SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing educational finance. (BDR 34-1371)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No.
Effect on the State: Contains Appropriation not included in

AN ACT relating to education; revising provisions governing the required minimum expenditures of school districts for certain items; **revising the requirements for the biennial budgetary request for the State Distributive School Account; creating the Grant Fund for Incentives for Licensed Educational Personnel;** making appropriations; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires each school district to expend a required minimum amount of money each fiscal year, as determined by the Department of Education, for textbooks, instructional supplies and instructional hardware. (NRS 387.206) **Section 1** of this bill ~~provides that if a school district has purchased all the textbooks, instructional supplies and instructional hardware that it needs for a fiscal year, the school district may purchase library books, including instructional materials for libraries, to satisfy the required minimum expenditure for that fiscal year.~~ **adds library books, software for computers and equipment relating to instruction to the list of required annual expenditures.**

~~[Existing law requires each school district to expend a certain amount of money in each school year for library books and software for computers based upon a 3 year average of those expenditures. (NRS 387.207) Section 2 of this bill provides a definition of "library books" to include instructional materials for libraries.]~~

Existing law requires the board of trustees of each school district to submit to the Superintendent of Public Instruction and to the Department of Taxation a written report of the annual budget of the school district. The Superintendent of Public Instruction is required to compile the reports of the annual budgets and submit the written compilation to the Department of Administration and to the Fiscal Analysis Division of the Legislative Counsel Bureau. (NRS 387.303) Section 3 of this bill requires the Superintendent of Public Instruction to include certain information in the biennial budget request for the State Distributive School Account for submission to the Department of Administration based upon the annual budgets submitted by the school districts.

Section 4 of this bill creates the Grant Fund for Incentives for Licensed Educational Personnel and requires the board of trustees of each school district to establish a program of incentive pay for licensed educational personnel.

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26 Under existing law, the board of trustees of each school district that employs a speech
27 pathologist who is licensed and certified by certain boards and associations is required to add
28 5 percent to the salary of the speech pathologist. (NRS 391.160) ~~Section 5~~ of this bill
29 makes an appropriation to assist the school districts with paying the 5 percent increase.

30 ~~Section 6~~ of this bill makes an appropriation for distribution as grants to school
31 districts that establish a pilot program for programs of alternative education for disruptive
32 pupils.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 387.206 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 387.206 1. On or before July 1 of each year, the Department, in consultation
3 with the Budget Division of the Department of Administration and the Fiscal
4 Analysis Division of the Legislative Counsel Bureau, shall develop or revise, as
5 applicable, a formula for determining the minimum amount of money that each
6 school district is required to expend each fiscal year for textbooks, instructional
7 supplies, ~~and~~ instructional hardware ~~and~~ library books, software for computers
8 and equipment relating to instruction, including, without limitation, equipment
9 for telecommunications. The formula must be used only to develop expenditure
10 requirements and must not be used to alter the ~~distribution of money for~~ basic
11 support ~~to school districts,~~ amount per pupil established by the Legislature for a
12 fiscal year.

13 2. Upon approval of the formula pursuant to subsection 1, the Department
14 shall provide written notice to each school district within the first ~~30~~ 10 days of
15 each fiscal year that sets forth the required minimum combined amount of money
16 that the school district must expend for ~~textbooks, instructional supplies and~~
17 ~~instructional hardware for~~ the purposes set forth in subsection 1 in that fiscal
18 year. ~~If a school district has purchased all the textbooks, instructional supplies~~
19 ~~and instructional hardware that it needs for that fiscal year, the school district~~
20 ~~may expend money for library books to satisfy the required minimum amount of~~
21 ~~money set forth in the notice to the school district.~~

22 3. On or before January 1 of each year, the Department shall determine
23 whether each school district has expended, during the immediately preceding fiscal
24 year, the required minimum amount of money set forth in the notice provided
25 pursuant to subsection 2. In making this determination, the Department shall use the
26 report submitted by the school district pursuant to NRS 387.303.

