AN ACT relating to military service; ~~[e]stablishing the Nevada Veterans' Museum as an institution of the Division of Museums and History of the Department of Cultural Affairs; authorizing the transfer of certain abandoned property to the Nevada Veterans' Museum.]~~ providing that the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada may grant a waiver of certain fees for the child, widow or widower of a person who was killed while he was performing his duties as a member of the Nevada National Guard; revising provisions that provide certain benefits for licenses, tags or permits for hunting, fishing or trapping to certain members of the Armed Forces of the United States and their families to provide those benefits to certain members of the Nevada National Guard and their families; authorizing the Department of Wildlife to issue, under certain circumstances, a fishing or hunting license to a member of the Nevada National Guard who is a bona fide resident of this State; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

~~1 Existing law establishes several museums and societies within the Division of Museums  
2 and History of the Department of Cultural Affairs, and provides that the duties of such~~

3 museums and societies are assigned by the Administrator of the Division. (NRS 381.004)  
4 Section 1 of this bill establishes the Nevada Veterans' Museum as an institution of the  
5 Division.

6 Under existing law, certain abandoned property held by certain businesses and  
7 governmental entities must be turned over to the State Treasurer in his capacity as the  
8 Administrator of Unclaimed Property. (Chapter 120A of NRS) Section 2 of this bill includes  
9 the Nevada Veterans' Museum as an entity to which such abandoned property may be  
10 transferred under certain circumstances. (NRS 120A.360)

11 Existing law authorizes the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada to waive  
12 certain fees for a member of the Nevada National Guard or a recruit for the Nevada National  
13 Guard. (NRS 396.544) Additionally, existing law requires the Board of Regents to pay certain  
14 fees for the dependent child of a police officer, firefighter, officer of the Nevada Highway  
15 Patrol or volunteer ambulance driver or attendant killed while performing his duties. (NRS  
16 396.545) **Section 2.2** of this bill authorizes the Board of Regents to waive certain fees for any  
17 child, widow or widower of a person who was killed while he was performing his duties as a  
18 member of the Nevada National Guard.

19 Existing law provides certain benefits relating to obtaining licenses, tags or permits for  
20 hunting, fishing or trapping to certain members of the Armed Forces of the United States and  
21 their families. (NRS 502.070, 502.290) **Sections 2.4 and 2.6** of this bill extend those benefits  
22 to certain members of the Nevada National Guard and their families.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** ~~NRS 381.004 is hereby amended to read as follows:~~

2       ~~381.004~~ 1. ~~The Division of Museums and History is hereby created in the~~  
3 ~~Department.~~

4       2. ~~The Division consists of the Office of the Administrator and a state system~~  
5 ~~of museums consisting of the following museums and historical societies, which are~~  
6 ~~hereby established as institutions of the Division:~~

7       (a) ~~The Nevada State Museum;~~

8       (b) ~~The Lost City Museum;~~

9       (c) ~~The Nevada Museum and Historical Society;~~

10       (d) ~~The Nevada Historical Society;~~

11       (e) ~~The East Ely Depot Museum;~~

12       (f) ~~The Nevada State Railroad Museum in Carson City; [and]~~

13       (g) ~~The Nevada State Railroad Museum in Boulder City []; and~~

14       (h) ~~The Nevada Veterans' Museum.~~

15       3. Each institution shall, in accordance with the duties assigned to it by the  
16 Administrator, collect, preserve and interpret the history, prehistory and natural  
17 history of this State.] ~~(Deleted by amendment.)~~

18       **Sec. 2.** ~~NRS 120A.360 is hereby amended to read as follows:~~

19       ~~120A.360~~ 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 4, 5 and 6, all  
20 abandoned property other than money delivered to the Administrator under this  
21 chapter must, within 2 years after the delivery, be sold by the Administrator to the  
22 highest bidder at public sale in whatever manner affords in his judgment the most  
23 favorable market for the property involved. The Administrator may decline the  
24 highest bid and reoffer the property for sale if he considers the price bid  
25 insufficient.

26       2. Any sale held under this section must be preceded by a single publication  
27 of notice thereof at least 2 weeks in advance of the sale in a newspaper of general  
28 circulation in the county where the property is to be sold.

1       3. The purchaser at any sale conducted by the Administrator pursuant to this  
2 chapter is vested with title to the property purchased, free from all claims of the  
3 owner or prior holder and of all persons claiming through or under them. The  
4 Administrator shall execute all documents necessary to complete the transfer of  
5 title.

6       4. The Administrator need not offer any property for sale if, in his opinion,  
7 the probable cost of the sale exceeds the value of the property. The Administrator  
8 may destroy or otherwise dispose of such property or may transfer it to:

9           (a) The Nevada Museum and Historical Society, the Nevada State Museum,  
10 [or] the Nevada Historical Society [,] or the Nevada Veterans' Museum, upon its  
11 written request, if the property has, in the opinion of the requesting institution,  
12 historical, artistic, [or] literary or military value, as applicable, and is worthy of  
13 preservation; or

14           (b) A genealogical library, upon its written request, if the property has  
15 genealogical value and is not wanted by the Nevada Museum and Historical  
16 Society, the Nevada State Museum, [or] the Nevada Historical Society [,] or

17           (c) A veterans' or military museum, upon its written request, if the property  
18 has military or military historical value and is not wanted by the Nevada Museum  
19 and Historical Society, the Nevada State Museum] or the Nevada [Historical  
20 Society.] Veterans' Museum.

