

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 15—SENATOR NOLAN

MARCH 19, 2007

Referred to Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections

SUMMARY—Directs the Legislative Commission to conduct an interim study of the establishment of a state lottery if the 74th Session of the Nevada Legislature enacts a constitutional amendment authorizing a state lottery. (BDR R-287)

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Directing the Legislative Commission to conduct an interim study of the establishment of a state lottery if the 74th Session of the Nevada Legislature enacts a constitutional amendment authorizing a state lottery.

1 RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE
2 ASSEMBLY CONCURRING, That if the 74th Session of the Nevada
3 Legislature enacts a proposal to amend the Nevada Constitution
4 authorizing a state lottery, the Legislative Commission shall appoint
5 an interim committee to conduct a study of the social and economic
6 consequences of the establishment of a state lottery; and be it further
7 RESOLVED, That the committee must consist of:

8 1. Three Assemblymen who have knowledge in gaming issues
9 in the State of Nevada, appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly;
10 and
11 2. Three Senators who have knowledge in gaming issues in the
12 State of Nevada, appointed by the Majority Leader of the Senate;
13 and be it further

14 RESOLVED, That the study must include a review of the social
15 and economic consequences of the establishment of a state lottery,
16 including, without limitation:

17 1. The impact on individuals, families, children, businesses and
18 this State's economy, generally;

1 2. The possible diversion of income from purchases of real
2 goods and services to purchases of state lottery tickets and the
3 potential economic effect thereof;

4 3. The additional costs and resources required to treat problem
5 gambling;

6 4. The potential revenues generated through the operation of a
7 state lottery;

8 5. The allocation of revenues from the state lottery;

9 6. The potential effect on current gaming revenues; and

10 7. The content, effect and geographic targeting of advertising
11 of state lottery games; and be it further

12 RESOLVED, That all officers, agencies and departments of this
13 State, including, without limitation, gaming programs of the
14 University of Nevada, Reno, and the University of Nevada, Las
15 Vegas, are directed to assist the committee in the performance of its
16 functions and to furnish such information and advice as the
17 members of the committee consider necessary to perform their
18 functions; and be it further

19 RESOLVED, That in conducting the study, the committee shall
20 seek information and suggestions from experts in the fields of state
21 lotteries and gaming; and be it further

22 RESOLVED, That the committee shall submit its findings, and
23 recommendations for legislation approved by a majority of the
24 members of the Senate and a majority of the members of the
25 Assembly who are appointed to the committee, to the 75th Session
26 of the Nevada Legislature.
