- BILL DRAFT REQUEST 57-1133: Revises certain provisions governing policies of insurance for motor vehicles. (Later introduced as Senate Bill 475.)

- <u>BILL DRAFT REQUEST 32-1392</u>: Makes various changes regarding the appeal of property assessments made for purposes of taxation. (Later introduced as Senate Bill 478.)
