SUMMARY—Expands the use of certain allocations made from the
Fund for a Healthy Nevada. (BDR 40-240)

AN ACT relating to public health; expanding the use of certain
allocations made from the Fund for a Healthy Nevada;
and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

1 Under existing law, the Task Force for the Fund for a Healthy Nevada is
2 required to allocate, by contract or grant, for expenditure a certain amount of
3 money in the Fund for a Healthy Nevada for programs relating to the use of
4 tobacco, programs that improve health services for children and programs that
5 improve the health and well-being of persons with disabilities. (NRS 439.630) This
6 bill expands the use of these allocations to include the development of data, the
7 assessment of needs, evaluations and other technical assistance relating to such
8 programs.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 439.630 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 439.630 1. The Task Force for the Fund for a Healthy
3 Nevada shall:



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1 (a) Conduct public hearings to accept public testimony from a
2 wide variety of sources and perspectives regarding existing or
3 proposed programs that:

- 4 (1) Promote public health;
5 (2) Improve health services for children, senior citizens and
6 persons with disabilities;
7 (3) Reduce or prevent the use of tobacco;
8 (4) Reduce or prevent the abuse of and addiction to alcohol
9 and drugs; and
10 (5) Offer other general or specific information on health care
11 in this State.

12 (b) Establish a process to evaluate the health and health needs of
13 the residents of this State and a system to rank the health problems
14 of the residents of this State, including, without limitation, the
15 specific health problems that are endemic to urban and rural
16 communities.

17 (c) Reserve not more than 30 percent of all revenues deposited
18 in the Fund for a Healthy Nevada each year for direct expenditure
19 by the Department to pay for prescription drugs, pharmaceutical
20 services and, to the extent money is available, other benefits,
21 including, without limitation, dental and vision benefits for senior
22 citizens pursuant to NRS 439.635 to 439.690, inclusive. From the
23 money reserved to the Department pursuant to this paragraph, the
24 Department may subsidize any portion of the cost of providing
25 prescription drugs, pharmaceutical services and, to the extent money
26 is available, other benefits, including, without limitation, dental and
27 vision benefits to senior citizens pursuant to NRS 439.635 to
28 439.690, inclusive. The Department shall consider recommendations
29 from the Task Force for the Fund for a Healthy Nevada in carrying
30 out the provisions of NRS 439.635 to 439.690, inclusive. The
31 Department shall submit a quarterly report to the Governor, the Task
32 Force for the Fund for a Healthy Nevada and the Interim Finance
33 Committee regarding the general manner in which expenditures
34 have been made pursuant to this paragraph and the status of the
35 program.

36 (d) Reserve not more than 30 percent minus \$350,000 of all
37 revenues deposited in the Fund for a Healthy Nevada each year for
38 allocation by the Aging Services Division of the Department in the
39 form of grants for existing or new programs that assist senior
40 citizens with independent living, including, without limitation,
41 programs that provide:

- 42 (1) Respite care or relief of family caretakers;
43 (2) Transportation to new or existing services to assist senior
44 citizens in living independently; and



1 (3) Care in the home which allows senior citizens to remain
2 at home instead of in institutional care.

3 ➔ The Aging Services Division of the Department shall consider
4 recommendations from the Task Force for the Fund for a Healthy
5 Nevada concerning the independent living needs of senior citizens.

6 (e) Reserve not more than \$200,000 of all revenues deposited in
7 the Fund for a Healthy Nevada each year for allocation by the
8 Director to:

9 (1) Provide guaranteed funding to finance assisted living
10 facilities that satisfy the criteria for certification set forth in NRS
11 319.147; and

12 (2) Fund assisted living facilities that satisfy the criteria for
13 certification set forth in NRS 319.147 and assisted living supportive
14 services that are provided pursuant to the provisions of the home
15 and community-based services waiver which are amended pursuant
16 to NRS 422.2708.

17 ➔ The Director shall develop policies and procedures for allocating
18 money which is reserved pursuant to this paragraph.

19 (f) Reserve \$150,000 of all revenues deposited in the Fund for a
20 Healthy Nevada each year, if available, for allocation by the Aging
21 Services Division of the Department in the form of contracts or
22 grants for existing or new programs that provide dental benefits to
23 persons who are domiciled in this State and are 62 years of age or
24 older:

25 (1) Who satisfy the residency requirement set forth in
26 subsection 2 of NRS 439.665; and

27 (2) Whose incomes are not over the amounts set forth in
28 subsection 2 of NRS 439.665, as adjusted pursuant to the provisions
29 of that section.

