SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to ~~the expenditure of~~ money received from the Federal Government to prevent or respond to acts of terrorism. (BDR 31-224)

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AN ACT relating to public financial administration; revising provisions relating to ~~the expenditure of~~ money received from the Federal Government to prevent or respond to acts of terrorism; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Under existing law, the Nevada Commission on Homeland Security is entrusted with various duties designed to protect residents of this State and visitors to this State from acts of terrorism and related emergencies. (NRS 239C.030, 239C.120, 239C.160) **Sections 1 and 2** of this bill require that agencies and other entities within the Executive Branch of State Government other than the Nevada National Guard ~~apply to and obtain the written approval of~~ enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Nevada Commission on Homeland Security pursuant to which the agency agrees to make certain periodic reports to the Commission, before ~~making expenditures of money received from~~ the agency requests money from the Federal Government for projects or programs to prevent or respond to acts of terrorism.

Under existing law, if the State or a city or county is approved to receive money from any public or private source to pay for projects or programs to prevent or respond to acts of terrorism, the State or the city or county, as applicable, is required to submit to the Nevada Commission on Homeland Security a written report detailing the amount of money that will be received and the purposes for which it will be used. (NRS 239C.070, 239C.300) **Section 3** of this bill requires a local government that receives money directly from the Federal Government to pay for projects or programs to prevent or respond to acts of terrorism, to submit to the Commission a written report setting forth the amount of money that the local government received directly from the Federal Government and a general description of the purposes for which it was spent ~~and quarterly reports detailing expenditures~~. (NRS 239C.300) In addition to cities and counties, this reporting requirement applies to local

22 governments such as towns, school districts and general improvement districts. (NRS  
23 239C.070, 239C.300, 354.474)

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1      **Section 1.** Chapter 353 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new  
2 section to read as follows:

3      1. ~~Before a department, institution or agency of the Executive  
4 Department of the State Government other than the Nevada National Guard  
5 receives from~~ submits to the Federal Government ~~a request for money in the  
6 form of a grant, loan or appropriation, or in any other form,~~ ~~the department,~~  
7 ~~institution or agency must, before it expends such money~~ to pay for a project or  
8 program relating to the prevention of, detection of, mitigation of, preparedness  
9 for, response to or recovery from acts of terrorism, ~~apply to and receive written  
10 approval for the expenditure from~~ the department, institution or agency must  
11 enter into a written memorandum of understanding with the Nevada Commission  
12 on Homeland Security pursuant to ~~subsection 7 of NRS 239C.160,~~ which the  
13 department, institution or agency agrees to report to the Commission on a  
14 quarterly basis:

15      (a) Regarding the status of the request; and

16      (b) In accordance with subsection 1 of NRS 239C.300, if the request is  
17 approved and the department, institution or agency receives money in connection  
18 with the request.

19      2. The provisions of subsection 1 must not be applied in any manner which  
20 would result in a loss of money for a project or program relating to the  
21 prevention of detection of, mitigation of, preparedness for, response to or  
22 recovery from acts of terrorism.

23      3. As used in this section, "act of terrorism" has the meaning ascribed to it  
24 in NRS 239C.030.

25      **Sec. 2.** NRS 239C.160 is hereby amended to read as follows:

26      239C.160 The Commission shall, within the limits of available money:

27      1. Make recommendations to the Governor, the Legislature, agencies of this  
28 State, political subdivisions, businesses located within this State and private persons  
29 who reside in this State with respect to actions and measures that may be taken to  
30 protect residents of this State and visitors to this State from potential acts of  
31 terrorism and related emergencies.

32      2. Propose goals and programs that may be set and carried out, respectively,  
33 to counteract or prevent potential acts of terrorism and related emergencies before  
34 such acts of terrorism and related emergencies can harm or otherwise threaten  
35 residents of this State and visitors to this State.

36      3. With respect to buildings, facilities, geographic features and infrastructure  
37 that must be protected from acts of terrorism and related emergencies to ensure the  
38 safety of the residents of this State and visitors to this State, including, without  
39 limitation, airports other than international airports, the Capitol Complex, dams,  
40 gaming establishments, governmental buildings, highways, hotels, information  
41 technology infrastructure, lakes, places of worship, power lines, public buildings,  
42 public utilities, reservoirs, rivers and their tributaries, and water facilities:

43      (a) Identify and categorize such buildings, facilities, geographic features and  
44 infrastructure according to their susceptibility to and need for protection from acts  
45 of terrorism and related emergencies; and

1                         (b) Study and assess the security of such buildings, facilities, geographic  
2 features and infrastructure from acts of terrorism and related emergencies.

3                         4. Examine the use, deployment and coordination of response agencies within  
4 this State to ensure that those agencies are adequately prepared to protect residents  
5 of this State and visitors to this State from acts of terrorism and related  
6 emergencies.

