AN ACT relating to governmental administration; designating English as the official language of the State of Nevada; requiring certain proceedings ***[§ and]*** records ***[and publications]*** of this State to be in English; ***[prohibiting certain employment discrimination by governmental officers and agencies; requiring state agencies to record certain expenditures made to provide services in a language other than English.]*** and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 **Section 1** of this bill designates English as the official language of the State of Nevada
2 and, with limited exceptions, requires that all official proceedings of the State be conducted in
3 English ***[§ and]*** requires all official records of the State to be prepared, stored and made
4 available in English . ***[, and requires all official publications of the State to be printed in***
5 ***English.]***

6 Existing law prohibits employment discrimination by state and local governmental
7 officers and agencies based on race, creed, color, national origin, sex, sexual orientation, age,
8 political affiliation or disability except when based on a bona fide occupational qualification.
9 (***NRS 281.370***) Section 2 of this bill adds to this list of prohibited bases of employment
10 discrimination the inability of a person to converse in a language other than English.
11 ***Section 3 of this bill requires state agencies to record expenditures made to provide***
12 ***services in languages other than English.]***

1 **WHEREAS, English is the common language of the people of the United**
2 **States of America and the State of Nevada and should be preserved, protected**
3 **and strengthened; and**

WHEREAS, English is the most widely used language in the areas of finance, trade, technology, diplomacy and entertainment, and is the living library of the last 100 years of scientific and technological advances; and

WHEREAS, There are more persons who speak English as a second language in the world than there are native speakers of English, and the numerous schools that teach English around the world demonstrate that English is soon to become the prevalent language used throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, It is universally accepted that a common language promotes unity and fosters better communication; and

WHEREAS, Knowledge of the different languages existing in today's world enhances competitiveness and growth in world trade and promotes economic expansion; and

WHEREAS, A skilled labor force is crucial to the competitiveness of the State of Nevada in today's national and global economy, and a knowledge of both English and foreign languages enhances communication and diplomatic efforts by fostering greater communication and understanding between nations and can promote a greater understanding between different ethnic and racial groups within the United States; now, therefore,

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Chapter 235 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

1. The Legislature hereby:

(a) ***Pledges that it:***

(1) Will not enact any law which diminishes or ignores the role of English as the common language of this State; and

(2) Will take all steps necessary to ensure that English is preserved and enhanced as the common language of this State.

(b) Encourages other state officials to take appropriate steps to ensure that English is preserved and enhanced as the common language of this State.

(c) Recognizes:

(c) Recognizes:
(I) The importance of English as the unifying language of the United States and the importance of speaking English fluently to succeed in American society;

society. (2) That a command of English is a critical component of the success and productivity of the children in this State and should be encouraged at all ages; and

(3) That a skilled labor force is crucial to this State's competitiveness in a global economy and the ability to speak one or more languages in addition to English is a significant skill.

(d) Supports educational programs designed to teach English as well as other languages.

(e) Encourages the residents of this State:

(1) To master English as well as other languages; and
(2) To take advantage of all educational opportunities to realize their potential in the mastery of English as well as other languages.

2. English is hereby designated as the official language of the State of Nevada.

¶ 3. Except as otherwise provided in subsection ¶ 4:

1 (a) *All official proceedings of this State must be conducted in the English
2 language.*

3 (b) *All official records of this State must be prepared, stored and made
4 available in the English language.*

5 (c) ~~*All official publications of this State must be printed in the English
6 language.*~~

7 ~~(d) 4. The provisions of subsection 2, 3 do not apply to:~~

8 (a) *State employees when conducting official state business orally.*

9 (b) *Classes that teach students a language other than English.*

13 interfere with the functions and requirements of the judicial system of this State.*

23 civilly or criminally, for an act or omission committed to carry out the provisions
