

SENATE BILL NO. 5—SENATOR CEGAUSKE

PREFILED DECEMBER 11, 2006

Referred to Committee on Human Resources and Education

SUMMARY—Requires the establishment of the Cancer Drug Donation Program. (BDR 40-19)

AN ACT relating to cancer; requiring the Health Division of the Department of Health and Human Services to establish the Cancer Drug Donation Program; requiring the Health Division to adopt regulations to carry out the Program; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

- 1 Existing law establishes a system for the reporting and analyzing of information
- 2 relating to cancer and establishes task forces on prostate cancer and cervical cancer.
- 3 (Chapter 457 of NRS)
- 4 **Section 6** of this bill requires the Health Division of the Department of Health
- 5 and Human Services to establish the Cancer Drug Donation Program. The Program
- 6 will distribute and dispense cancer drugs donated to the Program to cancer patients.
- 7 **Section 6** also authorizes persons to donate cancer drugs at any pharmacy, hospital
- 8 or health clinic that participates in the Program. The donated drugs must be in the
- 9 original, unopened and sealed packages and must not be adulterated or misbranded.
- 10 **Section 9** of this bill requires the Health Division to adopt regulations to carry out
- 11 the Program. **Section 10** of this bill provides immunity from civil liability for
- 12 damages caused by any act or omission of a person who donates a cancer drug to
- 13 the Program, or who accepts, distributes or dispenses a cancer drug donated to the
- 14 Program.



THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 457 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 10, inclusive, of this
3 act.

4 **Sec. 2.** *As used in sections 2 to 10, inclusive, of this act,*
5 *unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined*
6 *in sections 3, 4 and 5 of this act have the meanings ascribed to*
7 *them in those sections.*

8 **Sec. 3.** *“Cancer drug” means a prescription drug that is used*
9 *to treat:*

10 1. *Cancer or its side effects; or*

11 2. *The side effects of a prescription drug that is used to treat*
12 *cancer or its side effects.*

13 ↳ *The term includes medical supplies used in the administration*
14 *of a cancer drug.*

15 **Sec. 4.** *“Hospital” has the meaning ascribed to it in*
16 *NRS 449.012.*

17 **Sec. 5.** *“Program” means the Cancer Drug Donation*
18 *Program established pursuant to section 6 of this act.*

19 **Sec. 6.** 1. *The Health Division shall establish and maintain*
20 *the Cancer Drug Donation Program to accept, distribute and*
21 *dispense cancer drugs donated to the Program.*

22 2. *Any person may donate a cancer drug to the Program. A*
23 *cancer drug may be donated at a pharmacy, hospital or health*
24 *clinic that participates in the Program.*

25 3. *A pharmacy, hospital or health clinic that participates in*
26 *the Program may charge a patient who receives a cancer drug a*
27 *handling fee in accordance with the regulations adopted by the*
28 *Health Division pursuant to section 9 of this act.*

29 4. *A cancer drug may be accepted, distributed or dispensed*
30 *pursuant to the Program only if the cancer drug:*

31 (a) *Is in its original, unopened, sealed and tamper-evident unit*
32 *dose packaging or, if packaged in single-unit doses, the single-unit*
33 *dose packaging is unopened;*

34 (b) *Is not adulterated or misbranded; and*

35 (c) *Bears an expiration date that is later than 30 days after the*
36 *drug is donated.*

37 5. *A cancer drug donated to the Program may not be:*

38 (a) *Resold; or*

39 (b) *Designated by the donor for a specific person.*

40 6. *The provisions of this section do not require a pharmacy,*
41 *hospital or health clinic to participate in the Program.*



1 **Sec. 7.** *A cancer drug donated for use in the Program may*
2 *only be dispensed:*

3 1. *By a pharmacist who is registered pursuant to chapter 639*
4 *of NRS; and*

5 2. *Pursuant to a prescription written by a person who is*
6 *authorized to write prescriptions.*

7 **Sec. 8.** *A pharmacy, hospital or health clinic that participates*
8 *in the Program:*

9 1. *Shall comply with all applicable state and federal laws*
10 *concerning the storage, distribution and dispensing of the cancer*
11 *drugs; and*

12 2. *May distribute a cancer drug donated to the Program to*
13 *another pharmacy, hospital or health clinic for use in the*
14 *Program.*

15 **Sec. 9.** *The Health Division shall adopt regulations to carry*
16 *out the provisions of sections 2 to 10, inclusive, of this act. The*
17 *regulations must prescribe, without limitation:*

18 1. *The requirements for the participation of pharmacies,*
19 *hospitals and health clinics in the Program;*

20 2. *The criteria for determining the eligibility of persons to*
21 *receive cancer drugs dispensed pursuant to the Program;*

22 3. *The categories of cancer drugs that may be accepted for*
23 *distribution or dispensing pursuant to the Program; and*

24 4. *The maximum fee that a pharmacy, hospital or health*
25 *clinic may charge to distribute or dispense cancer drugs pursuant*
26 *to the Program.*

27 **Sec. 10.** *Any person who donates, accepts, distributes or*
28 *dispenses a cancer drug in accordance with the provisions of*
29 *sections 2 to 10, inclusive, of this act, and the regulations adopted*
30 *pursuant to section 9 of this act, is not liable for any civil damages*
31 *as a result of any act or omission, not amounting to gross*
32 *negligence, by him in donating, accepting, distributing or*
33 *dispensing the cancer drug.*

34 **Sec. 11.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
