**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions governing licenses to engage in pest control.  
(BDR 49-626)

**FISCAL NOTE:** Effect on Local Government: Increases or Newly Provides for  
Term of Imprisonment in County or City Jail or Detention Facility.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to pest control; authorizing the Director of the State Department of Agriculture to refuse to issue a license to engage in pest control to a person who is convicted of certain ***facts; prohibiting the Director from issuing such a license until the expiration of the period of the person's parole, probation or sentence;}*** crimes; requiring an applicant for a license to engage in pest control to submit a complete set of his fingerprints to the Director under certain circumstances; prohibiting a person ***[in connection with a real estate transaction,]*** from engaging in certain pest control activities concerning wood-destroying pests or organisms without a license issued by the Director; ***providing additional grounds for the Director to revoke, suspend or modify a license to engage in pest control;*** providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law prohibits a person from engaging in pest control activities without a license  
2 issued by the Director of the State Department of Agriculture. (NRS 555.280) “Pest control”  
3 means the business of using pesticides and mechanical devices to control infestations of pests  
4 and the inspection for hire of houses and other structures. The term also includes the  
5 submission of reports, estimates or bids for the inspection or control of wood-destroying pests.  
6 (NRS 555.2667) Existing law further prohibits a person from engaging in various pest control  
7 activities concerning wood-destroying pests or organisms without a license issued by the  
8 Director, including, without limitation, ***[conducting an inspection to identify or attempt to***  
9 ***identify infestations or infections of houses by those pests and]*** preparing inspection reports  
10 concerning ***[the infestations or infections,]*** ***those pests or organisms.*** (NRS 555.285)

11       Section 1 of this bill authorizes the Director to refuse to issue a license to ~~engage in~~ perform pest control to ~~a person who is~~ certain persons who are convicted of, or ~~entered~~ enter a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to, ~~certain specified crimes, including, without limitation,~~ a felony or any crime involving moral turpitude. Section 1 also ~~prohibits the Director from issuing~~ requires an applicant for a license to engage in pest control ~~to such a person until the expiration of the person's parole, probation or sentence,~~ who is a primary principal or intends to act as a primary principal for a pest control business to submit a complete set of his fingerprints to the Director. Additionally, section 1 sets forth grounds for the Director to refuse to issue ~~such~~ a license ~~to~~ to perform pest control.

20       Section 3 of this bill prohibits a person from ~~engaging in certain pest control activities,~~ altering an inspection report concerning wood-destroying pests or organisms without a license issued by the Director. ~~If the pest control activities are conducted in connection with a real estate transaction. Those pest control activities include: (1) making an inspection to identify or attempt to identify infestations or infections of wood destroying pests or organisms; (2) making or altering inspection reports concerning those infestations or infections; (3) making written or oral estimates or bids concerning the infestations or infections; and (4) submitting bids to do any work involving the application of pesticides to eliminate, exterminate, control or prevent the infestations or infections.)~~

29       Existing law authorizes the Director to revoke, suspend or modify a license to engage in pest control if he finds that the licensee has engaged in certain activities. (NRS 555.350)

32       Section 3.5 of this bill expands those activities to include a conviction of the licensee of a felony or any crime involving moral turpitude.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       Section 1. Chapter 555 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new  
2 section to read as follows:

3       1. The Director ~~is~~

4       (a) ~~May~~ may refuse to issue a license to ~~engage in~~ perform pest control to  
5 any person who ~~has~~:

6       (a) Is a primary principal or intends to act as a primary principal for a pest  
7 control business pursuant to NRS 555.3507; and

8       (b) ~~Has been convicted of, or entered a plea of guilty or nolo contendere to,  
9 forgery, embezzlement, obtaining money under false pretenses, larceny,  
10 extortion, conspiracy to defraud, engaging in pest control without a license,  
11 possessing for the purpose of sale any controlled substance,~~ a felony or any crime  
12 involving moral turpitude, in any court of competent jurisdiction in the United  
13 States or any other country.

14       ~~(b) Shall not issue a license to engage in pest control to a person specified in  
15 paragraph (a) until the expiration of the period of the person's parole, probation  
16 or sentence.)~~

17       2. In addition to any other requirements set forth in this chapter, each  
18 applicant for a license to perform pest control specified in paragraph (a) of  
19 subsection 1 shall submit with his application a complete set of his fingerprints  
20 and written permission authorizing the Director to forward the fingerprints to the  
21 Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History for submission to the  
22 Federal Bureau of Investigation for its report.

23       3. A suspension or revocation of a license to ~~engage in~~ perform pest  
24 control pursuant to NRS 555.350 or any previous revocation or current  
25 suspension of such a license in this or any other state, district or territory of the  
26 United States or any foreign country ~~within 10 years immediately preceding the~~

1           ***date of submission of an application for a license} is grounds for refusal to issue***  
2           ***the license.***

3           **Sec. 2.** NRS 555.2605 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4           555.2605 As used in NRS 555.2605 to 555.460, inclusive, ***and section 1 of***  
5           ***this act,*** unless the context otherwise requires, the words and terms defined in NRS  
6           555.261 to 555.2695, inclusive, have the meanings ascribed to them in those  
7           sections.

8           **Sec. 3.** NRS 555.285 is hereby amended to read as follows:

9           555.285 A person shall not, for hire, ***for in connection with any real estate***  
10           ***transaction,*** engage in, offer to engage in, advertise or solicit to perform any of the  
11           following pest control activities concerning wood-destroying pests or organisms  
12           without a license issued by the Director:

13           1. Making an inspection to identify or to attempt to identify infestations or  
14           infections of households or other structures by those pests or organisms.

