Chairman Arberry opened the hearing on Senate Bill (S.B.) 556 (1st Reprint).

Senate Bill 556 (1st Reprint): Makes various changes concerning the judicial system. (BDR 1-1475)

Arthur Ritchie, District Judge, Eighth Judicial District Court, stated there were eight Family Court judicial positions: two positions in Washoe County and six in Clark County. The positions were created in 1993 and were called "off-cycle," which meant they were elected off the cycle when later judicial salary increases were approved. The bill would provide a mechanism to equalize salary for those eight judicial positions in the District Court and provide equity in judicial salaries

for the five Nevada Supreme Court Justices who were off-cycle. The Nevada Constitution prevented them from taking the raise in salary, so law library commissions were created instead. "This is a reconstitution of the bill that was passed in 2001." Judge Ritchie explained the bill would allow for equalization for District Court judges salaries in 2009-10 and would solve the issue of library commissions as it related to District Court judges by taking the eight positions and putting them on cycle by 2015. Each of the judges had agreed that their terms, beginning in 2011, would be four-year terms. Judge Ritchie asked for Committee support in the reconstitution of the commissions to allow judges, some of whom had been serving over 10 years, to receive equitable salaries.
