SUMMARY—Limits disclosure of certain records of a health authority. (BDR 40-1044)

AN ACT relating to public health; limiting disclosure of certain records of a health authority; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 This bill prohibits the admission into evidence of certain documents and
2 opinions of a health authority and its employees except in certain proceedings. This
3 bill also prohibits a court from issuing a subpoena or order directing the disclosure
4 of those documents and opinions except in certain proceedings.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 439 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 ***1. Opinions formed, or statements, reports, records, information, findings and communications generated, obtained or received, by:***

6 ***(a) A health authority; or***

7 ***(b) An employee of:***

8 ***(1) The Health Division; or***

9 ***(2) A local board of health,***

10 ***↳ in connection with an investigation under, or the administration and enforcement of, the provisions of this chapter must not be admitted as evidence in any civil action other than an action for enforcement or a hearing involving public health.***

1 2. A court shall not issue a subpoena or order directing a
2 person described in subsection 1 to:

3 (a) Produce any statement, report, record, information, finding
4 or communication generated, obtained or received; or

5 (b) Disclose any opinion formed,

7 administration and enforcement of, the provisions of this chapter
8 for any purpose other than a civil action for enforcement or a
9 hearing involving public health, brought or called by the health
