## SENATE BILL NO. 331—SENATOR COFFIN (BY REQUEST)

MARCH 19, 2007

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Referred to Committee on Finance

SUMMARY—Makes various changes concerning ~~the support of~~ research and other activities concerning solid waste. (BDR 40-318)

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AN ACT relating to natural resources; revising provisions concerning the use of certain money in the Solid Waste Management Account; requiring the Division of Environmental Protection of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources to ~~make grants to~~ encourage the Nevada System of Higher Education ~~for the support of~~ to research and ~~other activities relating to~~ develop methods for the reduction, reclamation and conversion of solid waste; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Under existing law, the proceeds from: (1) civil penalties for violations of certain laws concerning the management and disposal of solid waste; (2) damages recovered from persons or municipalities that violate those laws; and (3) the \$1 recycling fee that is collected on each new tire sold are deposited in the Solid Waste Management Account. (NRS 444.596, 444.598, 444A.090) The money in the Account is then allocated among the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and the various solid waste management authorities to be used for solid waste management and public education. (NRS 444.616) Under existing law, the Department is required to transfer a portion of the money it receives to the Division of Environmental Protection **of the Department** to use for public education ~~for~~ concerning the **State's plan for solid waste management**. **Section 1** of this bill authorizes the Division to use this money to **also** support other activities that encourage the reduction of solid waste.

Under existing law, the Division is required to establish, sponsor, assist or otherwise conduct various programs and other activities that encourage the reduction of waste and litter. (NRS 444A.110) The Division conducts some of those activities on its own and others in conjunction with local governments, educational institutions and other state agencies. **Section 2** of this bill expands the number of those activities to include ~~making grants to~~ encouraging the Nevada System of Higher Education ~~for the support of~~ to research ~~relating to~~ and **develop methods for** the reduction, reclamation and conversion of solid waste ~~for~~, including **encouraging the Nevada System of Higher Education to seek money from public and private sources for that purpose**.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 444.616 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2       444.616 1. The State Controller shall allocate and remit, on a quarterly  
3 basis, the money in the Solid Waste Management Account as follows:

4           (a) To the Department of Taxation, 0.5 percent.

5           (b) To the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, 44.5  
6 percent.

7           (c) To the district board of health of the health district which has the largest  
8 population in this State, 30 percent.

9           (d) To the district board of health of the health district which has the second  
10 largest population in this State, 25 percent.

11         → If more than two health districts are created within this State, the State  
12 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources shall transfer to the district  
13 boards of health of those additional districts an amount determined by the  
14 Department to be necessary to carry out the health district's duties pursuant to NRS  
15 444.440 to 444.620, inclusive. If less than two health districts are created within  
16 this State, the amount otherwise allocated to a health district must be allocated to  
17 the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.

18       2. The money allocated pursuant to subsection 1 to the State Department of  
19 Conservation and Natural Resources and the district boards of health must be used  
20 for solid waste management in accordance with NRS 444.440 to 444.620, inclusive.

21       3. The State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources shall transfer  
22 to the Division of Environmental Protection of that Department a portion of the  
23 money it receives pursuant to this section it deems necessary for use in educating  
24 the public concerning the objectives and functioning of the State's plan for solid  
25 waste management ~~and the purposes set forth in NRS 444A.110.~~

26       **Sec. 2.** NRS 444A.110 is hereby amended to read as follows:

27       444A.110 1. The Division shall develop a program of public education to  
28 provide information, increase public awareness of the individual responsibility of  
29 properly disposing of solid waste and encouraging public participation in recycling,  
30 reuse and waste reduction. The program must be designed in accordance with the  
31 plans to provide for a solid waste management system approved pursuant to NRS  
32 444.510 to communicate the importance of conserving natural resources, in  
33 addition to the importance of protecting public health and the environment. The  
34 program must include promotion of the private and public efforts to accomplish  
35 conservation, recovery and reuse.

36       2. The Division shall encourage the reduction of waste and litter by:

37           (a) Providing, upon request, advice to persons regarding techniques to reduce  
38 waste and general information on recycling.

39           (b) Establishing a computer database to process related information.

40           (c) Establishing a toll-free telephone line to assist in the dissemination of  
41 information.

42           (d) Sponsoring or cosponsoring technical workshops and seminars on waste  
43 reduction.

44           (e) Assisting local programs for the research and development of plans to  
45 reduce waste.

46           (f) Coordinating the dissemination of publications on waste reduction,  
47 regardless of the source of those publications.

1       (g) Assisting in the development and promotion of programs of continuing  
2 education for educators and administrators to enable them to teach and encourage  
3 methods of waste reduction.

4       (h) Developing an emblem to signify and advertise the efforts in Nevada to  
5 encourage recycling.

6       (i) Recommending to educational institutions courses and curricula relating to  
7 recycling and the reduction of waste.

8       (j) Assisting state agencies, upon request, to develop and carry out programs  
9 for recycling within state buildings.

10      (k) ~~Making grants to Encouraging the Nevada System of Higher Education  
for the support of to research and development concerning to develop methods  
for the reduction, reclamation and conversion of solid waste~~, including,  
11      ~~without limitation, encouraging the Nevada System of Higher Education to seek  
money from public and private sources for that purpose.~~

12      3. The Division shall coordinate the technical assistance available from the  
13 various state agencies. The Administrator of the Division shall prepare and deliver  
14 biennial reports to the Governor regarding the progress of the program.

15      4. The Division may award grants to municipalities, educational institutions  
16 and nonprofit organizations for projects that enhance solid waste management  
17 systems and promote the efficient use of resources. The Division shall consult a  
18 solid waste management authority before awarding a grant for a project within the  
jurisdiction of that solid waste management authority.

19      5. The State Environmental Commission shall adopt regulations governing  
20 the administration of grants awarded pursuant to subsection 4.

21      6. As used in this section, unless the context otherwise requires, "Division"  
22 means the Division of Environmental Protection of the State Department of  
23 Conservation and Natural Resources.

24      **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