21       An action may not be maintained by any person against the holder of the  
22 property because of that transfer, disposal or destruction.

23       5. Securities listed on an established stock exchange must be sold at the  
24 prevailing price for that security on the exchange at the time of sale. Other  
25 securities not listed on an established stock exchange may be sold:

26           (a) Over the counter at the prevailing price for that security at the time of sale;  
27 or

28           (b) By any other method the Administrator deems acceptable.

29       6. The Administrator shall hold property that was removed from a safe-  
30 deposit box or other safekeeping repository for 1 year after the date of the delivery  
31 of the property to the Administrator, unless that property is a will or a codicil to a  
32 will, in which case the Administrator shall hold the property for 10 years after the  
33 date of the delivery of the property to the Administrator. If no claims are filed for  
34 the property within that period, it may be destroyed.] **(Deleted by amendment.)**

35       Sec. 2.2. Chapter 396 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new  
36 section to read as follows:

37       1. *The Board of Regents may grant a waiver of registration fees and  
38 laboratory fees for any child, widow or widower of a person who was killed while  
39 he was performing his duties as a member of the Nevada National Guard. For  
40 the purpose of assessing fees and charges against a person to whom a waiver is  
41 granted pursuant to this subsection, including, without limitation, tuition charges  
42 pursuant to NRS 396.540, the person shall be deemed to be a bona fide resident  
43 of this State.*

44       2. *To be eligible for a waiver pursuant to subsection 1, a person must  
45 maintain at least a 3.25 grade point average, on a 4.0 grading scale, each  
46 semester, or the equivalent of a 3.25 grade point average if a different grading  
47 scale is used and:*

48           (a) *Be the widow or widower of the member of the Nevada National Guard;*  
49 *or*

50           (b) *Be the child of the member of the Nevada National Guard.*

51       3. *A widow or widower is eligible for 4 years after the date of the death of  
52 the member of the Nevada National Guard. A child is eligible for 4 years after he*

1       *attains the age of 18 years or, if he enrolls in the System before the age of 18  
2       years, for 4 years after the date of his enrollment.*

3       *4. The Board of Regents may request the Adjutant General to verify that a  
4       person is the widow, widower or child of a person who was killed while he was  
5       performing his duties as a member of the Nevada National Guard. The Adjutant  
6       General shall, upon receiving such a request, notify the Board of Regents in  
7       writing concerning the status of that person.*

8       **Sec. 2.4.** NRS 502.070 is hereby amended to read as follows:

9       502.070 1. The Department shall issue to any member of the Armed Forces  
10      of the United States who has been assigned to permanent duty, as opposed to  
11      temporary or casual duty, within the State of Nevada *or to any member in good  
12      standing of the Nevada National Guard who has served on active duty* all  
13      necessary hunting or fishing licenses, tags or permits for fishing, hunting or  
14      trapping in the State of Nevada. A like privilege must be extended to spouses and  
15      dependents, under the age of 21, of ~~such~~ *those* members of the Armed Forces ~~or  
16      All such~~ *or the Nevada National Guard. The* licenses, tags or permits must be  
17      issued on the same terms and conditions and at the same costs as licenses, tags or  
18      permits are issued to Nevada residents, except that the 6 months' residence  
19      requirement must be waived.

20       2. The issuance of ~~all such~~ *the* licenses, tags and permits must be made by  
21      application upon a form provided for that purpose by the Department. The  
22      application must include such proof of assignment to permanent duty within the  
23      State of Nevada *or proof of service on active duty and membership in good  
24      standing in the Nevada National Guard* as may be deemed necessary by the  
25      Department to determine whether or not an applicant is ~~factually so assigned~~  
26      *eligible for a license, tag or permit pursuant to subsection 1.*

27       **Sec. 2.6.** NRS 502.290 is hereby amended to read as follows:

28       502.290 1. The ~~Commission is authorized to issue to those persons serving  
29      in the Armed Forces of the United States who are bona fide residents of the State of  
30      Nevada~~ *Department may issue* fishing or hunting licenses, upon the payment of \$5  
31      for each license, ~~provided those persons requesting the licenses are at the time on~~  
32      *to any person who is a bona fide resident of the State of Nevada and is:*

33       (a) *On* active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States ~~and are not  
34      stationed in the State of Nevada;~~ *; or*

35       (b) *A member in good standing of the Nevada National Guard who has  
36      served on active duty.*

37       2. The ~~Commission~~ *Department* may require whatever proof it deems  
38      necessary to determine whether ~~such persons come within~~ *a person is subject to*  
39      the provisions of this section.

40       3. *If the Department incurs a deficiency caused by the issuance of licenses  
41      pursuant to this section, the Department may request an allocation from the  
42      Contingency Fund pursuant to NRS 353.266, 353.268 and 353.269 to reimburse  
43      the Department for the amount of the deficiency.*

44       4. Any person who is guilty of giving false information to obtain a license as  
45      provided in this section is guilty of a misdemeanor.

46       **Sec. 3.** 1. This section and sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective on  
47      July 1, 2007.

48       2. Sections 2.2, 2.4 and 2.6 of this act become effective on October 1, 2007.