7                         5. Assess, examine and review the use of information systems and systems of  
8 communication used by response agencies within this State to determine the degree  
9 to which such systems are compatible and interoperable. After conducting the  
10 assessment, examination and review, the Commission shall:

11                         (a) Establish a state plan setting forth criteria and standards for the  
12 compatibility and interoperability of those systems when used by response agencies  
13 within this State; and

14                         (b) Advise and make recommendations to the Governor relative to the  
15 compatibility and interoperability of those systems when used by response agencies  
16 within this State, with particular emphasis upon the compatibility and  
17 interoperability of public safety radio systems.

18                         6. Assess, examine and review the operation and efficacy of telephone  
19 systems and related systems used to provide emergency 911 service.

20                         7. ~~Review and, within 90 business days after the date of receipt, approve or  
21 deny in writing an application received pursuant to section 1 of this act. The  
22 Commission shall, in consultation with the Division, adopt regulations  
23 establishing criteria for determining whether to approve or deny an application  
24 received pursuant to section 1 of this act. The provisions of this subsection must  
25 not be applied in any manner which would result in a loss of money for a project  
26 or program relating to the prevention of, detection of, mitigation of, preparedness  
27 for, response to or recovery from acts of terrorism.] Enter into written  
28 memoranda of understanding with departments, institutions and agencies of the  
29 Executive Department of the State Government other than the Nevada National  
30 Guard to carry out the provisions of section 1 of this act.~~

31                         8. To the extent practicable, cooperate and coordinate with the Division to  
32 avoid duplication of effort in developing policies and programs for preventing and  
33 responding to acts of terrorism and related emergencies.

34                         ~~8.~~ 9. Perform any other acts related to their duties set forth in subsections 1  
35 to ~~1~~ 8, inclusive, that the Commission determines are necessary to protect or  
36 enhance:

- 37                         (a) The safety and security of the State of Nevada;  
38                         (b) The safety of residents of the State of Nevada; and  
39                         (c) The safety of visitors to the State of Nevada.

40                         **Sec. 3.** NRS 239C.300 is hereby amended to read as follows:

41                         239C.300 1. If the State or a political subdivision submits an application to  
42 and is approved to receive money from the Federal Government, this State, any  
43 other state, a local government, any agency or instrumentality of those  
44 governmental entities, or any private entity, to pay for a project or program relating  
45 to the prevention of, detection of, mitigation of, preparedness for, response to ~~and~~  
46 ~~or~~ recovery from acts of terrorism, the State or political subdivision shall, not later  
47 than 60 days after receiving such approval, submit to the Commission a written  
48 report that includes, without limitation:

49                         (a) The total amount of money that the State or political subdivision has been  
50 approved to receive for the project or program;

51                         (b) A description of the project or program, unless the State or political  
52 subdivision previously submitted a written report pursuant to this section relating to  
53 the same project or program; and

1                   (c) The items to be paid for with the money that the State or political  
2 subdivision has been approved to receive for the project or program.

3                   **After submission of this report, the State or political subdivision shall, on a**  
4                   **quarterly basis, submit to the Commission a written report detailing the**  
5                   **expenditures of the money until all the money has been expended.**

6                   2. *In addition to the reporting requirements of subsection 1, if a local*  
7                   *government receives directly from the Federal Government money in the form of*  
8                   *a grant, loan or appropriation, or in any other form, to pay for a project or*  
9                   *program relating to the prevention of, detection of, mitigation of, preparedness*  
10                  *for, response to or recovery from acts of terrorism, the local government shall*  
11                  *submit to the Commission a written report that includes, without limitation:*

12                  (a) *The total amount of money that the local government received directly*  
13                  *from the Federal Government for the project or program; and*

14                  (b) *A general description of the project or program for which the money*  
15                  *received directly from the Federal Government was expended.*

16                  **• The Commission shall adopt such regulations as are necessary to carry out the**  
17                  **provisions of this subsection. The regulations so adopted must include, without**  
18                  **limitation, the time within which and the frequency with which a local**  
19                  **government must submit the reports described in this subsection. The regulations**  
20                  **so adopted must not require a local government to submit the reports described in**  
21                  **this subsection more frequently than once each year quarter.**

22                  3. A project or program for which the State or a [political subdivision] local  
23                  governor is required to report the receipt of money pursuant to subsection 1 or 2  
24                  includes, without limitation, a project or program related to:

25                  (a) Homeland security;  
26                  (b) Emergency management;  
27                  (c) Health or hospitals;  
28                  (d) Emergency medical services; and  
29                  (e) Chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, explosive, agricultural or  
30                  environmental acts of terrorism.

31                  **• 4.** Any grant related to terrorism that is administered by the Division and  
32                  is provided to a political subdivision must be approved by the local emergency  
33                  planning committee.

34                  5. *As used in this section, "local government" has the meaning ascribed to*  
35                  *it in NRS 354.474. The term includes a political subdivision.*

36                  Sec. 4. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
