AN ACT relating to wildlife; ~~[prohibiting]~~ **limiting the authority of** the Department of Wildlife ~~from exercising jurisdiction over animal husbandry relating to animals intended to produce]~~ over Australian red claw crayfish that is raised in captivity on private property for sale as food for human consumption; prohibiting a person from importing, possessing or propagating freshwater lobster without a permit from the State Board of Agriculture; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law provides the Department of Wildlife with the jurisdiction to administer the wildlife laws of this State. (NRS 501.331) This bill ~~[prohibits the Department from exercising its jurisdiction or administering the wildlife laws of this State if the exercise of such jurisdiction or the administration of such laws would prohibit or interfere with a person's use of established methods of animal husbandry relating to any animal intended to produce]~~ limits the authority of the Department over Australian red claw crayfish that is raised in captivity on private property for sale as food for human consumption.

Existing law makes it unlawful for a person to import, possess or propagate any alternative livestock in this State without a permit issued by the State Board of Agriculture. (NRS 576.129) This bill imposes a similar restriction upon the importation, possession or propagation of Australian red claw crayfish.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Delete existing sections 1 and 2 of this bill and replace with the following new
2 sections 1 through 12:

3 **Section 1.** Chapter 501 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a
4 new section to read as follows:

5 As used in this title, “freshwater lobster” means Australian red claw crayfish
6 (*Cherax quadricarinatus*) that is raised in captivity on private property for sale as
7 food for human consumption.

8 **Sec. 2. NRS 501.379 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

9 501.379 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section:

10 (a) It is unlawful for any person to sell or expose for sale, to barter, trade or
11 purchase or to attempt to sell, barter, trade or purchase any species of wildlife, or
12 parts thereof, except as otherwise provided in this title or in a regulation of the
13 Commission.

14 (b) The importation and sale of products made from the meat of game
15 mammals, game birds or game amphibians raised in captivity is not prohibited if
16 the importation is from a licensed commercial breeder or commercial processor.

17 2. The provisions of this section do not apply to freshwater lobster or to
18 alternative livestock and products made therefrom.

19 **Sec. 3. NRS 503.590 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

20 503.590 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person may
21 maintain a noncommercial collection of legally obtained live wildlife if:

22 (a) Such a collection is not maintained for public display nor as a part of or
23 adjunct to any commercial establishment; and

24 (b) The wildlife contained in such a collection is of a species which may be
25 possessed in accordance with regulations adopted by the Commission pursuant to
26 subsection 2 of NRS 504.295.

27 2. The Commission may adopt reasonable regulations establishing minimum
28 standards for the fencing or containment of any collection of wildlife.

29 3. The provisions of this section do not apply to freshwater lobster or to
30 alternative livestock and products made therefrom.

31 **Sec. 4. NRS 503.597 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

32 503.597 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, it is unlawful,
33 except by the written consent and approval of the Department, for any person at
34 anytime to receive, bring or have brought or shipped into this State, or remove from
35 one stream or body of water in this State to any other, or from one portion of the
36 State to any other, or to any other state, any aquatic life or wildlife, or any spawn,
37 eggs or young of any of them.

38 2. The Department shall require an applicant to conduct an investigation to
39 confirm that such an introduction or removal will not be detrimental to the wildlife
40 or the habitat of wildlife in this State. Written consent and approval of the
41 Department may be given only if the results of the investigation prove that the
42 introduction, removal or importation will not be detrimental to existing aquatic life
43 or wildlife, or any spawn, eggs or young of any of them.

44 3. The Commission may through appropriate regulation provide for the
45 inspection of such introduced or removed creatures and the inspection fees therefor.

46 4. The Commission may adopt regulations to prohibit the importation,
47 transportation or possession of any species of wildlife which the Commission
48 deems to be detrimental to the wildlife or the habitat of the wildlife in this State.

1 5. The provisions of this section do not apply to *freshwater lobster or to*
2 alternative livestock and products made therefrom.

3 **Sec. 5. NRS 504.245 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

4 504.245 1. Any species of wildlife, including *freshwater lobster and*
5 alternative livestock, that:

6 (a) Is released from confinement without the prior written authorization of the
7 Department; or

8 (b) Escapes from the possessor's control,

9 ↳ may be captured, seized or destroyed by the Department if the Department
10 determines that such actions are necessary to protect wildlife and the habitat of
11 wildlife in this State.

12 2. The owner or possessor of such wildlife:

13 (a) Shall report its escape immediately after receiving knowledge of the
14 escape; and

15 (b) Is liable for the costs incurred by the Department to capture, maintain and
16 dispose of the wildlife and for any damage caused by the wildlife.

17 3. The Department is not liable for any damage to wildlife, or caused by
18 wildlife, in carrying out the provisions of this section.

19 **Sec. 6. NRS 504.295 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

20 504.295 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section and NRS 503.590,
21 or unless otherwise specified by a regulation adopted by the Commission, no
22 person may:

23 (a) Possess any live wildlife unless he is licensed by the Department to do so.

