SUMMARY—Makes various changes relating to unarmed combat. (BDR 41-889)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to unarmed combat; **[eliminating the Medical Advisory Board;]** removing references to wrestling in various statutes relating to unarmed combat; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1        **[Section 4 of this bill eliminates the Medical Advisory Board, which currently**  
2        recommends standards for the physical and mental examination of contestants, recommends  
3        physicians for licensing, advises the Nevada Athletic Commission as to the physical or mental  
4        fitness of a contestant and submits reports containing recommendations for revisions in the  
5        law to protect the health of contestants. (NRS 467.018)] Sections 1-3 of this bill remove  
6        references to wrestling that are contained in various statutes relating to unarmed combat.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1        **Section 1.** NRS 467.0107 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2        467.0107 “Unarmed combat” means boxing **[, wrestling]** or any form of  
3        competition in which a blow is usually struck which may reasonably be expected to  
4        inflict injury.

5        **Sec. 2.** NRS 467.108 is hereby amended to read as follows:

6        467.108 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, in addition to the  
7        payment of any other fees or taxes required by this chapter, a promoter shall pay to  
8        the Commission a fee of \$1.00 for each ticket sold for admission to a live  
9        professional **[boxing or wrestling]** contest **[, match or exhibition] of unarmed**  
10      **combat** which is held in this State.

11      2. In lieu of the fee imposed pursuant to subsection 1, the Executive Director  
12      of the Commission may require a promoter to pay to the Commission a fee of \$.50  
13      for each ticket sold for admission to a live professional **[boxing or wrestling]**  
14      contest **[, match or exhibition] of unarmed combat** which is held in this State if the  
15      gross receipts from admission fees to the contest **[, match or exhibition] of**  
16      **unarmed combat** are less than \$500,000.

1       3. The money collected pursuant to subsections 1 and 2 must be used by the  
2 Commission to award grants to organizations which promote amateur ~~Boxing~~  
3 contests or exhibitions *of unarmed combat* in this State.

4       4. The Commission shall adopt by regulation ~~the~~ :

5       (a) *The* manner in which ~~the~~

6       ~~(a) The~~ fees required by subsections 1 and 2 must be paid.

7       (b) ~~[Applications]~~ *The manner in which applications* for grants may be  
8 submitted to the Commission. ~~and the~~

9       (c) *The* standards to be used to award grants to organizations which promote  
10 amateur ~~Boxing~~ contests or exhibitions *of unarmed combat* in this State.

11 **Sec. 3.** NRS 467.135 is hereby amended to read as follows:

12       467.135 1. The Commission, its Executive Director or any other employee  
13 authorized by the Commission may order the promoter to withhold any part of a  
14 purse or other money belonging or payable to any contestant, manager or second if,  
15 in the judgment of the Commission, Executive Director or other employee:

16       (a) The contestant is not competing honestly or to the best of his skill and  
17 ability or the contestant otherwise violates any regulations adopted by the  
18 Commission or any of the provisions of this chapter, including, but not limited to,  
19 the provisions of subsection 1 of NRS 467.110; or

20       (b) The manager or seconds violate any regulations adopted by the  
21 Commission or any of the provisions of this chapter, including, but not limited to,  
22 the provisions of subsection 1 of NRS 467.110.

23       2. ~~This section does not apply to any contestant in a wrestling exhibition who  
24 appears not to be competing honestly or to the best of his skill and ability.~~

25       ~~3.~~ Upon the withholding of any part of a purse or other money pursuant to  
26 this section, the Commission shall immediately schedule a hearing on the matter,  
27 provide adequate notice to all interested parties and dispose of the matter as  
28 promptly as possible.

29       ~~4.~~ If it is determined that a contestant, manager or second is not entitled to  
30 any part of his share of the purse or other money, the promoter shall pay the money  
31 over to the Commission. Subject to the provisions of subsection ~~5.~~ 4, the money  
32 must be deposited with the State Treasurer for credit to the State General Fund.

33       ~~5.~~ 4. Money turned over to the Commission pending final action in any  
34 matter must be credited to the Athletic Commission's Agency Account and must  
35 remain in that Account until the Commission orders its disposition in accordance  
36 with the final action taken.

37       **Sec. 4.** ~~NRS 467.0101, 467.012, 467.015 and 467.018 are hereby repealed.~~

39       **Sec. 5.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
