AN ACT relating to education; creating the Nevada Youth Legislative Issues Forum; prescribing the membership, powers and duties of the Forum; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Sections 3-5 of this bill create the Nevada Youth Legislative Issues Forum, consisting of
2 21 members who are enrolled in grades 9-12 in public schools or otherwise eligible for
3 enrollment in public schools but enrolled in a homeschooled or private school. Each Senator
4 appoints a member to the Forum. Sections 6-10 of this bill set forth the powers and duties of
5 the Forum. The Forum must hold at least two public hearings each school year, review issues
6 of importance to the youth in this State and submit an annual report of the activities of the
7 Forum. In addition, the Forum may, within the limits of available money, hold meetings
8 during a regular session of the Legislature to advise the Legislature on proposed legislation
9 concerning the youth in this State. The Forum may also conduct seminars for the benefit of its
10 members relating to leadership, government and the legislative process. Finally, the Forum
11 may submit **[request]** a request for the drafting of **[three]** one legislative **[measure]**
12 **measure** which **[related]** relates to matters within the scope of the Forum.

1 WHEREAS, The United States is facing a population of youth that is disengaged
2 and lacks the necessary knowledge, skills and dispositions to participate in and
3 carry out civic duties; and

4 WHEREAS, In the 2004 presidential election, 53.1 percent of Nevadans over 25
5 years of age voted, compared with 38.4 percent among Nevadans 18 to 24 years of
6 age; and

7 WHEREAS, The lack of voter turnout for citizens who are 18 to 24 years of age
8 is often attributed to cynicism toward the political process, disillusionment with
9 politics, voter apathy and a lack of acknowledgment by the media and politicians of
10 issues involving youth; and

1 WHEREAS, Most governmental services are designed with input and
2 participation from the people being served; however, young people under the age of
3 18 are not allowed to vote and are often left out of the democratic process; and

4 WHEREAS, Several issues are important to the youth in the nation as well as the
5 youth in this State, including, without limitation, education, employment
6 opportunities, participation in state and local government, a safe environment, the
7 prevention of substance abuse, emotional and physical well-being, foster care and
8 access to state and local services; and

9 WHEREAS, Research shows that the programs designed for youth which are
10 most effective at promoting positive outcomes are framed in terms of the
11 constructive assets the programs seek to build rather than the negative behaviors the
12 programs seek to avoid; and

13 WHEREAS, There is a growing need to reverse the trend of apathy by engaging
14 our youth directly with policymakers in a manner that will provide genuine
15 opportunities for our youth to acquire civic knowledge and develop the skills
16 necessary to participate fully in a democratic society; and

17 WHEREAS, Within the past 5 years, Maine, New Mexico, Washington and New
18 Hampshire have enacted bills that create a Youth Issues Forum, which
19 institutionalizes the participation of youth in the policy-making process in those
20 states; and

21 WHEREAS, The creation of a Youth Issues Forum offers policymakers an
22 opportunity to learn from youth as well as provides a meaningful opportunity for
23 youth to learn about the policy-making process; and

24 WHEREAS, By providing an avenue for participation, this State will provide our
25 youth with an opportunity to understand the ideals of citizenship and to acquire the
26 knowledge and skills necessary to participate in effective government and
27 appreciate the value of American democracy; now, therefore,

28 THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
29 SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

30 **Section 1.** Chapter 385 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the
31 provisions set forth as sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this act.

32 **Sec. 2. *As used in sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this act, "Forum" means the***
33 ***Nevada Youth Legislative Issues Forum created by section 3 of this act.***

34 **Sec. 3. 1. *The Nevada Youth Legislative Issues Forum is hereby created,***
35 ***consisting of 21 members.***

36 **2. *Each member of the Senate shall appoint a person who submits an***
37 ***application and meets the qualifications for appointment set forth in section 4 of***
38 ***this act.***

39 **3. *After the initial terms:***

40 **(a) *Appointments to the Forum must be made by each member of the Senate***
41 ***before June 30 of each year.***

42 **(b) *The term of each member of the Forum begins July 1 of the year of***
43 ***appointment.***

44 **4. *Each member of the Forum serves a term of 1 year and may be***
45 ***reappointed if the member continues to meet the qualifications for appointment***
46 ***set forth in section 4 of this act.***

47 **Sec. 4. 1. *To be eligible for appointment to the Forum, a person must be a***
48 ***resident of the senatorial district of the Senator who appoints him and must be:***

49 **H. (a) *Enrolled in a public school in this State in grade 9, 10, 11 or 12 for***
50 ***the school year in which he serves; or***

1 **(b) Exempt from compulsory attendance pursuant to NRS 392.070, but**
2 **otherwise eligible to enroll in a public school in this State in grade 9, 10, 11 or 12**
3 **for the school year in which he serves.**

4 2. A person who is eligible for appointment to the Forum may submit an
5 application on the form prescribed pursuant to subsection 3 to the Senator of the
6 senatorial district in which the person resides for appointment or reappointment
7 to the Forum.

8 3. The Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau shall prescribe a form
9 for applications submitted pursuant to this section, which must require the
10 signature of the principal of the school in which the applicant is enrolled or, if
11 the applicant is exempt from compulsory attendance pursuant to NRS 392.070,
12 the signature of a member of the community in which the applicant resides other
13 than a relative of the applicant.

