**SUMMARY**—Makes appropriations to the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department of Health and Human Services for relocation expenses and replacement vehicles, phone system and other equipment. (BDR S-1213)

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AN ACT making appropriations to the Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department of Health and Human Services for relocation expenses and replacement vehicles, phone system and other equipment; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the  
2       Division of Health Care Financing and Policy of the Department of Health and  
3       Human Services:

4       1. For Health Care Financing and Policy, Administration, the sum of  
5       ~~\$200,302~~ **\$157,112** for expenses related to the relocation of the Las Vegas Office,  
6       purchase of a heavy duty color printer, surge protectors and computer software and  
7       replacement of servers, storage appliances, laptop and desktop computers and  
8       furniture.

9       2. For the Nevada Check Up Program, the sum of \$13,373 for expenses  
10      related to the relocation of the Las Vegas Office.

11       3. For Nevada Medicaid, Title XIX, the sum of \$354,264 for expenses related  
12      to the relocation of the Las Vegas Office, replacement of the Reno Office phone  
13      system and three replacement vehicles.

14       **Sec. 2.** Any remaining balance of the appropriations made by section 1 of  
15      this act must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2009, by the entity to  
16      which the appropriations are made or any entity to which money from the  
17      appropriations is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of  
18      the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after

1       September 18, 2009, by either the entity to which the money was appropriated or  
2       the entity to which the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be  
3       reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 18, 2009.

4       **Sec. 3.**   This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
