Chair Leslie:

[Meeting called to order. Roll called.] Please mark members present as they arrive. We will open the hearing on <u>Senate Bill 142</u>.

Senate Bill 142 (1st Reprint): Revises provisions governing certain forms used by hospitals in this State. (BDR 40-602)

John A. Liveratti, Social Welfare Program Chief, Compliance Unit, Division of Health Care Financing and Policy, Department of Human Resources:

[Read from prepared text (Exhibit C).]

Chair Leslie:

Senate Bill 142 replaces form UB-04 with generic language. Is that correct?

John A. Liveratti:

That is correct.

Chair Leslie:

Has anyone objected to the language in this Bill?

John A. Liveratti:

It was amended to this language, and agreed upon.

Chair Leslie:

Are there any questions from the Committee? Would anyone else like to testify in favor or against <u>S.B. 142</u>? The hearing is closed on <u>S.B. 142</u>. We will hold this bill until all committee members are present. Senator Horsford will not be able to join us today; therefore, we will skip <u>Senate Joint Resolution 6</u>. The hearing is open on <u>Senate Joint Resolution 14</u>. Is there anyone here to speak on behalf of <u>S.J.R. 14</u>?

Leslie A. Johnstone, Executive Officer, State of Nevada Public Employees' Benefits Program (PEBP):

This resolution was recommended by the <u>Assembly Concurrent Resolution 10</u> interim committee that studied the PEBP for the last two interims. The Public Employees' Benefits Board does not have a position on this Bill.

Chair Leslie:

Would you like to briefly describe what this bill does?

Leslie A. Johnstone:

It would request that Congress consider lowering the age for Medicare eligibility from age 65 to age 62.

Chair Leslie:

What is the purpose?

Leslie J. Johnstone:

The intent of the Committee was to acknowledge that more people are uninsured at the age after retirement, but before the age of Medicare eligibility. It is to help with the coverage for medical expenses during that window period.

Assemblyman Hardy:

Will this potentially decrease the burden on PEBP?

Leslie A. Johnstone:

That would be the direct impact. There would be some financial implications on the federal side which would trickle down to us.

Chair Leslie:

Thank you for asking the question, Assemblyman Hardy. Guess who is going to get the floor statement? We will close the hearing on <u>S.J.R. 14</u>. I will accept a motion to take a vote on S.J.R. 14.

Assemblywoman Ellen Koivisto:

Medicare, Medicaid, and Social Security are all in trouble. Why would we want to start paying for people who are younger?

Assemblywoman Kathy McClain:

We did a survey of people age 50 and older in Nevada. Six percent of people over age 50 do not have health insurance. Eighty-three percent of those people are between the ages of 50 to 64.
