SUMMARY—~~[Provides for the suspension or revocation of a contractor's license]~~
Revises the administrative penalties that may be imposed against contractors for certain offenses. (BDR 54-880)

AN ACT relating to contractors; ~~[providing for the suspension or revocation of the license of]~~ revising the administrative penalties that may be imposed against a contractor who knowingly enters into a contract with an unlicensed contractor ; ~~[or bids to contract or enters into a contract with a contractor in excess of that contractor's limit or beyond the scope of that contractor's license.]~~ and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law provides that a contractor who ~~[commits certain acts, including knowingly entering]~~ knowingly enters into a contract with an unlicensed contractor ~~[or bidding to contract or entering into a contract with a contractor in excess of that contractor's limit or beyond the scope of that contractor's license.]~~ may be punished by the imposition of ~~[a fine, the suspension or refusal to renew his license, or the taking of other disciplinary action.]~~ an administrative fine of not more than \$50,000. (NRS 624.300, 624.3015) This bill ~~[provides that]~~ revises the administrative penalties that may be imposed against a contractor who enters into such a contract ~~[, or bids to do so, shall be punished by the suspension of his license for 6 months for a first offence and for 1 year for a second offense and by the revocation of his license for a third offence.]~~ by requiring the imposition of an administrative fine and providing for the suspension or revocation of his license.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 624.300 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 624.300 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsections 3 and 4, ~~1, 4 and~~
3 ~~5,~~ the Board may:
4 (a) Suspend or revoke licenses already issued;
5 (b) Refuse renewals of licenses;
6 (c) Impose limits on the field, scope and monetary limit of the license;
7 (d) Impose an administrative fine of not more than \$10,000;

1 (e) Order a licensee to repay to the account established pursuant to NRS
2 624.470, any amount paid out of the account pursuant to NRS 624.510 as a result of
3 an act or omission of that licensee;

4 (f) Order the licensee to take action to correct a condition resulting from an act
5 which constitutes a cause for disciplinary action, at the licensee's cost, that may
6 consist of requiring the licensee to:

7 (1) Perform the corrective work himself;

8 (2) Hire and pay another licensee to perform the corrective work; or

9 (3) Pay to the owner of the construction project a specified sum to correct
10 the condition; or

11 (g) Issue a public reprimand or take other less severe disciplinary action,
12 including, without limitation, increasing the amount of the surety bond or cash
13 deposit of the licensee,

14 → if the licensee commits any act which constitutes a cause for disciplinary action.

15 2. If the Board suspends or revokes the license of a contractor for failure to
16 establish financial responsibility, the Board may, in addition to any other conditions
17 for reinstating or renewing the license, require that each contract undertaken by the
18 licensee for a period to be designated by the Board, not to exceed 12 months, be
19 separately covered by a bond or bonds approved by the Board and conditioned
20 upon the performance of and the payment of labor and materials required by the
21 contract.

22 3. If a licensee violates ~~the~~:

23 (a) The provisions of NRS 624.3014, subsection 2 or 3 of NRS 624.3015,
24 subsection 1 of NRS 624.302 or subsection 1 of NRS 624.305, the Board may
25 impose for each violation an administrative fine in an amount that is not more than
26 \$50,000.

27 (b) The provisions of subsection 4 of NRS 624.3015:

28 (1) For a first offense, the Board shall impose an administrative fine of
29 not less than \$1,000 and not more than \$50,000, and may suspend the license of
30 the licensee for 6 months;

31 (2) For a second offense, the Board shall impose an administrative fine
32 of not less than \$5,000 and not more than \$50,000, and shall suspend the license
33 of the licensee for 1 year; and

34 (3) For a third or subsequent offense, the Board shall impose an
35 administrative fine of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$50,000, and shall
36 revoke the license of the licensee.

37 4. The Board shall, by regulation, establish standards for use by the Board in
38 determining the amount of an administrative fine imposed pursuant to ~~this~~
39 ~~subsection~~ ~~subsection 3.~~ The standards must include, without limitation,
40 provisions requiring the Board to consider:

41 (a) The gravity of the violation;

42 (b) The good faith of the licensee; and

43 (c) Any history of previous violations of the provisions of this chapter
44 committed by the licensee.

45 ~~5.~~ 5. If a licensee is prohibited from being awarded a contract for a public
46 work pursuant to NRS 338.017, the Board may suspend the license of the licensee
47 for the period of the prohibition.

48 ~~6.~~ 6. If a licensee commits a fraudulent act which is a cause for disciplinary
49 action under NRS 624.3016, the correction of any condition resulting from the act
50 does not preclude the Board from taking disciplinary action.

51 ~~6. If a licensee violates the provisions of subsection 3 of NRS 624.3015, the~~
52 ~~Board shall~~

53 (a) For a first offense, suspend the license of the licensee for 6 months;

~~1 (b) For a second offense, suspend the license of the licensee for 1 year; and
2 (c) For a third offense, revoke the license of the licensee.]~~

3 7. If the Board finds that a licensee has engaged in repeated acts that would be
4 cause for disciplinary action, the correction of any resulting conditions does not
5 preclude the Board from taking disciplinary action pursuant to this section.

6 7.4 8. The expiration of a license by operation of law or by order or decision
7 of the Board or a court, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee, does
8 not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with any investigation of, or action
9 or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending
10 or revoking the license.

11 8.4 9. The Board shall not issue a private reprimand to a licensee.

12 8.9 10. An order that imposes discipline and the findings of fact and
13 conclusions of law supporting that order are public records.

14 8.10 11. An administrative fine imposed pursuant to this section, NRS
15 624.341 or 624.710 plus interest at a rate that is equal to the prime rate at the largest
16 bank in this State, as determined by the Commissioner of Financial Institutions on
17 January 1 or July 1, as appropriate, immediately preceding the date of the order
18 imposing the administrative fine, plus 4 percent, must be paid to the Board before
19 the issuance or renewal of a license to engage in the business of contracting in this
20 State. The interest must be collected from the date of the order until the date the
21 administrative fine is paid.

22 8.11 12. All fines and interest collected pursuant to this section must be
23 deposited with the State Treasurer for credit to the Construction Education Account
24 created pursuant to NRS 624.580.

25 Sec. 2. **NRS 624.3015 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

26 624.3015 The following acts, among others, constitute cause for disciplinary
27 action under NRS 624.300:

28 1. Acting in the capacity of a contractor beyond the scope of the license.

29 2. Bidding to contract or contracting for a sum for one construction contract
30 or project in excess of the limit placed on the license by the Board.

31 3. **Bidding to contract or entering into a contract with a contractor for work
32 in excess of his limit or beyond the scope of his license.**

33 4. Knowingly entering into a contract with a contractor while that contractor
34 is not licensed.~~1, or bidding to contract or entering into a contract with a contractor
35 for work in excess of his limit or beyond the scope of his license.~~

36 4.4 5. Constructing or repairing a mobile home, manufactured home or
37 commercial coach, unless the contractor:

38 (a) Is licensed pursuant to NRS 489.311; or

39 (b) Owns, leases or rents the mobile home, manufactured home or commercial
40 coach.

41 4.5 6. Engaging in any work or activities that require a contractor's license
42 while the license is placed on inactive status pursuant to NRS 624.282.
