SUMMARY ~~[Provides for the creation of a state]~~ Requires the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to conduct a study to consider the feasibility of establishing a park for the protection of certain paleontologically sensitive sites. AN ACT relating to ~~state parks; creating a state park in the Upper Las Vegas Wash]~~ parks; requiring the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to conduct a study of the feasibility of establishing and developing ~~the park;~~ a park in the Upper Las Vegas Wash; making an appropriation; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Section ~~[1]~~ 2 of this bill ~~creates a state park on approximately 315 acres of land owned by the State in the Upper Las Vegas Wash.~~ Section 2 of this bill requires the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to work with the University of Nevada, Las Vegas, to conduct a study of the feasibility of establishing and developing ~~the park created in section 1 to contain~~ a park in the Upper Las Vegas Wash. Section 1 further requires the study to include a consideration of the feasibility of developing a museum and a live dig site that the public may visit. Section 3 of this bill contains an appropriation for the costs of the study.

1 WHEREAS, The portion of the Upper Las Vegas Wash known as the Tule
2 Springs Archaeological Site was the site of significant archaeological and
3 paleontological digs in the 1960s; and

4 WHEREAS, The Upper Las Vegas Wash is world-famous for its abundant and
5 well-preserved fossils of extinct animals dating to the latter part of the ice age; and

6 WHEREAS, The fossils found in the Upper Las Vegas Wash range in age from
7 more than 40,000 years old to 11,000 years old and include remains of extinct
8 mammoths, ground sloths, giant lions, camels and llamas, giant bison and large and

1 small horses, as well as abundant small mammals, birds, reptiles, amphibians and
2 fish; and

3 WHEREAS, Study of these fossils could provide significant educational
4 resources to the people of the State of Nevada; and

5 WHEREAS, The Upper Las Vegas Wash is one of the last remnants of
6 untouched desert immediately adjacent to the City of Las Vegas, and thus is an
7 important natural resource for the State of Nevada; and

8 WHEREAS, The Upper Las Vegas Wash should be preserved to ensure the
9 resource is not lost; and

10 WHEREAS, A ~~state~~ park created in the Upper Las Vegas Wash could become
11 a major attraction for the people of Nevada, bringing national and international
12 tourists to the State in the same way that the La Brea Tar Pits of Los Angeles attract
13 visitors to California; now, therefore,

15 THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
16 SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

18 **Section 1.** ~~[Chapter 407 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
section to read as follows:~~

19 ~~Lot 7, SE 1/4 of the SW 1/4, S 1/2 of the SE 1/4 of section 6; and lot 1, the NE
20 1/4 of the NW 1/4, the N 1/2 of the NE 1/4 of section 7; all in T. 19 S., R. 61 E.,
21 M.D.B. & M., containing 315 acres, more or less, are hereby reserved from sale
22 and are set apart for all time for state park and recreational purposes.] (Deleted
23 by amendment.)~~

25 **Sec. 2.** 1. The Division of State Parks of the State Department of
26 Conservation and Natural Resources, in cooperation with the University of Nevada,
27 Las Vegas, shall conduct or cause to be conducted, a study to consider the
28 feasibility of establishing and developing ~~the park created by section 1 of this act
to contain~~ a park in the area of Clark County, Nevada, known as the Upper
29 Las Vegas Wash. The study must include, without limitation, a consideration
30 of the feasibility of developing a museum and a live dig site that is available for
31 the public to visit.

32 2. The Division may receive and expend money from any public or private
33 institution or person to carry out the provisions of this act.

34 3. The Administrator of the Division of State Parks may appoint an advisory
35 board consisting of recognized paleontologists from within or without the State of
36 Nevada to assist him in carrying out the study required by subsection 1.

38 **Sec. 3.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the
39 Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural
40 Resources the sum of \$50,000 to be used for the study required by section 2 of this
41 act.

42 2. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by subsection 1 must not
43 be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2009, by the entity to which the
44 appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the appropriation is
45 granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated
46 money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after September 18, 2009, by
47 either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the
48 money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State
49 General Fund on or before September 18, 2009.

50 **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
