

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 362—ASSEMBLYMAN CLABORN

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the use of certain fees charged for processing an application for a game tag. (BDR 45-709)

AN ACT relating to wildlife; revising provisions governing the use of the fee charged for processing an application for a game tag; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law provides that in addition to any fee charged and collected for a
2 game tag, a fee of \$3 must be charged for processing each application for a game
3 tag, the revenue from which must be deposited with the State Treasurer for credit to
4 the Wildlife Account in the State General Fund and used by the Department of
5 Wildlife for costs related to certain programs. (NRS 502.253) This bill provides
6 that such revenue must only be used for costs related to projects approved by the
7 Board of Wildlife Commissioners for the management and control of predatory
8 wildlife for the enhancement of mule deer populations.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 502.253 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 502.253 1. In addition to any fee charged and collected
3 pursuant to NRS 502.250, a fee of \$3 must be charged for
4 processing each application for a game tag, the revenue from which
5 must be accounted for separately, deposited with the State Treasurer
6 for credit to the Wildlife Account in the State General Fund and
7 used by the Department **only** for costs related to **E**.

15 the State Department of Agriculture to develop and carry out the
16 ~~programs} projects~~ described in subsection 1.

17 3. *Any project developed pursuant to this section must be*
18 *approved by the Commission.*

19 4. The money in the Wildlife Account remains in the Account
20 and does not revert to the State General Fund at the end of any fiscal
21 year.

22 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2009.

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