27 4. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 5, if the Department determines
28 that a school district has not expended the required minimum amount of money set
29 forth in the notice provided pursuant to subsection 2, a reduction must be made
30 from the basic support allocation otherwise payable to that school district in an
31 amount that is equal to the difference between the actual combined expenditure for
32 textbooks, instructional supplies, ~~and~~ instructional hardware, library books,
33 software for computers and equipment relating to instruction, including, without
34 limitation, equipment for telecommunications and the minimum required
35 combined expenditure set forth in the notice provided pursuant to subsection 2. A
36 reduction in the amount of the basic support allocation pursuant to this subsection:

37 (a) Does not reduce the amount that the school district is required to expend on
38 textbooks, instructional supplies, ~~and~~ instructional hardware, library books,
39 software for computers and equipment relating to instruction, including, without
40 limitation, equipment for telecommunications in the current fiscal year; and

1 (b) Must not exceed the amount of basic support that was provided to the
2 school district for the fiscal year in which the minimum expenditure amount was
3 not satisfied.

4 5. If the actual enrollment of pupils in a school district is less than the
5 enrollment included in the projections used in the school district's biennial budget
6 submitted pursuant to NRS 387.303, the required expenditure for textbooks,
7 instructional supplies, ~~and~~ instructional hardware, library books, software for
8 computers and equipment relating to instruction, including, without limitation,
9 equipment for telecommunications pursuant to this section must be reduced
10 proportionately.

11 6. *As used in this section, "library books" includes, without limitation,*
12 *instructional materials for libraries.*

13 **Sec. 2.** NRS 387.207 is hereby amended to read as follows:

14 387.207 1. ~~Except as otherwise provided in this section, in each school~~
15 ~~year a school district shall spend for library books and software for computers an~~
16 ~~amount of money, expressed as an amount per pupil, that is at least equal to the~~
17 ~~average of the total amount of money that was expended per year by the school~~
18 ~~district for those items in the immediately preceding 3 years.~~

19 ~~2. Except as otherwise provided in this section, in each school year a school~~
20 ~~district shall spend for the purchase of equipment relating to instruction, including,~~
21 ~~without limitation, equipment for telecommunications and for the purchase of~~
22 ~~equipment relating to the transportation of pupils, an amount of money, expressed~~
23 ~~as an amount per pupil, that is at least equal to the average of the total amount of~~
24 ~~money that was expended per year by the school district for those items in the~~
25 ~~immediately preceding 3 years.~~

26 ~~3.~~ Except as otherwise provided in this section, in each school year a school
27 district shall spend for the maintenance and repair of equipment, vehicles, ~~and~~
28 buildings and facilities and for the purchase of equipment relating to the
29 transportation of pupils an amount of money, expressed as an amount per pupil,
30 that is at least equal to the average of the total amount of money that was expended
31 per year by the school district for those items in the immediately preceding 3 years,
32 excluding any amount of money derived from the proceeds of bonds.

33 ~~4.~~ 2. A school district may satisfy the expenditures required by ~~subsections~~
34 ~~1, 2 and 3~~ subsection 1 if the school district spends an aggregate amount of money
35 for all the items identified in ~~those subsections~~ that subsection which is at least
36 equal to the average of the total amount of money expended by the school district
37 per year for all those items in the immediately preceding 3 years.

38 ~~5.~~ 3. A school district is not required to satisfy the expenditures required by
39 this section for a school year in which:

40 (a) The total number of pupils who are enrolled in public schools within the
41 school district has declined from the immediately preceding school year; or

42 (b) The total revenue available in the general fund of the school district has
43 declined from the immediately preceding school year.

