SUMMARY—Revises certain provisions pertaining to the regulation of firearms by local governments.

AN ACT relating to firearms; revising certain provisions pertaining to the regulation of firearms by local governments; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Assembly Bill No. 147 of the 1989 Legislative Session (Chapter 308, Statutes
2 of Nevada 1989, p. 653) reserved for the Legislature the rights and powers
3 necessary to regulate the transfer, sale, purchase, possession, ownership,
4 transportation, registration and licensing of firearms and ammunition in this State.
5 However, **section 5** of Assembly Bill No. 147 provided that the preemptive effect
6 of the bill applied only to ordinances or regulations adopted by local governments
7 on or after June 13, 1989. This bill requires the amendment of ordinances or
8 regulations adopted by local governments before June 13, 1989, that require
9 registration of a firearm capable of being concealed to impose: (1) a period of at
10 least 60 days of residency in the jurisdiction before registration of such a firearm is
11 required; and (2) a period of at least 72 hours for the registration of a pistol by a
12 resident of the jurisdiction upon transfer of title to the pistol to the resident by
13 purchase, gift or any other transfer.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 244.364 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 244.364 1. Except as otherwise provided by specific statute,
3 the Legislature reserves for itself such rights and powers as are
4 necessary to regulate the transfer, sale, purchase, possession,
5 ownership, transportation, registration and licensing of firearms and
6 ammunition in Nevada, and no county may infringe upon those
7 rights and powers.

8 2. A board of county commissioners may proscribe by
9 ordinance or regulation the unsafe discharge of firearms.

10 3. *If a board of county commissioners in a county whose
11 population is 400,000 or more has required by ordinance or
12 regulation adopted before June 13, 1989, the registration of a
13 firearm capable of being concealed, the board of county
14 commissioners shall amend such an ordinance or regulation to
15 require:*

16 (a) *A period of at least 60 days of residency in the county
17 before registration of such a firearm is required.*

18 (b) *A period of at least 72 hours for the registration of a pistol
19 by a resident of the county upon transfer of title to the pistol to the
20 resident by purchase, gift or any other transfer.*

21 4. As used in this section ~~firearm~~:

22 (a) **“Firearm”** means any weapon from which a projectile is
23 discharged by means of an explosive, spring, gas, air or other force.

24 (b) *“Firearm capable of being concealed” includes all
25 firearms having a barrel less than 12 inches in length.*

26 (c) *“Pistol” means a firearm capable of being concealed that is
27 intended to be aimed and fired with one hand.*

28 **Sec. 2.** NRS 268.418 is hereby amended to read as follows:

29 268.418 1. Except as otherwise provided by specific statute,
30 the Legislature reserves for itself such rights and powers as are
31 necessary to regulate the transfer, sale, purchase, possession,
32 ownership, transportation, registration and licensing of firearms and
33 ammunition in Nevada, and no city may infringe upon those rights
34 and powers.

35 2. The governing body of a city may proscribe by ordinance or
36 regulation the unsafe discharge of firearms.

37 3. *If the governing body of a city in a county whose
38 population is 400,000 or more has required by ordinance or
39 regulation adopted before June 13, 1989, the registration of a
40 firearm capable of being concealed, the governing body shall
41 amend such an ordinance or regulation to require:*

1 (a) *A period of at least 60 days of residency in the city before*
2 *registration of such a firearm is required.*

3 (b) *A period of at least 72 hours for the registration of a pistol*
4 *by a resident of the city upon transfer of title to the pistol to the*
5 *resident by purchase, gift or any other transfer.*

6 4. As used in this section [“firearm”]:

7 (a) *“Firearm” means any weapon from which a projectile is*
8 *discharged by means of an explosive, spring, gas, air or other force.*

9 (b) *“Firearm capable of being concealed” includes all*
10 *firearms having a barrel less than 12 inches in length.*

11 (c) *“Pistol” means a firearm capable of being concealed that is*
12 *intended to be aimed and fired with one hand.*

13 Sec. 3. NRS 269.222 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 269.222 1. Except as otherwise provided by specific statute,

17 ownership, transportation, registration and licensing of firearms and
18 ammunition in Nevada, and no town may infringe upon those rights
19 and powers.

20 2. A town board may proscribe by ordinance or regulation the
21 unsafe discharge of firearms.

22 3. *If a town board in a county whose population is 400,000*
23 *or more has required by ordinance or regulation adopted before*
24 *June 13, 1989, the registration of a firearm capable of being*
25 *concealed, the town board shall amend such an ordinance or*
26 *regulation to require:*

27 (a) *A period of at least 60 days of residency in the town before*
28 *registration of such a firearm is required.*

29 (b) *A period of at least 72 hours for the registration of a pistol*
30 *by a resident of the town upon transfer of title to the pistol to the*
31 *resident by purchase, gift or any other transfer.*

32 4. As used in this section [“firearm”]:

33 (a) *“Firearm” means any weapon from which a projectile is*
34 *discharged by means of an explosive, spring, gas, air or other force.*

35 (b) *“Firearm capable of being concealed” includes all*
36 *firearms having a barrel less than 12 inches in length.*

37 (c) *“Pistol” means a firearm capable of being concealed that is*
38 *intended to be aimed and fired with one hand.*

39 Sec. 4. Section 5 of chapter 308, Statutes of Nevada 1989, at
40 page 653, is hereby amended to read as follows:

41 Sec. 5. [The]

42 1. *Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the*
43 *provisions of this act apply [only] to ordinances or*
44 *regulations adopted on or after [the effective date of this act.]*
45 *June 13, 1989.*

1 *2. The provisions of this act, as amended on October 1,*
2 *2007, apply to ordinances or regulations adopted before, on*
3 *or after June 13, 1989.*

4 **Sec. 5.** A board of county commissioners, governing body of a
5 city and town board in a county whose population is 400,000 or
6 more shall amend any ordinance or regulation adopted by that body
7 before June 13, 1989, that does not conform with the provisions of
8 NRS 244.364, as amended by section 1 of this act, NRS 268.418, as
9 amended by section 2 of this act or NRS 269.222, as amended by
10 section 3 of this act, as applicable, by January 1, 2008. Any
11 ordinance or regulation that does not comply with the applicable
12 provision by January 1, 2008, shall be deemed to conform with that
13 provision by operation of law.
