FIRST REVISED AGENDA

[S.B. 8](#) Provides that the repeated misuse of alcoholic beverages or controlled substances by a person who is responsible for a child's welfare constitutes prima facie evidence of negligent treatment or maltreatment of the child under certain circumstances. (BDR 38-245)

[S.B. 5](#) Requires the establishment of the Cancer Drug Donation Program. (BDR 40-19)

[S.B. 6](#) Includes marijuana in the provision which prohibits persons from intentionally allowing children to be present at certain locations where certain crimes involving controlled substances are committed. (BDR 40-223)
