S.B. 30	Revises the provisions governing the early release of prisoners from county or city jails to relieve overcrowding. (BDR 16-362)
S.B. 33	Requires the manager of a gated community to provide to parole and probation officers the code or device which allows entry to the community. (BDR 16-560)
S.B. 36	Authorizes the board of county commissioners to include longevity pay in the compensation of justices of the peace. (BDR 1-269)
<u>S.B. 45</u>	Provides for the imposition of an administrative assessment on a person convicted of driving while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a controlled substance. (BDR 14-672)
S.B. 129	Makes various changes to provisions relating to guardianships. (BDR 13-1109)
S.B. 131	Makes various changes regarding certain court fees charged and collected by county clerks. (BDR 2-385)
S.B. 132	Makes various changes concerning the liability of trailbuilding organizations and landowners, lessees and occupants of land to persons using premises for recreational activities. (BDR 3-212)
S.B. 133	Enacts provisions pertaining to civil actions involving liquefied petroleum gas. (BDR 3-77)
