

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 214—ASSEMBLYWOMAN PARNELL

FEBRUARY 25, 2009

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Referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions regarding industrial injuries and occupational diseases. (BDR 53-25)

**FISCAL NOTE:** Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to public employees; including certain employees of the Department of Public Safety and certain park rangers and employees of the Division of State Parks of the State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources in the definition of “police officer” for various purposes relating to industrial injuries and occupational diseases; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel’s Digest:**

1 Existing law provides for certain police officers suffering from certain  
2 occupational diseases to receive disability benefits. (NRS 617.135, 617.455,  
3 617.457, 617.485, 617.487) Existing law defines “police officer” for the purpose of  
4 providing those disability benefits to include various law enforcement officers in  
5 this State. (NRS 617.135) Existing law also grants the powers of peace officers to  
6 certain park rangers and employees of the Division of State Parks of the State  
7 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources. (NRS 289.260) This bill  
8 expands the definition of “police officer” to make certain employees of the  
9 Department of Public Safety and certain park rangers and division employees of the  
10 State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources eligible for the disability  
11 benefits provided to police officers.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 617.135 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2       617.135 “Police officer” includes:



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- 1        1. A sheriff, deputy sheriff, officer of a metropolitan police  
2 department or city policeman;
- 3        2. A chief, inspector, supervisor, commercial officer or trooper  
4 of the Nevada Highway Patrol Division of the Department of Public  
5 Safety;
- 6        3. A chief, investigator or agent of the Investigation Division  
7 of the Department of Public Safety;
- 8        4. *A chief, supervisor, investigator or training officer of the*  
9 *Training Division of the Department of Public Safety;*
- 10      5. *A chief or investigator of an office of the Department of*  
11 *Public Safety that conducts internal investigations of employees of*  
12 *the Department of Public Safety or investigates other issues*  
13 *relating to the professional responsibility of those employees;*
- 14      6. *A chief or investigator of the Department of Public Safety*  
15 *whose duties include, without limitation:*
  - 16        (a) *The execution, administration or enforcement of the*  
17 *provisions of chapter 179A of NRS; and*
  - 18        (b) *The provision of technology support services to the*  
19 *Director and the divisions of the Department of Public Safety;*
- 20      7. An officer or investigator of the Section for the Control of  
21 Emissions From Vehicles and the Enforcement of Matters Related  
22 to the Use of Special Fuel of the Department of Motor Vehicles;
- 23      [5.] 8. An investigator of the Division of Compliance  
24 Enforcement of the Department of Motor Vehicles;
- 25      [6.] 9. A member of the police department of the Nevada  
26 System of Higher Education;
- 27      [7.] 10. A:
  - 28        (a) Uniformed employee of; or
  - 29        (b) Forensic specialist employed by,  
30        the Department of Corrections whose position requires regular  
31 and frequent contact with the offenders imprisoned and subjects the  
32 employee to recall in emergencies;
- 33      [8.] 11. A parole and probation officer of the Division of  
34 Parole and Probation of the Department of Public Safety;
- 35      [9.] 12. A forensic specialist or correctional officer employed  
36 by the Division of Mental Health and Developmental Services of the  
37 Department of Health and Human Services at facilities for mentally  
38 disordered offenders;
- 39      [10.] 13. The State Fire Marshal, his assistant and his deputies;

- 41      [11.] 14. A game warden of the Department of Wildlife who  
42 has the powers of a peace officer pursuant to NRS 289.280 [1]; and
- 43      15. *A ranger or employee of the Division of State Parks of the*  
44 *State Department of Conservation and Natural Resources who has*  
45 *the powers of a peace officer pursuant to NRS 289.260.*



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1       **Sec. 2.** 1. A person who, on July 1, 2009, is employed as a  
2 ranger or employee of the Division of State Parks of the State  
3 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources who has the  
4 powers of a peace officer pursuant to NRS 289.260 shall submit to a  
5 physical examination pursuant to NRS 617.454, 617.455 and  
6 617.457 and a blood test to screen for hepatitis C pursuant to NRS  
7 617.485 and 617.487 on or after July 1, 2009, but on or before  
8 September 30, 2009. Each physical examination and blood test must  
9 be paid for by the Department.

10      2. Notwithstanding the provisions of NRS 617.455, 617.457,  
11 617.485 and 617.487, if a person fails to submit to a physical  
12 examination or blood test required pursuant to subsection 1, the  
13 conclusive presumption relating to diseases of the lungs created by  
14 NRS 617.455, diseases of the heart created by NRS 617.457 and  
15 infections of hepatitis and hepatitis C pursuant to NRS 617.485 and  
16 617.487 shall be deemed, with regard to that person and for the  
17 purposes of those sections, to create a rebuttable presumption that  
18 the disease of the lungs or heart or infection of hepatitis or hepatitis  
19 C arose out of and in the course of the employment of the person as  
20 a ranger or employee specified in subsection 1.

21      **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2009.

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
