

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 266—ASSEMBLYMAN OCEGUERA

SUMMARY—Prohibits the sale of novelty lighters. (BDR 52-569)

AN ACT relating to lighters; prohibiting the sale of novelty lighters; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

- 1 This bill prohibits the sale or distribution as a promotion of novelty lighters.
- 2 This bill also provides a comprehensive definition of a “novelty lighter.” This bill
- 3 becomes effective on January 1, 2010.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** Chapter 597 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
- 2 thereto a new section to read as follows:
- 3 *1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, a person may*
- 4 *not sell at retail, offer for retail sale or distribute for retail sale or*
- 5 *promotion in this State a novelty lighter.*
- 6 *2. This section does not apply to the transportation of novelty*
- 7 *lighters through this State or the storage of novelty lighters in a*
- 8 *warehouse or distribution center in this State that is closed to the*
- 9 *public for purposes of retail sales.*
- 10 *3. The Attorney General or any district attorney, on the*
- 11 *request of the State Fire Marshal or on his own motion, may bring*
- 12 *an action in any court of competent jurisdiction in the name of the*
- 13 *State of Nevada to enjoin a violation of this section.*
- 14 *4. A person who violates this section is guilty of a*
- 15 *misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than*
- 16 *\$500. No sentence of incarceration may be imposed.*



- 1 5. *As used in this section, “novelty lighter”:*
2 (a) *Means a mechanical or electrical device which is typically*
3 *used for lighting cigarettes, cigars or pipes that may operate on*
4 *any fuel, including, without limitation, butane, isobutene or liquid*
5 *fuel, and which:*
6 (1) *Is designed to resemble a cartoon character, toy, gun,*
7 *watch, musical instrument, vehicle, animal, food, beverage or*
8 *other similar article; or*
9 (2) *Plays musical notes, has flashing lights or has other*
10 *similar entertaining features; and*
11 (b) *Does not include:*
12 (1) *A lighter manufactured before January 1, 1980;*
13 (2) *A lighter incapable of being fueled or lacking a device*
14 *necessary to produce combustion or a flame;*
15 (3) *Any mechanical or electrical device primarily used to*
16 *ignite fuel for fireplaces or for charcoal or gas grills; or*
17 (4) *Standard disposable lighters that are printed or*
18 *decorated, including, without limitation, through the use of a heat*
19 *shrinkable sleeve, with logos, labels, decals or artwork.*
20 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on January 1, 2010.
