SUMMARY—~~Revises the requirements concerning eligibility to participate in the Public Employees' Retirement System as a police officer under certain early retirement provisions;]~~ Makes an appropriation to the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to enroll rangers in the Police and Firefighters' Retirement Fund. AN ACT ~~relating to public employees' retirement; revising the requirements concerning eligibility to participate in the Public Employees' Retirement System as a police officer under certain early retirement provisions;]~~ making an appropriation ~~to~~ to the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources for enrollment of rangers in the Police and Firefighters' Retirement Fund; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Under existing law, certain members of the Public Employees' Retirement System are eligible to retire earlier than other members of the System if they hold a full time position with a public employer that participates in the System, the principal duties of which require emotional stability and physical capacity in protecting the public and, as applicable, enforcing state and local laws or controlling and extinguishing fires, or they were promoted or transferred from such a position by the same or a different public employer to a position related to those same principal duties. (NRS 286.042, 286.061, 286.510) Using these criteria, the Public Employees' Retirement Board, which is the governing authority of the System, is required, with the advice of the Interim Retirement and Benefits Committee of the Legislature, to determine which positions are eligible under the early retirement provisions for police officers and firefighters. (NRS 286.211)

Section 1 of this bill revises the definition of "police officer" for purposes of the early retirement provisions as, with certain exceptions, any member of the System in a full time position with a public employer pursuant to which the person has some or all of the powers of a peace officer. Because persons who have the powers of peace officers are prescribed by or pursuant to state law, section 1 effectively removes the authority of the Public Employees' Retirement Board to determine which law enforcement positions are eligible under the early

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Delete existing sections 1 through 6 of this bill and replace with the following
2 new sections 1 and 2:

3 *Section 1.* 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General
4 Fund to the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation
5 and Natural Resources for the additional costs associated with the enrollment
6 of rangers of the Division in the Police and Firefighters' Retirement Fund
7 established by NRS 286.225:

8 For Fiscal Year 2007-2008 \$103,000

9 For Fiscal Year 2008-2009 \$108,000

10 2. Any balance of the sums appropriated by subsection 1 remaining at
11 the end of the respective fiscal years must not be committed for expenditure
12 after June 30 of the respective fiscal years by the entity to which the
13 appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the appropriation is
14 granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the
15 appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after
16 September 19, 2008, and September 18, 2009, respectively, by either the entity
17 to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the money was
18 subsequently granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State
19 General Fund on or before September 19, 2008, and September 18, 2009,
20 respectively.

21 *Sec. 2.* This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
