

**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 516—COMMITTEE ON NATURAL
RESOURCES, AGRICULTURE, AND MINING**

MARCH 23, 2009

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing the use of money in the Wildlife Account. (BDR 45-708)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to wildlife; requiring any matching money received by the Department of Wildlife from any source to be used only for the management of wildlife; providing that the Board of Wildlife Commissioners must approve the use of that money and certain fees deposited in the Wildlife Account; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires that, with certain exceptions, all fees for the sale or
2 issuance of stamps, tags, permits and licenses that are required to be deposited in
3 the Wildlife Account be used only for the management of wildlife. (NRS 501.356)
4 This bill expands that use requirement to include any matching money received by
5 the Department of Wildlife from any source and provides that any use of such fees
and matching money must be approved by the Board of Wildlife Commissioners.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 501.356 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 501.356 1. Money received by the Department from:
3 (a) The sale of licenses;
4 (b) Fees pursuant to the provisions of NRS 488.075 and
5 488.1795;



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1 (c) Remittances from the State Treasurer pursuant to the
2 provisions of NRS 365.535;

3 (d) Appropriations made by the Legislature; and

4 (e) All other sources, except money derived from the forfeiture
5 of any property described in NRS 501.3857 or money deposited in
6 the Wildlife Heritage Trust Account pursuant to NRS 501.3575 or in
7 the Trout Management Account pursuant to NRS 502.327,
8 → must be deposited with the State Treasurer for credit to the
9 Wildlife Account in the State General Fund.

10 2. The interest and income earned on the money in the Wildlife
11 Account, after deducting any applicable charges, must be credited to
12 the Account.

13 3. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, the
14 Department may use money in the Wildlife Account only to carry
15 out the provisions of this title and chapter 488 of NRS and as
16 provided in NRS 365.535, and the money must not be diverted to
17 any other use.

18 4. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 502.250 and 504.155,
19 all fees for the sale or issuance of stamps, tags, permits and licenses
20 that are required to be deposited in the Wildlife Account pursuant to
21 the provisions of this title ***and any matching money received by the***
Department from any source must be accounted for separately and
23 may be used only for the management of wildlife ***[§ and only upon***
approval by the Commission.

25 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2009.
