SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Urging the Department of Motor Vehicles to develop a tiered classification system to evaluate and rate driving schools.

1 WHEREAS, In 2005, there were 427 traffic-related fatalities in
2 Nevada, compared to 314 such fatalities in 2001; and

3 WHEREAS, The number of traffic-related fatalities in Nevada
4 exceeds the national average; and

5 WHEREAS, Many of these traffic accidents could be avoided
6 with better training of drivers; and

7 WHEREAS, A reliable system to evaluate the effectiveness of
8 various programs to train drivers has not been established in this
9 State; and

10 WHEREAS, A centralized rating system concerning the training
11 provided by driving schools to drivers in this State would provide
12 valuable information to the public about which schools offer the
13 most effective programs for promoting driver safety; now, therefore,
14 be it

15 RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE
16 ASSEMBLY CONCURRING, That the members of the Nevada
17 Legislature urge the Department of Motor Vehicles to develop a
18 tiered classification system to evaluate and rate driving schools
19 which gives each driving school in the State a rating of superior,
20 average or below average and that the Department further make
21 these ratings available to the public on an Internet website and
22 through other reasonable means; and be it further