24 (b) Capture live wildlife in this State to stock a commercial or noncommercial
25 wildlife facility.

26 (c) Possess or release from confinement any mammal for the purposes of
27 hunting.

28 2. The Commission shall adopt regulations for the possession of live wildlife.
29 The regulations must set forth the species of wildlife which may be possessed and
30 propagated, and provide for the inspection by the Department of any related
31 facilities.

32 3. In accordance with the regulations of the Commission, the Department may
33 issue commercial and noncommercial licenses for the possession of live wildlife
34 upon receipt of the applicable fee.

35 4. The provisions of this section do not apply to *freshwater lobster or to*
36 alternative livestock and products made therefrom.

37 **Sec. 7. Chapter 576 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
38 section to read as follows:**

39 *"Freshwater lobster" has the meaning ascribed to it in section 1 of this act.*

40 **Sec. 8. NRS 576.010 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

41 576.010 As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, the
42 words and terms defined in NRS 576.0115 to 576.0118, inclusive, *and section 7 of*
43 *this act* have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.

44 **Sec. 9. NRS 576.129 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

45 576.129 1. It is unlawful for any person to import, possess or propagate any
46 *freshwater lobster or* alternative livestock unless he first obtains from the State
47 Board of Agriculture a permit that authorizes him to do so.

48 2. The State Board of Agriculture shall adopt regulations for the importation,
49 possession and propagation of alternative livestock. The regulations must set forth
50 requirements for:

51 (a) Facilities used to confine alternative livestock, including minimum
52 requirements for fencing to prevent the escape of alternative livestock.

53 (b) The genetic testing of alternative livestock.

1 (c) Keeping and maintaining records related to the importation, transfer,
2 possession and propagation of alternative livestock.

3 (d) Identifying and marking alternative livestock.

4 (e) Marketing alternative livestock.

5 (f) The filing of any bonds which may be required by the State Board of
6 Agriculture.

7 3. In adopting the regulations required by subsection 2, the State Board of
8 Agriculture shall consult with the Department of Wildlife and the Board of Wildlife
9 Commissioners concerning the provisions that are necessary to protect wildlife in
10 this state and in the areas designated as areas of special concern by the Board of
11 Wildlife Commissioners pursuant to NRS 501.181.

12 4. The State Board of Agriculture shall adopt regulations for the
13 importation, possession and propagation of freshwater lobster. The regulations
14 must set forth requirements for:

15 (a) Facilities used to confine freshwater lobster, including the minimum
16 requirements for any tank or pond for the freshwater lobster.

17 (b) Keeping and maintaining records related to the importation, transfer,
18 possession and propagation of freshwater lobster.

19 (c) Marketing freshwater lobster.

20 (d) The filing of any bonds which may be required by the State Board of
21 Agriculture.

22 5. The State Board of Agriculture shall establish by regulation a schedule of
23 fees required to be paid for a permit issued pursuant to this section. The fees
24 established must not exceed the approximate cost to the Board of carrying out the
25 provisions of this section.

26 **Sec. 10. NRS 576.131 is hereby amended to read as follows:**

27 576.131 1. An owner of freshwater lobster or alternative livestock may
28 request assistance from the State Department of Agriculture, the Department of
29 Wildlife and local law enforcement agencies to recapture any freshwater lobster or
30 alternative livestock that has escaped from confinement.

31 2. Any freshwater lobster or alternative livestock that is recaptured may be
32 impounded at a suitable facility until sufficient repairs or improvements are made to
33 the owner's facility to ensure that the escape of the freshwater lobster or alternative
34 livestock does not recur.

35 3. The owner of the freshwater lobster or alternative livestock is liable for:

36 (a) The costs incurred by the State Department of Agriculture, the Department
37 of Wildlife and any local law enforcement agency to recapture the freshwater
38 lobster or alternative livestock;

39 (b) The costs of impounding the freshwater lobster or alternative livestock;
40 and

41 (c) Any damages caused by the freshwater lobster or alternative livestock
42 during the escape.

43 **Sec. 11. 1. Any commercial or noncommercial license for the**
44 **possession of freshwater lobster issued by the Department of Wildlife remains**
45 **valid until the earlier of:**

46 (a) The date the State Board of Agriculture issues to the holder of the
47 license a permit for the importation, possession or propagation of freshwater
48 lobster pursuant to NRS 576.129, as amended by section 9 of this act; or

49 (b) June 1, 2008.

50 2. As used in this section, "freshwater lobster" means Australian red
51 claw crayfish (*Cherax quadricarinatus*) that is raised in captivity on private
52 property for sale as food for human consumption.

1 *Sec. 12.* This act becomes effective:

- 2 1. Upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting regulations by
3 the State Board of Agriculture pursuant to section 9 of this act; and
4 2. On January 1, 2008, for all other purposes.