44 ~~6. As used in this section, "library books" includes, without limitation,~~
45 ~~instructional materials for libraries.~~

46 **Sec. 3.** NRS 387.303 is hereby amended to read as follows:

47 387.303 1. Not later than November 10 of each year, the board of trustees of
48 each school district shall submit to the Superintendent of Public Instruction and the
49 Department of Taxation a report which includes the following information:

50 (a) For each fund within the school district, including, without limitation, the
51 school district's general fund and any special revenue fund which receives state
52 money, the total number and salaries of licensed and nonlicensed persons whose
53 salaries are paid from the fund and who are employed by the school district in full-

1 time positions or in part-time positions added together to represent full-time
2 positions. Information must be provided for the current school year based upon the
3 school district's final budget, including any amendments and augmentations
4 thereto, and for the preceding school year. An employee must be categorized as
5 filling an instructional, administrative, instructional support or other position.

6 (b) The count of pupils computed pursuant to paragraph (a) of subsection 1 of
7 NRS 387.1233.

8 (c) The school district's actual expenditures in the fiscal year immediately
9 preceding the report.

10 (d) The school district's proposed expenditures for the current fiscal year.

11 (e) The schedule of salaries for licensed employees in the current school year
12 and a statement of whether the negotiations regarding salaries for the current school
13 year have been completed. If the negotiations have not been completed at the time
14 the schedule of salaries is submitted, the board of trustees shall submit a
15 supplemental report to the Superintendent of Public Instruction upon completion of
16 negotiations or the determination of an arbitrator concerning the negotiations that
17 includes the schedule of salaries agreed to or required by the arbitrator.

18 (f) The number of teachers who received an increase in salary pursuant to
19 subsection 2 of NRS 391.160 for the current and preceding fiscal years. If the board
20 of trustees is required to pay an increase in salary retroactively pursuant to
21 subsection 2 of NRS 391.160, the board of trustees shall submit a supplemental
22 report to the Superintendent of Public Instruction not later than February 15 of the
23 year in which the retroactive payment was made that includes the number of
24 teachers to whom an increase in salary was paid retroactively.

25 (g) The number of employees eligible for health insurance within the school
26 district for the current and preceding fiscal years and the amount paid for health
27 insurance for each such employee during those years.

28 (h) The rates for fringe benefits, excluding health insurance, paid by the school
29 district for its licensed employees in the preceding and current fiscal years.

30 (i) The amount paid for extra duties, supervision of extracurricular activities
31 and supplemental pay and the number of employees receiving that pay in the
32 preceding and current fiscal years.

33 (j) The expenditures from the account created pursuant to subsection 3 of NRS
34 179.1187. The report must indicate the total amount received by the district in the
35 preceding fiscal year, and the specific amount spent on books and computer
36 hardware and software for each grade level in the district.

37 2. On or before November 25 of each year, the Superintendent of Public
38 Instruction shall submit to the Department of Administration and the Fiscal
39 Analysis Division of the Legislative Counsel Bureau, in a format approved by the
40 Director of the Department of Administration, a compilation of the reports made by
41 each school district pursuant to subsection 1.

42 3. *In preparing the agency biennial budget request for the State Distributive*
43 *School Account for submission to the Department of Administration, the*
44 *Superintendent of Public Instruction shall:*

45 *(a) Compile the information from the most recent report submitted pursuant*
46 *to subsection 2;*

47 *(b) Increase the line items of expenditure or revenue based on merit salary*
48 *increases, cost of living adjustments or inflation, as deemed credible and reliable*
49 *based upon published indexes and research relevant to the specific line item of*
50 *expenditure or revenue;*

51 *(c) Adjust expenditures and revenues pursuant to paragraph (b) for any year*
52 *remaining before the biennium for which the budget is being prepared and for*

1 the 2 years of the biennium covered by the biennial budget request to project the
2 cost of expenditures or the receipt of revenues for the specific line items;

3 (d) Consider the cost of enhancements to existing programs or the projected
4 cost of proposed new educational programs, regardless of whether those
5 enhancements or new programs are included in the per pupil basic support
6 guarantee for inclusion in the biennial budget request to the Department of
7 Administration; and

8 (e) Obtain approval from the State Board for any inflationary increase,
9 enhancement to an existing program or addition of a new program included in
10 the agency biennial budget request.

