SUMMARY—Revises the provisions governing the posting of warnings against trespassing. (BDR 15-702)

AN ACT relating to trespassing; revising the provisions governing the posting of warnings against trespassing; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Under existing law, a person commits the crime of trespassing if the person willfully goes
2 or remains upon any land or in any building after having been warned not to trespass. (NRS
3 207.200) For the purposes of determining whether a person has been given sufficient warning
4 not to trespass, the owner of land may choose to fence the area or may paint the area in a
5 specific manner.
6 This bill changes the interval between posts, structures or natural objects that must be
7 painted **with fluorescent orange paint** from 200 feet to ~~one-quarter mile,~~ **every 1,000 feet**
8 **and at each corner of the land if the land is used for agricultural purposes or for herding**
9 **or grazing livestock.** This bill also changes existing law, which requires that a post must be
10 painted with not less than 50 square inches of paint and which requires that if the post is a
11 metal fence post, the entire post must be painted, to provide that only the top 12 inches of any
12 post must be painted, regardless of whether the post is made of wood, metal or other material.
13 Furthermore, this bill requires that ~~all corners of the area and~~ **each side of** all gates, cattle
14 guards and openings that are designed for entry must be painted with fluorescent orange paint.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 207.200 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 207.200 1. Unless a greater penalty is provided pursuant to NRS 200.603,
3 any person who, under circumstances not amounting to a burglary:
4 (a) Goes upon the land or into any building of another with intent to vex or
5 annoy the owner or occupant thereof, or to commit any unlawful act; or

1 (b) Willfully goes or remains upon any land or in any building after having
2 been warned by the owner or occupant thereof not to trespass,
3 is guilty of a misdemeanor. The meaning of this subsection is not limited by
4 subsections 2 and 4.

5 2. A sufficient warning against trespassing, within the meaning of this
6 section, is given by ~~either~~ any of the following methods:

7 (a) ~~Painting~~ ~~[- at]~~ ~~[-]~~ If the land is used for agricultural purposes or for
8 herding or grazing livestock, by painting with fluorescent orange paint:

9 (1) ~~At intervals of not more than [200 feet] [one-quarter mile on each side]~~
10 1,000 feet and at each corner of the land, upon or near the boundary, not less than
11 50 square inches of the exterior portion of a [post,] structure or natural object
12 ~~[with not less than 50 square inches of fluorescent orange paint or] [-, if the post is a~~
13 ~~metal fence post, painting the entire post with such paint.]~~ or the top 12 inches of
14 the exterior portion of a post, whether made of wood, metal or other material ~~[-~~
15 ~~with fluorescent orange paint.] ; and~~

16 (2) ~~All corners of the area with fluorescent orange paint, and~~

17 ~~[-]~~ (3) ~~All~~ Each side of all gates, cattle guards and openings that are
18 designed to allow human ingress to the area with fluorescent orange paint ; ~~[-]~~

19 (b) If the land is not used in the manner specified in paragraph (a), by
20 painting with fluorescent orange paint, at intervals of not more than 200 feet and
21 at each corner of the land, upon or near the boundary, not less than 50 square
22 inches of the exterior portion of a structure or natural object or the top 12 inches
23 of the exterior portion of a post, whether made of wood, metal or other material;
24 or

25 (c) Fencing the area.

26 3. It is prima facie evidence of trespass for any person to be found on private
27 or public property which is posted or fenced as provided in subsection 2 without
28 lawful business with the owner or occupant of the property.

29 4. An entryman on land under the laws of the United States is an owner
30 within the meaning of this section.

31 5. As used in this section, "fence" means a barrier sufficient to indicate an
32 intent to restrict the area to human ingress, including, but not limited to, a wall,
33 hedge or chain link or wire mesh fence. The term does not include a barrier made
34 of barbed wire.
