

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 119—ASSEMBLYWOMAN LESLIE

**SUMMARY**—Requires the comprehensive regional plan in certain counties to include provisions concerning the identification and sustainability of certain supplies of water. (BDR 22-750)

AN ACT relating to planning; requiring the comprehensive regional plan in certain counties to include provisions concerning the identification and sustainability of certain supplies of water; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Existing law requires the regional planning commission of a county whose population is 100,000 or more but less than 400,000 (currently Washoe County) to develop a comprehensive regional plan for the physical development and orderly growth of the region. (NRS 278.0272) The comprehensive regional plan must include goals, policies, maps and other documents relating to population, conservation, limitation of premature expansion, land use, transportation, public facilities and services, annexation, intergovernmental coordination and certain utility projects. (NRS 278.0274) This bill requires the comprehensive regional plan to include several provisions concerning the availability of water for growth and development, including a statement setting forth the total population of the county that may be supported by the identified and sustainable supply of water in the county as determined by the water planning commission of the county.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1      **Section 1.** NRS 278.026 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2            278.026 As used in NRS 278.026 to 278.029, inclusive, unless  
3        the context otherwise requires:

1       1. “Affected entity” means a public utility, franchise holder,  
2 local or regional agency, or any other entity having responsibility  
3 for planning or providing public facilities relating to transportation,  
4 solid waste, energy generation and transmission, conventions and  
5 the promotion of tourism, air quality or public education. The term  
6 does not include:

- 7           (a) A state agency; or  
8           (b) A public utility which is subject to regulation by the Public  
9 Utilities Commission of Nevada.

10      2. “Facilities plan” means a plan for the development of public  
11 facilities which will have a regional impact or which will aid in  
12 accomplishing regional goals relating to transportation, solid waste,  
13 energy generation and transmission, conventions and the promotion  
14 of tourism, air quality or public education. The term does not  
15 include a plan for the development of a specific site or regulations  
16 adopted by an affected entity to implement the comprehensive  
17 regional plan.

18      3. “Governing board” means the governing board for regional  
19 planning created pursuant to NRS 278.0264.

20      4. “Joint planning area” means an area that is the subject of  
21 common study and planning by the governing body of a county and  
22 one or more cities.

23      5. “Project of regional significance,” with respect to a project  
24 proposed by any person other than a public utility, means a project  
25 which:

26           (a) Has been identified in the guidelines of the regional planning  
27 commission as a project which will result in the loss or significant  
28 degradation of a designated historic, archeological, cultural or  
29 scenic resource;

30           (b) Has been identified in the guidelines of the regional planning  
31 commission as a project which will result in the creation of  
32 significant new geothermal or mining operations;

33           (c) Has been identified in the guidelines of the regional planning  
34 commission as a project which will have a significant effect on the  
35 natural resources, public services, public facilities, including,  
36 without limitation, schools, or the adopted regional form of the  
37 region; or

38           (d) Will require a change in zoning, a special use permit, an  
39 amendment to a master plan, a tentative map or other approval for  
40 the use of land which, if approved, will have an effect on the region  
41 of increasing:

- 42                  (1) Employment by not less than 938 employees;  
43                  (2) Housing by not less than 625 units;  
44                  (3) Hotel accommodations by not less than 625 rooms;  
45                  (4) Sewage by not less than 187,500 gallons per day;

1                         (5) Water usage by not less than 625 acre feet per year; or  
2                         (6) Traffic by not less than an average of 6,250 trips daily.  
3      → The term does not include any project for which a request for an  
4      amendment to a master plan, a change in zoning, a tentative map or  
5      a special use permit has been approved by the local planning  
6      commission before June 17, 1989.

7                         6. "Project of regional significance," with respect to a project  
8      proposed by a utility, includes:

- 9                         (a) An electric substation;  
10                         (b) A transmission line that carries 60 kilovolts or more;  
11                         (c) A facility that generates electricity greater than 5 megawatts;  
12                         (d) Natural gas storage and peak shaving facilities; and  
13                         (e) Gas regulator stations and mains that operate over 100  
14      pounds per square inch.

15                         7. "Sphere of influence" means , *except as otherwise provided*  
16      *in NRS 278.0274*, an area into which a city plans to expand as  
17      designated in the comprehensive regional plan within the time  
18      designated in the comprehensive regional plan.

