SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Honoring John Snyder upon his selection for induction into The National Teachers Hall of Fame.

1 WHEREAS, The National Teachers Hall of Fame was founded in
2 Emporia, Kansas, in 1989 to honor our nation's most important
3 profession through a recognition program and a museum and
4 resource center, and each year since 1992, outstanding elementary
5 and secondary teachers throughout the country have been inducted
6 into the Hall of Fame; and

7 WHEREAS, This summer, one of Nevada's most distinguished
8 teachers, John Snyder, who teaches computer science at Advanced
9 Technologies Academy in Las Vegas, will join four other select

1 educators from across the nation as they are honored with the
2 distinction of being among the best teachers in America through
3 induction into the Hall of Fame; and

4 WHEREAS, John Snyder is no stranger to such recognition, as he
5 has been the recipient of numerous awards during his 36-year
6 career, including the Get Excited About Education grant from
7 Citibank in 2006, the Chasing Rainbows Award in 2003, the
8 Technology Teacher of the Year in 1995 from *Technology &*
9 *Learning* magazine, the Milken National Educator Award in 1992,
10 the designation as Nevada Teacher of the Year for 1989-1990 and
11 the national Innovative Teaching Award from *BusinessWeek*
12 magazine; and

13 WHEREAS, John Snyder's philosophy of education is to
14 encourage students to learn with confidence and develop their skills
15 by asking questions instead of listening to lectures; and

16 WHEREAS, One of the techniques John employs that makes him
17 so effective in the classroom is his design of lessons that provide his
18 students with the ability to assess accurately any situation they may
19 encounter, the tools to resolve the situation successfully, and the
20 pride and confidence to do so with excellence; and

21 WHEREAS, This dedicated teacher has spent many summer
22 breaks working for private industry to stay current with technology
23 innovations and to ensure that he employs the most up-to-date
24 procedures and technology in the classroom; and

25 WHEREAS, The combination of his patience, selflessness and
26 enthusiasm and the personal attention he gives to his students truly
27 makes John Snyder worthy of the honors bestowed upon him,
28 according to his students and the Academy's Principal, in addition
29 to the entities that have honored him throughout his career; now,
30 therefore, be it

31 RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE
32 ASSEMBLY CONCURRING, That the members of the 74th Nevada
33 Legislature hereby, with great pride, honor John Snyder upon his
34 selection as the first Nevada teacher to be inducted into The
35 National Teachers Hall of Fame; and be it further
