

## SENATE BILL NO. 90—SENATOR NOLAN

FEBRUARY 14, 2007

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Referred to Committee on Transportation and Homeland Security

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions relating to the Nevada Commission on Homeland Security. (BDR 19-299)

**FISCAL NOTE:** Effect on Local Government: No.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to homeland security; revising the composition of voting members of the Nevada Commission on Homeland Security; authorizing the Chairman of the Commission to appoint nonmembers to certain committees; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1       **Section 1** of this bill adds an employee of the largest incorporated city in each  
2 county whose population is 400,000 or more to the list of voting members who  
3 must be appointed by the Governor to the Nevada Commission on Homeland  
4 Security. **Section 1** also changes the status of the officer designated by the United  
5 States Department of Homeland Security and the agent in charge of the office of  
6 the Federal Bureau of Investigation in this State to serve on the Nevada  
7 Commission on Homeland Security from voting members to nonvoting members.  
8 (NRS 239C.120)

9       **Section 2** of this bill clarifies that the Chairman of the Nevada Commission on  
10 Homeland Security is authorized to appoint any person he deems appropriate to  
11 serve on a committee to assist the Commission so long as one member of the  
12 Commission is appointed to the committee. In addition, **section 2** provides that a  
13 member of such a committee who is not a member of the Commission is not  
14 entitled to compensation, but may receive a per diem allowance and travel  
15 expenses. If the member is a public employee, he must also be given leave with pay  
16 without reducing any of his accrued leave. (NRS 239C.170)

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 239C.120 is hereby amended to read as  
2 follows:

3       239C.120 1. The Nevada Commission on Homeland Security  
4 is hereby created.

5       2. The Governor shall appoint to the Commission 14 voting  
6 members that he determines to be appropriate and who serve at his  
7 pleasure, which must include at least:

8       (a) The sheriff of each county whose population is 100,000 or  
9 more;

10     (b) The chief of the county fire department in each county  
11 whose population is 100,000 or more;

12     (c) ~~The agent in charge of the office of the Federal Bureau of  
13 Investigation in this State; and~~

14     ~~(d) An officer of the United States Department of Homeland  
15 Security whom the Department of Homeland Security has  
16 designated for this State; and~~

17     ~~(e)~~ A member of the medical community in a county whose  
18 population is 400,000 or more ; and

19     (d) *An employee of the largest incorporated city in each county  
20 whose population is 400,000 or more.*

21     3. *The Governor shall appoint:*

22     (a) *An officer of the United States Department of Homeland  
23 Security whom the Department of Homeland Security has  
24 designated for this State; and*

25     (b) *The agent in charge of the office of the Federal Bureau of  
26 Investigation in this State,*

27     *as nonvoting members of the Commission.*

28     4. The Senate Majority Leader shall appoint one member of the  
29 Senate as a nonvoting member of the Commission.

30     ~~4.~~ 5. The Speaker of the Assembly shall appoint one member  
31 of the Assembly as a nonvoting member of the Commission.

32     ~~5.~~ 6. Except for the initial members, the term of office of each  
33 member of the Commission who is a Legislator is 2 years and  
34 commences on July 1 of the year of appointment.

35     ~~6.~~ 7. The Governor or his designee shall:

36     (a) Serve as Chairman of the Commission; and

37     (b) Appoint a member of the Commission to serve as Vice  
38 Chairman of the Commission.

39     **Sec. 2.** NRS 239C.170 is hereby amended to read as follows:

40     239C.170 1. The Chairman of the Commission shall, with the  
41 approval of the Commission, appoint a Committee on Finance and  
42 any other committees deemed necessary by the Chairman to assist in

1 carrying out the duties of the Commission. The Chairman of the  
2 Commission shall appoint to a committee the number of voting  
3 members or nonvoting members, or both, that he determines to be  
4 appropriate . ~~I,~~ *The Chairman may appoint any person he deems  
5 appropriate to serve on a committee*, except that a committee must  
6 include at least one member of the Commission. At its first meeting  
7 and annually thereafter, a committee shall select a chairman and a  
8 vice chairman from the members of the committee.

9     *2. A member of a committee formed pursuant to subsection 1  
10 who is not a member of the Commission is not entitled to receive  
11 compensation for service on the committee, except that the  
12 member is entitled to receive the per diem allowance and travel  
13 expenses provided for state officers and employees generally. If  
14 the member is a public employee, his employer must grant him  
15 administrative leave from his duties to serve on such a committee  
16 without loss of his regular compensation and without reducing the  
17 amount of any other accrued leave he may have.*

18     **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
