AN ACT relating to homeopathy; ~~[revising various provisions governing the regulation of homeopathic physicians; requiring the Nevada Institutional Review Board to reimburse the Board of Homeopathic Medical Examiners for the expenses it incurs to supervise the Nevada Institutional Review Board; requiring the Board of Homeopathic Medical Examiners to adopt regulations for the]~~ **eliminating the Nevada Institutional Review Board;** and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

- 13 ~~Section 9 of this bill revises and expands the scope of the practice of homeopathic~~

- 15 ~~diagnosis or treatment; and (2) the prescription of drugs, medicines, controlled substances and~~
- 16 ~~dangerous drugs.~~
- 17 ~~Sections 16, 17 and 20-26 of this bill replace the existing provisions for the renewal of~~
- 18 ~~licenses to practice homeopathic medicine and certificates as advanced practitioners of~~
- 19 ~~homeopathy and homeopathic assistants with provisions for the annual registration of the~~
- 20 ~~licenses and certificates.~~

~~21 Sections 19 and 22 of this bill change the licensure requirements for graduates of medical
 22 schools or schools of osteopathic medicine that are located outside the United States or
 23 Canada.
 24 Sections 28-34 of this bill make various changes concerning the Nevada Institutional
 25 Review Board, which is supervised by the Board of Homeopathic Medical Examiners.
 26 Section 30 replaces the indefinite terms for members of the Nevada Institutional Review
 27 Board with 2-year terms.
 28 Section 22 requires the Board of Homeopathic Medical Examiners to adopt, rather than
 29 merely approve, regulations that prescribe the manner in which the Nevada Institutional
 30 Review Board must discharge its duties.]~~

31 Existing law establishes the Nevada Institutional Review Board which, under the
 32 supervision of the Board of Homeopathic Medical Examiners, oversees, reviews and
 33 controls certain research studies. (NRS 630A.800-630A.910) This bill eliminates the
 34 Nevada Institutional Review Board.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
 SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Delete existing sections 1 through 39 of this bill and replace with the following
 2 new sections 1 through 5:
 3

4 **Section 1. NRS 630A.090 is hereby amended to read as follows:**
 5 630A.090 1. ~~[Except as otherwise provided in NRS 630A.800 to 630A.910,~~
 6 ~~inclusive, this] This chapter does not apply to:~~

7 (a) The practice of dentistry, chiropractic, Oriental medicine, podiatry,
 8 optometry, respiratory care, faith or Christian Science healing, nursing, veterinary
 9 medicine or fitting hearing aids.

10 (b) A medical officer of the Armed Services or a medical officer of any
 11 division or department of the United States in the discharge of his official duties.

12 (c) Licensed or certified nurses in the discharge of their duties as nurses.

13 (d) Homeopathic physicians who are called into this State, other than on a
 14 regular basis, for consultation or assistance to any physician licensed in this State,
 15 and who are legally qualified to practice in the state or country where they reside.

16 2. This chapter does not repeal or affect any statute of Nevada regulating or
 17 affecting any other healing art.

18 3. This chapter does not prohibit:

19 (a) Gratuitous services of a person in case of emergency.

20 (b) The domestic administration of family remedies.

21 4. This chapter does not authorize a homeopathic physician to practice
 22 medicine, including allopathic medicine, except as otherwise provided in
 23 NRS 630A.040.

24 **Sec. 2. NRS 630A.155 is hereby amended to read as follows:**
 25 630A.155 The Board shall:

26 1. Regulate the practice of homeopathic medicine in this State and any
 27 activities that are within the scope of such practice, to protect the public health and
 28 safety and the general welfare of the people of this State.

29 2. Determine the qualifications of, and examine, applicants for licensure or
 30 certification pursuant to this chapter, and specify by regulation the methods to be
 31 used to check the background of such applicants.

32 3. License or certify those applicants it finds to be qualified.

33 4. Investigate and, if required, hear and decide in a manner consistent with the
 34 provisions of chapter 622A of NRS all complaints made against any homeopathic

1 physician, advanced practitioner of homeopathy, homeopathic assistant or any
2 agent or employee of any of them, or any facility where the primary practice is
3 homeopathic medicine. If a complaint concerns a practice which is within the
4 jurisdiction of another licensing board or any other possible violation of state law,
5 the Board shall refer the complaint to the other licensing board.

6 ~~5. [Supervise the Nevada Institutional Review Board created by NRS
7 630A.865, including, without limitation, approving or denying the regulations
8 adopted by the Nevada Institutional Review Board.~~

9 ~~6.]~~ Submit an annual report to the Legislature and make recommendations to
10 the Legislature concerning the enactment of legislation relating to alternative and
11 complementary integrative medicine, including, without limitation, homeopathic
12 medicine.

13 **Sec. 3. NRS 630A.800, 630A.815, 630A.825, 630A.835, 630A.855,
14 630A.865, 630A.870, 630A.875, 630A.880, 630A.900, 630A.905 and 630A.910
15 are hereby repealed.**

16 **Sec. 4. 1. The Nevada Institutional Review Board shall, not later than
17 July 1, 2007:**

18 (a) Return the unexpended portion of any grant, gift, appropriation or
19 donation that was received by the Board subject to a condition that requires its
20 return if it cannot be used to carry out the duties of the Board;

21 (b) Transfer any money that remains in any account maintained by the
22 Nevada Institutional Review Board after complying with paragraph (a) to the
23 Board of Homeopathic Medical Examiners; and

24 (c) Transfer all books, records, minutes, documents and other property of
25 the Nevada Institutional Review Board to the Board of Homeopathic Medical
26 Examiners.

27 2. Any regulations adopted by the Nevada Institutional Review Board, or
28 by the Board of Homeopathic Medical Examiners concerning the Nevada
29 Institutional Review Board, are void on July 1, 2007. The Legislative Counsel
30 shall remove those regulations from the Nevada Administrative Code as soon
31 as practicable after July 1, 2007.

32 3. Any contract entered into by the Nevada Institutional Review Board,
33 or by the Board of Homeopathic Medical Examiners concerning the Nevada
34 Institutional Review Board, including, without limitation, a contract for
35 employment and a contract for the services of a person pursuant to NRS
36 284.013, that is not fully performed on July 1, 2007, is void.

37 4. If the Board of Homeopathic Medical Examiners has created a
38 nonprofit organization pursuant to NRS 630A.875, including, without
39 limitation, the NIRB Medical Foundation, the Board of Homeopathic Medical
40 Examiners shall, not later than July 1, 2007, dissolve the nonprofit
41 organization.

42 5. The Nevada Institutional Review Board shall cooperate with the Board
43 of Homeopathic Medical Examiners to ensure that the provisions of this act
44 are carried out in an orderly manner.

45 6. The terms of the members of the Nevada Institutional Review Board
46 expire on July 1, 2007.

47 **Sec. 5. 1. This section and section 4 of this act become effective upon
48 passage and approval.**