15           2. Making ***or altering*** inspection reports concerning the infestations or  
16           infections.

17           3. Making estimates or bids, whether written or oral, concerning the  
18           infestations or infections.

19           4. Submitting bids to perform any work involving the application of  
20           pesticides for the elimination, extermination, control or prevention of infestations or  
21           infections of those pests.

22           **Sec. 3.5. NRS 555.350 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

23           555.350 1. The Director may suspend, pending inquiry, for not longer than  
24           10 days, and, after opportunity for a hearing, may revoke, suspend or modify any  
25           license issued under NRS 555.2605 to 555.460, inclusive, ***and section 1 of this act,***  
26           if he finds that:

27           (a) The licensee is no longer qualified;

28           (b) The licensee has engaged in fraudulent business practices in pest control;

29           (c) The licensee has made false or fraudulent claims through any media by  
30           misrepresenting the effect of materials or methods to be used;

31           (d) The licensee has applied known ineffective or improper materials;

32           (e) The licensee operated faulty or unsafe equipment;

33           (f) The licensee has made any application in a faulty, careless or negligent  
34           manner;

35           (g) The licensee has violated any of the provisions of NRS 555.2605 to  
36           555.460, inclusive, ***and section 1 of this act,*** or regulations adopted pursuant  
37           thereto;

38           (h) The licensee engaged in the business of pest control without having a  
39           licensed applicator or operator in direct on-the-job supervision;

40           (i) The licensee aided or abetted a licensed or an unlicensed person to evade  
41           the provisions of NRS 555.2605 to 555.460, inclusive, ***and section 1 of this act,***  
42           combined or conspired with such a licensee or an unlicensed person to evade the  
43           provisions, or allowed one's license to be used by an unlicensed person;

44           (j) The licensee was intentionally guilty of fraud or deception in the  
45           procurement of his license; ~~or~~

46           (k) The licensee was intentionally guilty of fraud or deception in the issuance  
47           of an inspection report on wood-destroying pests or other report required by  
48           regulation ~~or~~; or

49           (l) ***The licensee has been convicted of, or entered a plea of nolo contendere***  
50           ***to, a felony or any crime involving moral turpitude in any court of competent***  
51           ***jurisdiction in the United States or any other country.***

52           2. A license is suspended automatically, without action of the Director, if the  
53           proof of public liability and property damage or drift insurance filed pursuant to

1 NRS 555.330, is cancelled, and the license remains suspended until the insurance is  
2 reestablished.

3 *3. A licensee against whom the Director initiates disciplinary action to  
4 revoke, suspend or modify the license of the licensee pursuant to this section  
5 shall, within 30 days after receiving written notice of the disciplinary action from  
6 the Director, submit to the Director a complete set of his fingerprints and written  
7 permission authorizing the Director to forward the fingerprints to the Central  
8 Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal History for submission to the Federal  
9 Bureau of Investigation for its report.*

10 *4. A willful failure of a licensee to comply with the requirements of  
11 subsection 3 constitutes an additional ground for the revocation, suspension or  
12 modification of the license of the licensee pursuant to this section.*

13 *5. The Director has additional grounds to revoke, suspend or modify a  
14 license pursuant to this section if the report from the Federal Bureau of  
15 Investigation indicates that the licensee has been convicted of a felony or crime  
16 specified in paragraph (l) of subsection 1.*

17 **Sec. 4.** NRS 555.400 is hereby amended to read as follows:

18 555.400 1. The Director may adopt regulations to carry out the provisions  
19 of NRS 555.2605 to 555.460, inclusive, ~~but the~~ and section 1 of this act. The  
20 regulations must not be inconsistent with any regulations issued by this State or by  
21 the Federal Government relating to safety in air navigation or the operation of  
22 aircraft.

23 2. Before ~~issuing~~ adopting regulations directly relating to any matter within  
24 the jurisdiction of any other officer of this State, the Director shall consult with that  
25 officer ~~with reference thereto~~ concerning those regulations.

26 **Sec. 5.** NRS 555.460 is hereby amended to read as follows:

27 555.460 Any person violating the provisions of NRS 555.2605 to 555.420,  
28 inclusive, and section 1 of this act, or the regulations adopted thereto, is  
29 guilty of a misdemeanor and, in addition to any criminal penalty, shall pay to the  
30 Department an administrative fine of not more than \$5,000 per violation. If an  
31 administrative fine is imposed pursuant to this section, the costs of the proceeding,  
32 including investigative costs and attorney's fees, may be recovered by the  
33 Department.

34 **Sec. 6.** NRS 555.470 is hereby amended to read as follows:

35 555.470 1. The Director shall adopt regulations specifying a schedule of  
36 fines which may be imposed, upon notice and a hearing, for each violation of the  
37 provisions of NRS 555.2605 to 555.460, inclusive ~~but the~~, and section 1 of this act.  
38 The maximum fine that may be imposed by the Director for each violation must not  
39 exceed \$5,000 per day. All fines collected by the Director pursuant to this  
40 subsection must be remitted to the county treasurer of the county in which the  
41 violation occurred for credit to the county school district fund.

42 2. The Director may:

43 (a) In addition to imposing a fine pursuant to subsection 1, issue an order  
44 requiring a violator to take appropriate action to correct the violation; or

45 (b) Request the district attorney of the appropriate county to investigate or file  
46 a criminal complaint against any person that the State Board of Agriculture suspects  
47 may have violated any provision of NRS 555.2605 to 555.460, inclusive ~~but the~~, and  
48 section 1 of this act.

49 **Sec. 7.** This act becomes effective ~~upon passage and approval~~ on  
50 January 1, 2008.
