AN ACT relating to traffic laws; revising provisions governing the stopping, standing or parking of a vehicle near a crosswalk; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

This bill expands the prohibition in existing law from stopping, standing or parking a vehicle within 20 feet of a crosswalk that is located at an intersection by prohibiting such activity at any crosswalk, regardless of location. (NRS 484.399)

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 484.399 is hereby amended to read as follows:

484.399 1. A person shall not stop, stand or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with law or the directions of a police officer or official traffic-control device, in any of the following places:

(a) On a sidewalk;

(b) In front of a public or private driveway;

(c) Within an intersection;

(d) Within 15 feet of a fire hydrant in a place where parallel parking is permitted, or within 20 feet of a fire hydrant if angle parking is permitted and a local ordinance requires the greater distance;

(e) ***On a crosswalk;***

~~(f) Within 20 feet of a crosswalk ; ~~at an intersection;~~~~

~~(g) ~~+~~~~

~~(f) Within 30 feet upon the approach to any official traffic-control signal located at the side of a highway;~~

~~(h) ~~+~~~~ Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within 30 feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone;

~~(i) ~~+~~~~ Within 50 feet of the nearest rail of a railroad;

1 (j) ~~[(j)]~~ Within 20 feet of a driveway entrance to any fire station and, on the
2 side of a highway opposite the entrance to any fire station, within 75 feet of that
3 entrance;

4 (k) ~~[(k)]~~ Alongside or opposite any highway excavation or obstruction when
5 stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic;

6 (l) ~~[(l)]~~ On the highway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge of
7 or curb of a highway;

8 (m) ~~[(m)]~~ Upon any bridge or other elevated structure or within a highway
9 tunnel;

10 (n) ~~[(n)]~~ Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, within 5 feet of a
11 public or private driveway; and

12 (o) ~~[(o)]~~ At any place where official traffic-control devices prohibit stopping,
13 standing or parking.

14 2. The provisions of paragraph (n) ~~[(n)]~~ of subsection 1 do not apply to a
15 person operating a vehicle of the United States Postal Service if the vehicle is being
16 operated for the official business of the United States Postal Service.

17 3. A person shall not move a vehicle not owned by him into any prohibited
18 area or away from a curb to a distance which is unlawful.

19 4. A local authority may place official traffic-control devices prohibiting or
20 restricting the stopping, standing or parking of vehicles on any highway where in its
21 opinion stopping, standing or parking is dangerous to those using the highway or
22 where the vehicles which are stopping, standing or parking would unduly interfere
23 with the free movement of traffic. It is unlawful for any person to stop, stand or
24 park any vehicle in violation of the restrictions stated on those devices.