30 (g) Allocate, by contract or grant, for expenditure not more than
31 20 percent of all revenues deposited in the Fund for a Healthy
32 Nevada each year for **[programs]** :

33 *(1) Programs* that prevent, reduce or treat the use of tobacco
34 and the consequences of the use of tobacco **[]**; *and*

35 *(2) The development of data, the assessment of needs,*
36 *evaluations and other technical assistance related to such*
37 *programs.*

38 (h) Allocate, by contract or grant, for expenditure not more than
39 10 percent of all revenues deposited in the Fund for a Healthy
40 Nevada each year for **[programs]** :

41 *(1) Programs* that improve health services for children **[]** ;
42 *and*

43 *(2) The development of data, the assessment of needs,*
44 *evaluations and other technical assistance related to such*
45 *programs.*



1 (i) Allocate, by contract or grant, for expenditure not more than
2 7.5 percent of all revenues deposited in the Fund for a Healthy
3 Nevada each year for programs that improve the health and well-
4 being of persons with disabilities ~~§~~, *and for the development of*
5 *data, the assessment of needs, evaluations and other technical*
6 *assistance related to such programs.* In making allocations
7 pursuant to this paragraph, the Task Force shall, to the extent
8 practicable, allocate the money evenly among the following three
9 types of programs:

10 (1) Programs that provide respite for persons caring for
11 persons with disabilities;

12 (2) Programs that provide positive behavioral supports to
13 persons with disabilities; and

14 (3) Programs that assist persons with disabilities to live
15 safely and independently in their communities outside of an
16 institutional setting.

17 (j) Reserve not more than 2.5 percent of all revenues deposited
18 in the Fund for a Healthy Nevada each year for direct expenditure
19 by the Department to subsidize any portion of the cost of providing
20 prescription drugs and pharmaceutical services to persons with
21 disabilities pursuant to NRS 439.705 to 439.795, inclusive. The
22 Department shall consider recommendations from the Task Force
23 for the Fund for a Healthy Nevada in carrying out the provisions of
24 NRS 439.705 to 439.795, inclusive.

25 (k) Maximize expenditures through local, federal and private
26 matching contributions.

27 (l) Ensure that any money expended from the Fund for a
28 Healthy Nevada will not be used to supplant existing methods of
29 funding that are available to public agencies.

30 (m) Develop policies and procedures for the administration and
31 distribution of contracts, grants and other expenditures to state
32 agencies, political subdivisions of this State, nonprofit
33 organizations, universities, state colleges and community colleges.
34 A condition of any such contract or grant must be that not more than
35 8 percent of the contract or grant may be used for administrative
36 expenses or other indirect costs. The procedures must require at
37 least one competitive round of requests for proposals per biennium.

38 (n) To make the allocations required by paragraphs (g), (h)
39 and (i):

40 (1) Prioritize and quantify the needs for these programs;

41 (2) Develop, solicit and accept applications for allocations;

42 (3) Conduct annual evaluations of programs to which
43 allocations have been awarded; and

44 (4) Submit annual reports concerning the programs to the
45 Governor and the Interim Finance Committee.



1 (o) Transmit a report of all findings, recommendations and
2 expenditures to the Governor and each regular session of the
3 Legislature.

4 2. The Task Force may take such other actions as are necessary
5 to carry out its duties.

6 3. The Department shall take all actions necessary to ensure
7 that all allocations for expenditures made by the Task Force are
8 carried out as directed by the Task Force.

9 4. To make the allocations required by paragraphs (d) and (f)
10 of subsection 1, the Aging Services Division of the Department
11 shall:

12 (a) Prioritize and quantify the needs of senior citizens for these
13 programs;

14 (b) Develop, solicit and accept grant applications for allocations;

15 (c) As appropriate, expand or augment existing state programs
16 for senior citizens upon approval of the Interim Finance Committee;

17 (d) Award grants, contracts or other allocations;

18 (e) Conduct annual evaluations of programs to which grants or
19 other allocations have been awarded; and

20 (f) Submit annual reports concerning the allocations made by
21 the Aging Services Division pursuant to paragraphs (d) and (f) of
22 subsection 1 to the Governor and the Interim Finance Committee.

23 5. The Aging Services Division of the Department shall submit
24 each proposed grant or contract which would be used to expand or
25 augment an existing state program to the Interim Finance
26 Committee for approval before the grant or contract is awarded. The
27 request for approval must include a description of the proposed use
28 of the money and the person or entity that would be authorized to
29 expend the money. The Aging Services Division of the Department
30 shall not expend or transfer any money allocated to the Aging
31 Services Division pursuant to this section to subsidize any portion of
32 the cost of providing prescription drugs and pharmaceutical services
33 to senior citizens pursuant to NRS 439.635 to 439.690, inclusive, or
34 to subsidize any portion of the cost of providing prescription drugs
35 and pharmaceutical services to persons with disabilities pursuant to
36 NRS 439.705 to 439.795, inclusive.

37 6. The Department, on behalf of the Task Force, shall submit
38 each allocation proposed pursuant to paragraph (g), (h) or (i) of
39 subsection 1 which would be used to expand or augment an existing
40 state program to the Interim Finance Committee for approval before
41 the contract or grant is awarded. The request for approval must
42 include a description of the proposed use of the money and the
43 person or entity that would be authorized to expend the money.
