

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 40—COMMITTEE ON
TRANSPORTATION AND HOMELAND SECURITY

MAY 14, 2007

Referred to Committee on Transportation and Homeland Security

SUMMARY—Urges the Department of Motor Vehicles to develop a tiered classification system to evaluate and rate driving schools. (BDR R-1473)

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Urging the Department of Motor Vehicles to develop a tiered classification system to evaluate and rate driving schools.

WHEREAS, In 2005, there were 427 traffic-related fatalities in Nevada, compared to 314 such fatalities in 2001; and

WHEREAS, The number of traffic-related fatalities in Nevada exceeds the national average; and

WHEREAS, Many of these traffic accidents could be avoided with better training of drivers; and

WHEREAS, A reliable system to evaluate the effectiveness of various programs to train drivers has not been established in this State; and

WHEREAS, A centralized rating system concerning the training provided by driving schools to drivers in this State would provide valuable information to the public about which schools offer the most effective programs for promoting driver safety; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE ASSEMBLY CONCURRING, That the members of the Nevada Legislature urge the Department of Motor Vehicles to develop a tiered classification system to evaluate and rate driving schools which gives each driving school in the State a rating of superior, average or below average and that the Department further make these ratings available to the public on an Internet website and through other reasonable means; and be it further
