SUMMARY— Requiring the Secretary of State ~~to report certain information~~ and
the county clerks to provide certain reports concerning
elections to the Legislature. (BDR 24-248)

AN ACT relating to elections; requiring each county clerk to collect certain information regarding elections and to submit that information to the Secretary of State; requiring the Secretary of State to compile the information collected from the county clerks into a report to be submitted to the Legislature; **requiring the Secretary of State and the county clerks of each county to study the feasibility of changing the deadline for registering to vote in an election;** and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 **This Chapter 293 of NRS governs elections. Section 1 of this** bill requires the
2 Secretary of State to compile and submit to the Legislature a report concerning each election.
3 Each county clerk is required to collect information on each election regarding uncounted
4 ballots, malfunctions of mechanical voting machines, unopened polling places, challenges to
5 voter eligibility, complaints regarding ballots cast by mail, election audits and provisional
6 ballots. Each county clerk must submit the collected information to the Secretary of State
7 within 60 days after each election. The Secretary of State must compile the information
8 submitted by the county clerks and collected by the Secretary of State from political parties
9 and through the use of his website into a report to be submitted to each regular session of the
10 Legislature.

11 **Existing law provides that the period for registering to vote at an election ends at**
12 **9 p.m. on the third Tuesday preceding an election. For the period beginning on the fifth**
13 **Sunday preceding an election and ending on the third Tuesday preceding an election, an**
14 **elector may register to vote only by appearing in person at the office of the county clerk.**
15 **(NRS 293.560) Section 2 of this bill requires the Secretary of State and the county clerks**
16 **for each county jointly to study the feasibility of changing the deadline for registering to**
17 **vote to any date closer to the date of the election up to and including election day.**

19 **Section 2 also requires the Secretary of State and the county clerks to submit a report**
concerning the results of the study to the 75th Session of the Nevada Legislature.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 293 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new
2 section to read as follows:

3 **1. Each county clerk shall collect the following information regarding each**
4 **primary and general election, on a form provided by the Secretary of State and**
5 **made available at each polling place in the county, each polling place for early**
6 **voting in the county, the office of the county clerk and any other location deemed**
7 **appropriate by the Secretary of State:**

8 **(a) The number of ballots that have been discarded or for any reason not**
9 **included in the final canvass of votes, along with an explanation for the**
10 **exclusion of each such ballot from the final canvass of votes.**

11 **(b) A report on each malfunction of any mechanical voting system,**
12 **including, without limitation:**

13 **(1) Any known reason for the malfunction;**

14 **(2) The length of time during which the mechanical voting system could**
15 **not be used;**

16 **(3) Any remedy for the malfunction which was used at the time of the**
17 **malfunction; and**

18 **(4) Any effect the malfunction had on the election process.**

19 **(c) A list of each polling place not open during the time prescribed pursuant**
20 **to NRS 293.273 and an account explaining why each such polling place was not**
21 **open during the time prescribed pursuant to NRS 293.273.**

22 **(d) A description of each challenge made to the eligibility of a voter pursuant**
23 **to NRS 293.303 and the result of each such challenge.**

24 **(e) A description of each complaint regarding a ballot cast by mail filed with**
25 **the county clerk and the resolution, if any, of the complaint.**

26 **(f) The results of any audit of election procedures and practices conducted**
27 **pursuant to regulations adopted by the Secretary of State pursuant to this**
28 **chapter.**

29 **(g) The number of provisional ballots cast and the reason for the casting of**
30 **each provisional ballot.**

31 **2. Each county clerk shall submit to the Secretary of State, on a form**
32 **provided by the Secretary of State, the information collected pursuant to**
33 **subsection 1 not more than 60 days after each primary and general election.**

34 **3. The Secretary of State may contact any political party and request**
35 **information to assist in the investigation of any allegation of voter intimidation.**

36 **4. The Secretary of State shall establish and maintain an Internet website**
37 **pursuant to which he shall solicit and collect voter comments regarding election**
38 **processes.**

39 **5. The Secretary of State shall compile the information and comments**
40 **collected pursuant to this section into a report that he shall submit to the Director**
41 **of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmission to the Legislature not later**
42 **than 30 days before the start of each regular session of the Legislature.**

43 **6. The Secretary of State may make the report required pursuant to**
44 **subsection 5 available on an Internet website established and maintained by the**
45 **Secretary of State.**

1 **Sec. 2. 1. The Secretary of State and the county clerk of each county**
2 **jointly shall study the feasibility of changing the deadline for registration of**
3 **voters to allow qualified electors to register to vote in an election on any date**
4 **closer to the election up to and including the date of the election.**

5 **2. The study conducted pursuant to subsection 1 must include, without**
6 **limitation, an analysis of:**

7 **(a) The potential for logistical and technical problems in conducting an**
8 **election if the deadline for the registration of voters is changed;**

9 **(b) Any fiscal impact that would be likely to result from changing the**
10 **deadline for the registration of voters;**

11 **(c) The occurrence of voter fraud that would be likely to result from**
12 **changing the deadline for the registration of voters;**

13 **(d) The impact on voter turnout that would be likely to result from**
14 **changing the deadline for the registration of voters; and**

15 **(e) A review of the methods by which other states have provided for the**
16 **registration of voters on the date of the election.**

17 **3. On or before February 1, 2009, the Secretary of State and the county**
18 **clerks of each county jointly shall submit a written report of the results of the**
19 **study conducted pursuant to subsection 1 to the Director of the Legislative**
20 **Counsel Bureau for transmission to the 75th Session of the Nevada**
21 **Legislature.**

22 **Sec. 3. 1. This section and section 2 of this act become effective on**
23 **July 1, 2007.**

24 **2. Section 1 of this act becomes effective on October 1, 2007.**
