AN ACT relating to crimes; prohibiting a person from engaging in certain acts to cause the results of a test for genetic identification which is given to determine paternity to be inaccurate; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

1           **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

2           This bill creates the crime of paternity fraud, making it a misdemeanor to engage in  
3           certain acts which are intended to make the results of a test given for genetic identification to  
determine the paternity of a child to be inaccurate.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1           **Section 1.** Chapter 201 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new  
2           section to read as follows:

3           ***1. A person is guilty of paternity fraud if he:***  
4           ***(a) Is ordered by a court to submit, or agrees to submit, to a test for genetic***  
5           ***identification to determine the paternity of a child and [he] knowingly assists,***  
6           ***aids, abets, solicits or conspires with another person to have [any person]***  
7           ***someone other than himself submit to the test [on his behalf] for the purpose of***  
8           ***[rendering the results of the test inaccurate,] preventing a determination that he***  
9           ***is the father of the child; or***

10           ***(b) Submits [on behalf of another person,] to a test for genetic identification***  
11           ***to determine the paternity of a child [in place of the person who has been ordered***  
12           ***to submit, or who has agreed to submit, to a test for genetic identification to***  
13           ***determine the paternity of a child for the purpose of [rendering the results of the***

1      ~~test inaccurate]~~ preventing a determination that the person for whom he is  
2      taking the test is the father of the child.

3      2. A person who violates this section is guilty of a misdemeanor.
