizations and  
20 governmental entities that receive money from additional fees shall  
21 be deemed to be agencies of the State.

22       4. The organizations and governmental entities audited  
23 pursuant to this section shall, upon the request of the Legislative  
24 Auditor and within 6 months after the period for the submission of  
25 plans pursuant to paragraph (c) of subsection 1 of NRS 218.8235,  
26 submit to the Legislative Auditor a report specifying:

27           (a) The extent to which the recommendations of the Legislative  
28 Auditor have been carried out;

29           (b) The extent to which the recommendations of the Legislative  
30 Auditor have not been carried out; and

31           (c) The reasons for any failure to carry out the recommendations  
32 of the Legislative Auditor.

33       5. Upon the request of the Legislative Auditor or his authorized  
34 representative, the officers and employees of each organization and  
35 governmental entity that receives money from additional fees shall  
36 make available any of their books, accounts, claims, reports,  
37 vouchers or other forms of information, confidential or otherwise  
38 and irrespective of their form or location, which the Legislative  
39 Auditor deems necessary to conduct the audit described in this  
40 section.

41       6. As used in this section:

1       (a) "Additional fees" means the fees that are charged in  
2 connection with the issuance or renewal of a special license plate for  
3 the benefit of a particular cause or charitable organization. The term  
4 does not include registration and license fees or governmental  
5 services taxes.

6       (b) "Intended recipient" means the particular cause, fund or  
7 charitable organization for the benefit of which additional fees are  
8 imposed. In the case of special license plates:

9              (1) Authorized by enactment of the Legislature, the term  
10 means the particular cause, fund or charitable organization identified  
11 in statute as the required recipient of additional fees.

12              (2) Authorized pursuant to the system of application and  
13 petition described in NRS 482.367002, the term means the  
14 particular cause, fund or charitable organization identified as the  
15 intended recipient of additional fees, as described in the application  
16 that was submitted for those special license plates pursuant to  
17 paragraph (c) of subsection 2 of that section.

18       (c) "Special license plate" has the meaning ascribed to it in  
19 NRS 482.367008.

20       **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
