

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 118—ASSEMBLYMAN CARPENTER

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions governing associations of self-insured employers. (BDR 53-695)

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AN ACT relating to associations of self-insured employers; revising the type of financial statement that proposed members of an association must provide with an application for certification; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1      **Section 1** of this bill revises the requirements for items that must accompany an  
2      application for certification as an association of self-insured employers by requiring  
3      a compiled financial statement, rather than a reviewed financial statement, for each  
4      proposed member. (NRS 616B.350)

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1      **Section 1.** NRS 616B.350 is hereby amended to read as  
2      follows:  
3      616B.350 1. A group of five or more employers may not act  
4      as an association of self-insured public employers unless the group:  
5      (a) Is composed of employers engaged in the same or similar  
6      classifications of employment; and  
7      (b) Has been issued a certificate to act as such an association by  
8      the Commissioner.  
9      2. A group of five or more employers may not act as an  
10     association of self-insured private employers unless each member of  
11     the group:



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1       (a) Is a member or associate member of a bona fide trade  
2 association, as determined by the Commissioner, which:

3           (1) Is incorporated in this State; and

4           (2) Has been in existence for at least 5 years; and

5       (b) Has been issued a certificate to act as such an association by  
6 the Commissioner.

7       3. An association of public or private employers that wishes to  
8 be issued a certificate must file with the Commissioner an  
9 application for certification.

10      4. The application must include:

11           (a) The name of the association.

12           (b) The address of:

13              (1) The principal office of the association.

14              (2) The location where the books and records of the  
15 association will be maintained.

16              (c) The date the association was organized.

17              (d) The name and address of each member of the association.

18              (e) The names of the initial members of the board of trustees and  
19 the name of the initial association's administrator.

20              (f) Such other information as the Commissioner may require.

21      5. The application must be accompanied by:

22           (a) A nonrefundable filing fee of \$1,000.

23           (b) Proof of compliance with NRS 616B.353.

24           (c) Proof that the association or its third-party administrator is  
25 licensed or otherwise authorized to conduct business in this State  
26 pursuant to title 57 of NRS.

27           (d) A copy of the agreements entered into with the association's  
28 administrator and a third-party administrator.

29           (e) A copy of the bylaws of the association.

30           (f) A copy of an agreement jointly and severally binding the  
31 association and each member of the association to secure the  
32 payment of all compensation due pursuant to chapters 616A to 617,  
33 inclusive, of NRS.

34           (g) A pro forma financial statement prepared by an independent  
35 certified public accountant in accordance with generally accepted  
36 accounting principles that shows the financial ability of the  
37 association to pay all compensation due pursuant to chapters 616A  
38 to 617, inclusive, of NRS.

39           (h) A ~~reviewed~~ **compiled** financial statement prepared by an  
40 independent certified public accountant for each proposed member  
41 of the association or evidence of the ability of the association or its  
42 proposed members to provide a solvency bond pursuant to  
43 subsection 3 of NRS 616B.353.

44           (i) Proof that each member of the association will make the  
45 initial payment to the association required pursuant to NRS



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1    616B.416 on a date specified by the Commissioner. The payment  
2    shall be deemed to be a part of the assessment required to be paid by  
3    each member for the first year of self-insurance if certification is  
4    issued to the association.

5    6. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 239.0115, any  
6    financial information relating to a member of an association  
7    received by the Commissioner pursuant to the provisions of this  
8    section is confidential and must not be disclosed.

9    7. For the purposes of this section, “associate member of a  
10   bona fide trade association” means a supplier whose business, as  
11   determined by the Commissioner:

12      (a) Is limited to a specific industry; and

13      (b) Primarily involves providing a product or service that is  
14   directly used or consumed by substantially all of the members of the  
15   trade association or bears a direct relationship to the business of the  
16   members of the association.
