SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the payment of compensation to certain victims of crime. (BDR 16-609)

AN ACT relating to victims of crime; removing the limitation on the amount of compensation that may be awarded to certain victims of crime, the dependents of those victims and certain members of the victim's household; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

- 1 Existing law establishes the Fund for the Compensation of Victims of Crime.
2 (NRS 217.260) The victims of certain crimes, the dependents of those victims and
3 certain members of the victim's household may apply to the State Board of
4 Examiners for compensation from the Fund for certain expenses and losses, not to
5 exceed \$50,000 per award. (NRS 217.100, 217.160, 217.200) This bill removes the
6 limit on the total amount of compensation that may be awarded.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** NRS 217.200 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 217.200 1. The compensation officer may order the payment
3 of compensation and the award of a Governor's certificate for
4 meritorious citizen's service to a victim for:
5 (a) Medical expenses, expenses for psychological counseling
6 and nonmedical remedial care and treatment rendered in accordance
7 with a religious method of healing **H** that are actually and
8 reasonably incurred as a result of the personal injury or death of the
9 victim;

1 (b) Loss of earnings or support that is reasonably incurred as a
2 result of the total or partial incapacity of the victim for not longer
3 than 52 weeks;

4 (c) Pecuniary loss to the dependents of a deceased victim;

5 (d) Funeral expenses that are actually and reasonably incurred as
6 a result of the death of the victim; and

7 (e) Another loss which results from the personal injury or death
8 of the victim and which the compensation officer determines to be
9 reasonable.

10 2. The compensation officer may order the payment of
11 compensation for a person who pays the funeral expenses of a
12 victim.

13 **[3. An award must not be made for more than \$50,000.]**

14 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
