AN ACT relating to public schools; authorizing the superintendent of schools of a school district to extend the jurisdiction of school police officers for the purpose of issuing citations for traffic violations; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

- 1 Existing law extends the jurisdiction of school police officers to all school
2 property, buildings and facilities for the purpose of protecting personnel, pupils and
3 property. (NRS 391.275) This bill authorizes the superintendent of schools of a
4 school district to extend the jurisdiction to streets adjacent to school property,
5 buildings and facilities for the purpose of issuing traffic citations during the times
6 that school is in session or school-related activities are in progress.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** NRS 391.275 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 391.275 **1.** The jurisdiction of each school police officer of a
3 school district extends to all school property, buildings and facilities
4 within the school district ~~H~~ for the purpose of:
5 ~~H~~ **(a)** Protecting school district personnel, pupils ~~H~~ or real or
6 personal property; or



~~12-1~~ (b) Cooperating with local law enforcement agencies in matters relating to personnel, pupils or real or personal property of the school district.

2. In addition to the jurisdiction set forth in subsection 1, the superintendent of schools of a school district may extend the jurisdiction of each school police officer of the school district to the streets that are adjacent to school property, buildings and facilities within the school district:

(a) For the purpose of issuing traffic citations for violations of traffic laws and ordinances; and

(b) During the times that school is in session or school-related activities are in progress.

Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
