SUMMARY—Adds certain vehicles of ~~the Division of Parole and Probation of the Department of Public Safety~~ certain governmental agencies to the authorized emergency vehicles list. (BDR 43-557)

AN ACT relating to public safety; revising the list of authorized emergency vehicles to include certain vehicles of ~~the Division of Parole and Probation of the Department of Public Safety;~~ certain governmental agencies; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

1 This bill adds certain vehicles owned and operated by ~~the Division of Parole and~~
2 ~~Probation of the Department of Public Safety;~~ certain governmental agencies to the list of
3 authorized emergency vehicles. (NRS 484.787)

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 484.787 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 484.787 1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 484.789, authorized
3 emergency vehicles are vehicles publicly owned and operated in the performance of
4 the duty of:

- 5 (a) A police or fire department.
- 6 (b) A sheriff’s office.
- 7 (c) The Nevada Highway Patrol.
- 8 (d) The Division of Parole and Probation of the Department of Public Safety.
- 9 (e) The Investigation Division of the Department of Public Safety.
- 10 (f) The Division of Compliance Enforcement of the Department of Motor
11 Vehicles.
- 12 (g) The Department of Wildlife when the vehicles are operated by a game
13 warden or any peace officer exercising the powers of enforcement conferred by
14 NRS 289.280, 501.349 or 501.375.

1 *(h) The State Department of Agriculture when the vehicles are operated by a*
2 *field agent or an inspector exercising the powers of enforcement conferred by*
3 *NRS 289.290.*

4 *(i) The Division of Forestry of the State Department of Conservation and*
5 *Natural Resources in responding to a fire.*

6 ~~[(e)]~~ ~~[(f)]~~ *(j) A public ambulance agency.*

7 ~~[(e)]~~ ~~[(g)]~~ *(k) A public lifeguard or lifesaving agency.*

8 2. A vehicle publicly maintained in whole or in part by the State, or by a city
9 or county, and privately owned and operated by a regularly salaried member of a
10 police department, sheriff's office, ~~for~~ traffic law enforcement department ~~or~~ *or*
11 ~~*[the Division of Parole and Probation]*~~ *any agency listed in subsection 1* is an
12 authorized emergency vehicle if:

13 (a) The vehicle has a permit, pursuant to NRS 484.789, from the Department;

14 (b) The person operates the vehicle in responding to emergency calls or fire
15 alarms, or at the request of the Nevada Highway Patrol or ~~*[the Division of Parole*~~
16 ~~*and Probation or]*~~ *any agency listed in subsection 1* in the pursuit of actual or
17 suspected violators of the law; and

18 (c) The State, county or city does not furnish a publicly owned vehicle for the
19 purposes stated in paragraph (b).

20 3. Every authorized emergency vehicle must be equipped with at least one
21 flashing red warning lamp visible from the front and a siren for use as provided in
22 this chapter, which lamp and siren must be in compliance with standards approved
23 by the Department. In addition, an authorized emergency vehicle may display
24 revolving, flashing or steady red or blue warning lights to the front, sides or rear of
25 the vehicle.

26 4. An authorized emergency vehicle may be equipped with a system or device
27 that causes the upper-beam head lamps of the vehicle to continue to flash
28 alternately while the system or device is activated. The driver of a vehicle that is so
29 equipped may use the system or device when responding to an emergency call or
30 fire alarm, while escorting a funeral procession, or when in pursuit of an actual or
31 suspected violator of the law. As used in this subsection, "upper-beam head lamp"
32 means a head lamp or that part of a head lamp which projects a distribution of light
33 or composite beam meeting the requirements of subsection 1 of NRS 484.587.

34 5. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, a person shall not operate a
35 motor vehicle with any system or device that causes the head lamps of the vehicle
36 to continue to flash alternately or simultaneously while the system or device is
37 activated. This subsection does not prohibit the operation of a motorcycle equipped
38 with any system or device that modulates the intensity of light produced by the
39 head lamp of the motorcycle, if the system or device is used only during daylight
40 hours and conforms to the requirements of 49 C.F.R. § 571.108.

41 6. A person shall not operate a vehicle with any lamp or device displaying a
42 red light visible from directly in front of the center of the vehicle except an
43 authorized emergency vehicle, a school bus or an official vehicle of a regulatory
44 agency.

45 7. A person shall not operate a vehicle with any lamp or device displaying a
46 blue light, except a motorcycle pursuant to NRS 486.261 or an authorized
47 emergency vehicle.

48 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
