

SENATE BILL NO. 487—COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES

(ON BEHALF OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION’S SUBCOMMITTEE TO STUDY THE FEASIBILITY AND ADVISABILITY OF CONSOLIDATING WATER-RELATED SERVICES IN WASHOE COUNTY)

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to water resources in certain counties. (BDR S-183)

AN ACT relating to water; creating an Advisory Subcommittee of the Washoe County Regional Water Planning Commission; requiring the Commission, in conjunction with the Subcommittee, to assess and examine certain matters pertaining to the availability and responsible use of water within Washoe County and to submit a report to the Legislature in connection therewith; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 Existing general law provides for regional planning and management of water
2 by a water planning commission in counties whose population is 100,000 or more
3 but less than 400,000 (currently Washoe County). Under that general law, a board
4 of county commissioners is required to adopt a comprehensive plan for the supply
5 of municipal and industrial water, quality of water, sanitary sewerage, treatment of
6 sewage, drainage of storm water and control of floods and is required to take action
7 by a two-thirds majority. This general law also provides for a water planning
8 commission, which reports to and advises the board of county commissioners
9 concerning issues relating to water resources. (NRS 540A.010-540A.310)

10 **Section 2** of this bill creates an Advisory Subcommittee of the Washoe County
11 Regional Water Planning Commission. The Subcommittee consists of six members,
12 including two Legislators appointed, respectively, by the Majority Leader of the
13 Senate and the Speaker of the Assembly and four members of the general public
14 who are appointed by the four purveyors of water in Washoe County: (1) the South
15 Truckee Meadows General Improvement District; (2) the Sun Valley General

16 Improvement District; (3) the Truckee Meadows Water Authority; and (4) Washoe
17 County.

18 **Section 3** of this bill requires the Commission, in conjunction with the
19 Subcommittee, to make assessments, determinations and recommendations
20 regarding several issues pertaining to the availability and responsible use of water
21 within Washoe County.

22 **Section 4** of this bill requires the Commission, in conjunction with the
23 Subcommittee, to report on the activities carried out pursuant to **section 3** and
24 submit that report, accompanied by any recommendations for legislation, to the
25 75th Session of the Nevada Legislature.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** As used in sections 1 to 4, inclusive, of this act,
2 unless the context otherwise requires:

3 1. "Commission" means the Washoe County Regional Water
4 Planning Commission.

5 2. "Purveyor of water" means:

6 (a) The South Truckee Meadows General Improvement District;

7 (b) The Sun Valley General Improvement District;

8 (c) The Truckee Meadows Water Authority; and

9 (d) Washoe County.

10 3. "Subcommittee" means the Advisory Subcommittee created
11 pursuant to section 2 of this act.

12 **Sec. 2.** 1. There is hereby created an Advisory
13 Subcommittee of the Washoe County Regional Water Planning
14 Commission.

15 2. The Subcommittee consists of six members as follows:

16 (a) One member of the Senate, appointed by the Majority Leader
17 of the Senate;

18 (b) One member of the Assembly, appointed by the Speaker of
19 the Assembly; and

20 (c) Four members of the general public who are consumers of
21 water services, one appointed by each of the four purveyors of
22 water.

23 3. The Commission shall provide the Subcommittee with any
24 necessary staff and administrative support.

25 **Sec. 3.** The Commission, in conjunction with the
26 Subcommittee, shall:

27 1. Assess conjunctive use by the purveyors of water to
28 determine if those purveyors are maximizing conjunctive use and, if
29 not, recommend ways in which maximized conjunctive use may be
30 achieved. As used in this subsection, "conjunctive use" means the
31 combined use of surface water and groundwater systems to optimize
32 resource use.



1 2. Determine the amount of water required to accommodate the
2 substantial completion of development of land as anticipated in the
3 Truckee Meadows Regional Plan, and assess how much of that
4 required amount of water is available within Washoe County.

5 3. If the amount of water required to accommodate the
6 substantial completion of development of land as anticipated in the
7 Truckee Meadows Regional Plan, as determined pursuant to
8 subsection 2, is not available within Washoe County:

9 (a) Examine other potential locations from which additional
10 water may be obtained; and

11 (b) Prepare a reasonably detailed estimate of the cost of
12 obtaining that additional water from other locations.

13 4. Determine the extent to which there is a duplication of water
14 facilities and recommend a course of action to eliminate or
15 minimize such duplication.

16 5. Identify sources of funding to pay for the water required to
17 accommodate the substantial completion of development of land as
18 anticipated in the Truckee Meadows Regional Plan, including,
19 without limitation, sources of funding to pay for:

20 (a) Water that is available within Washoe County; and

21 (b) Water that will need to be obtained from other locations.

22 6. Assess the adequacy of any water conservation plans
23 developed or adopted by the purveyors of water and, if it is
24 determined that those plans are inadequate, make recommendations
25 as to the specific manner in which those plans may be improved.

26 **Sec. 4.** On or before July 1, 2008, the Commission, in
27 conjunction with the Subcommittee, shall prepare a written report of
28 the matters considered and the actions taken pursuant to section 3 of
29 this act and shall submit the report, accompanied by any
30 recommendations for legislation, to the Director of the Legislative
31 Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the 75th Session of the Nevada
32 Legislature.

33 **Sec. 5.** As soon as practicable after the effective date of this
34 act, the Majority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the Assembly
35 and the purveyors of water, as defined in section 1 of this act, shall
36 appoint to the Advisory Subcommittee of the Washoe County
37 Regional Water Planning Commission the members described in
38 section 2 of this act.

39 **Sec. 6.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval
40 and expires by limitation on June 30, 2009.