19      **Sec. 2.** NRS 278.0274 is hereby amended to read as follows:

20      278.0274 The comprehensive regional plan must include goals,  
21      policies, maps and other documents relating to:

22                         1. Population, including a projection of population growth in  
23      the region and the resources that will be necessary to support that  
24      population. *This portion of the plan must set forth the total*  
25      *population of the county that may be supported by the identified*  
26      *and sustainable supply of water in the county as determined by the*  
27      *water planning commission of the county.*

28                         2. Conservation, including policies relating to the use and  
29      protection of air, land, water and other natural resources, ambient air  
30      quality, natural recharge areas, floodplains and wetlands, and a map  
31      showing the areas that are best suited for development based on  
32      those policies.

33                         3. The limitation of the premature expansion of development  
34      into undeveloped areas, preservation of neighborhoods and  
35      revitalization of urban areas, including, without limitation, policies  
36      that relate to the interspersion of new housing and businesses in  
37      established neighborhoods and set forth principles by which growth  
38      will be directed to older urban areas.

39                         4. Land use and transportation, including the classification of  
40      future land uses by density or intensity of development based upon  
41      the projected necessity and availability of public facilities,  
42      including, without limitation, schools, and services and natural  
43      resources, and the compatibility of development in one area with  
44      that of other areas in the region. This portion of the plan must:

45                         (a) Address, if applicable:

1                   (1) Mixed-use development, transit-oriented development,  
2 master-planned communities and gaming enterprise districts; and  
3                   (2) The coordination and compatibility of land uses with  
4 each military installation in the region, taking into account the  
5 location, purpose and stated mission of the military installation;

6                   (b) Allow for a variety of uses;

7                   (c) ***Estimate the amount of water required for those future  
8 uses;***

9                   (d) Describe the transportation facilities that will be necessary to  
10 satisfy the requirements created by those future uses; ***and***

11                   ***(d) (e)*** Be based upon the policies and map relating to  
12 conservation that are developed pursuant to subsection 2, surveys,  
13 studies and data relating to the area, the amount of land required to  
14 accommodate planned growth, the population of the area projected  
15 pursuant to subsection 1, and the characteristics of undeveloped land  
16 in the area ***H***;

17                   ***(f) Set forth policies that require, as a condition of the  
18 approval of any land use, proof of the availability of water as  
19 determined by the water planning commission of the county in  
20 accordance with subsection 1;***

21                   ***(g) Include the estimated area of potential development of the  
22 region that is supported by the identified and sustainable supply of  
23 water determined pursuant to subsection 1;***

24                   ***(h) Include the amount of water required to support all  
25 development that is approved but is not yet built; and***

26                   ***(i) Set forth policies and criteria, including, without limitation,  
27 any required amendment to a master plan of a local government,  
28 that may be used to terminate any approval of land use for which  
29 water is not committed.***

30       5. Public facilities and services, including provisions relating to  
31 sanitary sewer facilities, solid waste, flood control, potable water  
32 and groundwater aquifer recharge which are correlated with  
33 principles and guidelines for future land uses, and which specify  
34 ways to satisfy the requirements created by those future uses. This  
35 portion of the plan must:

36                   (a) Describe the problems and needs of the area relating to  
37 public facilities and services and the general facilities that will be  
38 required for their solution and satisfaction;

39                   (b) Identify the providers of public services within the region  
40 and the area within which each must serve, including service  
41 territories set by the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada for  
42 public utilities;

43                   (c) Establish the time within which those public facilities and  
44 services necessary to support the development relating to land use

1 and transportation must be made available to satisfy the  
2 requirements created by that development; and

3 (d) Contain a summary prepared by the regional planning  
4 commission regarding the plans for capital improvements that:

5 (1) Are required to be prepared by each local government in  
6 the region pursuant to NRS 278.0226; and

7 (2) May be prepared by the water planning commission of  
8 the county, the regional transportation commission and the county  
9 school district.

10 6. Annexation, including the identification of spheres of  
11 influence for each unit of local government, improvement district or  
12 other service district and specifying standards and policies for  
13 changing the boundaries of a sphere of influence and procedures for  
14 the review of development within each sphere of influence. As used  
15 in this subsection, "sphere of influence" means an area into which a  
16 political subdivision may expand in the foreseeable future ~~H and~~ **which is within the estimated area of potential development of the**  
17 **region specified in paragraph (g) of subsection 4.**

18 7. Intergovernmental coordination, including the establishment  
19 of guidelines for determining whether local master plans and  
20 facilities plans conform with the comprehensive regional plan.

21 8. Any utility project required to be reported pursuant to  
22 NRS 278.145.