11 4. The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall, in the compilation required
12 by subsection 2, reconcile the revenues ~~and expenditures~~ of the school districts
13 with the apportionment received by those districts from the State Distributive
14 School Account for the preceding year.

15 5. The request prepared pursuant to subsection 3 must:

16 (a) Be presented by the Superintendent of Public Instruction to such
17 standing committees of the Legislature as the Superintendent determines
18 appropriate for the purpose of developing educational programs and providing
19 appropriations for those programs; and

20 (b) Provide for a direct comparison of appropriations to the proposed budget
21 of the Governor submitted pursuant to subsection 4 of NRS 353.230.

22 Sec. 4. Chapter 391 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
23 section to read as follows:

24 1. There is hereby created a Grant Fund for Incentives for Licensed
25 Educational Personnel to be administered by the Department. The Department
26 may accept gifts and grants from any source for deposit in the Grant Fund.

27 2. The board of trustees of each school district shall establish a program of
28 incentive pay for licensed educational personnel which must be negotiated
29 pursuant to chapter 288 of NRS and must be designed to attract and retain
30 educational personnel. The program may include, without limitation, the
31 attraction and retention of:

32 (a) Teachers who teach in schools with a specified percentage of pupils who
33 are at risk;

34 (b) Teachers who hold an endorsement in the field of mathematics, science,
35 special education, English as a second language or other area of need within the
36 school district; and

37 (c) School psychologists.

38 3. A program of incentive pay established by a school district must specify
39 the type of financial incentives offered to the licensed educational personnel.

40 4. If the board of trustees of a school district wishes to receive a grant of
41 money from the Grant Fund, the board of trustees shall submit to the Department
42 an application on a form prescribed by the Department. The application must
43 include a description of the program of incentive pay established by the school
44 district.

45 5. Within the limits of money available in the Grant Fund, the Department
46 shall provide grants of money to each school district that submits an application
47 pursuant to subsection 4 based upon the amount of money that is necessary to
48 carry out each program. If an insufficient amount of money is available to pay
49 for each program submitted to the Department, the amount of money available
50 must be distributed pro rata based upon the number of licensed employees who
51 are estimated to be eligible to participate in the program in each school district
52 who submitted an application.

1 6. The board of trustees of each school district that receives a grant of
2 money pursuant to this section shall evaluate the effectiveness of the program for
3 which the grant was awarded. The evaluation must include, without limitation,
4 an evaluation of whether the program is effective in recruiting and retaining
5 licensed educational personnel. On or before December 1 of each year, the board
6 of trustees shall submit a report of its evaluation to the:

7 (a) Governor;

8 (b) State Board;

9 (c) If the report is submitted in an even-numbered year, Director of the
10 Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the next regular session of the
11 Legislature; and

12 (d) If the report is submitted in an odd-numbered year, Legislative
13 Committee on Education.

14 ~~[Sec. 3.]~~ **Sec. 5.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General
15 Fund to the Department of Education for a 5-percent increase to the salary of
16 certain speech pathologists:

17 For the Fiscal Year 2007-2008 \$597,268

18 For the Fiscal Year 2008-2009 \$706,444

19 2. The Department shall distribute the money appropriated to the school
20 districts to assist the school districts with paying the 5-percent increase to the salary
21 of certain speech pathologists pursuant to subsection 3 of NRS 391.160. If the
22 money from the appropriation is insufficient to pay the total costs of the increase,
23 the school district shall pay the difference.

24 3. The sums appropriated by subsection 1 are available for either fiscal year.
25 Any remaining balance of those sums must not be committed for expenditure after
26 June 30, 2009, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to
27 which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any
28 manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for
29 any purpose after September 18, 2009, by either the entity to which the money was
30 appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently granted or
31 transferred, and must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before September
32 18, 2009.