14 Sec. 5. 1. A position on the Forum becomes vacant upon:

15 (a) The death or resignation of a member.

16 (b) The absence of a member for any reason from two consecutive meetings
17 of the Forum, unless excused by the Chairman of the Forum.

18 (c) A change of residency of a member which renders that member ineligible
19 under his original appointment.

20 2. A vacancy on the Forum must be filled for the remainder of the
21 unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

22 Sec. 6. 1. The Forum shall elect from among its members, to serve a term
23 of 1 year beginning on July 1 of each year:

24 (a) A Chairman, who shall conduct the meetings and oversee the formation
25 of committees as necessary to accomplish the business of the Forum. The
26 Chairman must be:

27 (1) Enrolled in a public school in this State in grade 9, 10 or 11 for the
28 school year in which he serves; or

29 (2) Exempt from compulsory attendance pursuant to NRS 392.070, but
30 otherwise eligible to enroll in a public school in this State in grade 9, 10 or 11 for
31 the school year in which he serves.

32 (b) A Vice Chairman, who shall assist the Chairman and conduct the
33 meetings of the Forum if the Chairman is absent or otherwise unable to perform
34 his duties.

35 2. The Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau:

36 (a) Shall provide administrative support to the Forum.

37 (b) Shall, in the event of a vacancy on the Forum, notify the appropriate
38 appointing authority of such vacancy.

39 (c) May accept gifts, grants and donations from any source for the support of
40 the Forum in carrying out the provisions of sections 2 to 9, inclusive, of this act.

41 Sec. 7. 1. The Forum shall:

42 (a) Hold at least two public hearings in this State each school year.

43 (b) Simultaneously teleconference or videoconference each public hearing to
44 three or more prominent locations throughout this State.

45 (c) Evaluate, review and comment upon issues of importance to the youth in
46 this State, including, without limitation:

47 (1) Education;

48 (2) Employment opportunities;

49 (3) Participation of youth in state and local government;

50 (4) A safe learning environment;

51 (5) The prevention of substance abuse;

52 (6) Emotional and physical well-being;

53 (7) Foster care; and

1 (8) *Access to state and local services.*

2 (d) *Conduct a public awareness campaign to raise awareness about the
3 Forum and to enhance outreach to the youth in this State.*

4 2. *The Forum may, within the limits of available money:*

5 (a) *During the period in which the Legislature is in a regular session, meet
6 as often as necessary to conduct the business of the Forum and to advise the
7 Legislature on proposed legislation relating to the youth in this State.*

8 (b) *Form committees, which may meet as often as necessary to assist with the
9 business of the Forum.*

10 (c) *Conduct periodic seminars for its members regarding leadership,
11 government and the legislative process.*

12 3. *The Forum and its committees shall comply with the provisions of
13 chapter 241 of NRS.*

14 4. *On or before June 30 of each year, the Forum shall submit a written
15 report to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau and to the Governor
16 describing the activities of the Forum during the immediately preceding school
17 year and any recommendations for legislation. The Director shall transmit the
18 written report to the Legislative Committee on Education and to the next regular
19 session of the Legislature.*

20 Sec. 8. *The Forum may:*

21 1. *Request the drafting of not more than [three] one legislative [measures]
22 measure which [relate] relates to matters within the scope of the Forum. [Each]
23 A request must be submitted to the Legislative Counsel on or before July 1
24 preceding the commencement of a regular session of the Legislature unless the
25 Legislative Commission authorizes submitting a request after that date.*

26 2. *Adopt procedures to conduct meetings of the Forum and any committees
27 thereof. Those procedures may be changed upon approval of a majority vote of
28 all members of the Forum who are present and voting.*

29 3. *Advise the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau regarding the
30 administration of any appropriations, gifts, grants or donations received for the
31 support of the Forum.*

32 Sec. 9. *The members of the Forum serve without compensation. To the
33 extent that money is available, including, without limitation, money from gifts,
34 grants and donations, the members of the Forum may receive the per diem
35 allowance and travel expenses provided for state officers and employees generally
36 for attending a meeting of the Forum or a seminar conducted by the Forum.*

37 Sec. 10. 1. Each Senator shall appoint a member to the Nevada Youth
38 Legislative Issues Forum created by section 3 of this act to an initial term
39 commencing on August 1, 2007, and expiring on June 30, 2008. **For the purpose
40 of making an appointment to an initial term pursuant to this subsection, a
41 Senator may appoint a person who did not submit an application pursuant to
42 section 4 of this act.**

43 2. The Forum shall hold its first meeting not later than October 1, 2007. At
44 the first meeting of the Forum, the members of the Forum shall elect a Chairman
45 and a Vice Chairman who hold those positions until June 30, 2008.

46 3. After the initial terms of office, sections 3 and 6 of this act govern the
47 terms of office of the members of the Forum.

48 Sec. 11. 1. This section and section 10 of this act become effective upon
49 passage and approval.

50 2. Sections 3 and 4 of this act become effective upon passage and approval
51 for the purpose of appointing members to the Nevada Youth Legislative Issues
52 Forum and on July 1, 2007, for all other purposes.

1 3. Sections 1, 2 and 5 to 9, inclusive, of this act become effective on July 1,
2 2007.