33 ~~[Sec. 4.]~~ **Sec. 6.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General
34 Fund to the Department of Education for pilot programs for alternative programs of
35 education for disruptive pupils established pursuant to this section:

36 For the Fiscal Year 2007-2008 \$500,000

37 For the Fiscal Year 2008-2009 \$500,000

38 2. The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall prescribe:

39 (a) The form for an application to establish a pilot program for an alternative
40 program of education for disruptive pupils; and

41 (b) Criteria for the selection of schools to establish such a pilot program.

42 3. A public school in this State may submit an application to the Department
43 to establish a pilot program pursuant to this section. Such an application must
44 include an estimate of the costs of establishing a program. If a school is selected to
45 establish a pilot program, the school will receive a grant of money from the
46 appropriation made by subsection 1 to carry out a program in an amount based
47 upon the estimated costs of establishing the program.

48 4. A pilot program established pursuant to this section must:

49 (a) Comply with NRS 392.4642 to 392.4648, inclusive;

50 (b) Be provided in a setting outside the regular classroom of the pupil;

51 (c) Ensure that pupils who are participating in the program are separated from
52 pupils who are not participating in the program;

1 (d) Provide supervision of and counseling to pupils who participate in the
2 program;

3 (e) Provide and emphasize instruction in English language arts, mathematics,
4 science and history, as appropriate to the grade level of the pupils participating in
5 the program;

6 (f) Provide and emphasize training in self-discipline;

7 (g) Provide for a transitional stage between in-school or in-home suspension
8 and regular school activities; and

9 (h) Include an evaluation phase based on the collection of data to measure the
10 effectiveness of the program.

11 5. A pilot program established pursuant to this section may:

12 (a) Be located on the grounds of the school or at another location.

13 (b) Include programs that:

14 (1) Use innovative instructional, counseling or disciplinary concepts.

15 (2) Encourage the effective involvement of the parents and legal guardians
16 of pupils who are participating in the program.

17 (c) Provide instructional and other services to pupils through the existing staff
18 at a public school or from other personnel, or any combination thereof.

19 6. On or before October 1, 2008, the schools that establish a pilot program
20 pursuant to this section shall submit a report to the Department for the period
21 ending September 1, 2008, that includes:

22 (a) The manner in which the pilot program was carried out;

23 (b) The number of pupils who participated in the program;

24 (c) The expenditures made by the school for the program;

25 (d) The number of disciplinary referrals, suspensions and expulsions that
26 occurred at the school before and after the establishment of the program; and

27 (e) An analysis of the academic achievement and performance of the pupils
28 before and after the pupils participated in the program.

29 7. The Department shall evaluate the effectiveness of the pilot programs
30 established pursuant to this section based on the reports submitted by the schools
31 pursuant to subsection 6. In addition, the Department shall solicit and analyze data
32 from schools that did not establish pilot programs pursuant to this section but have
33 established alternative programs of education for disruptive pupils. The Department
34 may spend not more than \$10,000 of the amount appropriated by subsection 1
35 during the Fiscal Years 2007-2009 to hire a contractor to assist with the evaluation.

36 8. On or before December 1, 2008, the Department shall submit a report of its
37 findings to the Legislative Committee on Education.

38 9. On or before February 1, 2009, the Department shall submit a final report
39 of its findings to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmission to
40 the 75th Session of the Nevada Legislature.

41 10. The sums appropriated by subsection 1 are available for either fiscal year.
42 Any remaining balance of those sums must not be committed for expenditure after
43 June 30, 2009, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to
44 which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any
45 manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for
46 any purpose after September 18, 2009, by either the entity to which the money was
47 appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently granted or
48 transferred, and must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before September
49 18, 2009.

50 ~~[Sec. 5.]~~ **Sec. 7.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
